Yesterday, we learned that the Republican legislative budget proposal for next year zeros out the \$1.5 million that supports the Iowa Flood Center. This would effectively eliminate the Iowa Flood Center.

This proposed cut will have a devastating impact on the Flood Center's ability to continue to provide flood mitigation and real-time flood support to communities, businesses, emergency managers, public works professionals and citizens that have come to depend on the Center's efforts.

These cuts will result in the end of the Iowa Flood Information System (IFIS) a powerful on-line tool which supports flood alerts and flood forecasts, more than 250 IFC real-time river and stream gauge sensors, more than 50 soil moisture/temperature sensors, flood inundation maps for 22 Iowa communities and rainfall products for the entire state.

It would also jeopardize Iowa's \$96 million dollar federal Iowa Watershed Approach HUD grant and the Center's ability to continue to implement projects in nine Iowa watersheds.

With so much at stake, we are reaching out to interested parties to encourage them to communicate with their state legislators about the value of the state's investment in flood prevention and resiliency work.

We urge you to contact your state senator and state representative **TODAY** to share your concerns. The cuts are contained in the Education Appropriations Bill that is moving through the legislature today and tomorrow. This bill is expected to move very quickly so it is imperative you reach out as soon as possible.





Science Advances Journal Publishes Paper by UI Environmental Researchers on China Winter Haze Events

December 20, 2016

Science Advances, a peer-reviewed multidisciplinary open-access scientific journal, has published a paper co-authored by two University of Iowa environmental researchers on how a self-amplifying chemical mechanism explains severe winter haze events in China.

The researchers are Meng Gao, a former postdoctoral research scholar and Gregory R. Carmichael, Karl Kammermeyer Professor of Chemical and Biochemical Engineering and co-director of the UI Center for Global and Regional Environmental Research (CGRER). Meng is currently a postdoctoral fellow at the John A. Paulson School of Engineering and Applied Sciences of Harvard University, working on energy, air quality and climate change in China and India.

While at Iowa, Meng's thesis looked at how well they could predict heavy winter haze pollution events in China using state-of-the-science models.

"By incorporating this new reaction pathway into our air quality model, our ability to predict winter time haze events has improved dramatically," Carmichael said. "Furthermore this more detailed understanding of how fine particles are formed will help guide more effective control measures." Carmichael explained that is was difficult to predict the very rapid and great amounts of sulfate particulate formation. Sulfates are formed by reactions in the atmosphere or on aerosol surfaces. Meng and he could only predict the correct amount of particulates if they included an additional reaction pathway to make sulfate on particles.

"We published this work with a reaction pathway that depended on the amounts of particles and the humidity in the air," Carmichael said. "But this was speculation and no mechanism was known. The paper published in *Science Advances* provides a mechanism for this reaction."

In response to your request for narrative describing the impact of the Governor's revised budget recommendations, the Board of Regents submit the following:

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS

The Governor's budget revision eliminates all Regent economic development funding for FY 2018 from the Skilled Worker and Job Creation Fund totaling \$8.7 million.

<u>University of Iowa</u> – Economic development programs receive nearly \$3.3M in funding from economic development appropriations and the Regents Innovation Fund. The programs and the negative impact resulting from the proposed funding elimination is as follows:

Research Park & Technology Innovation Center (TIC) - Under the proposed budget cut, \$78,515 would be cut from the SUI Research Park (home to the BioVentures Center) and \$37,119 would be cut from the TIC. This would eliminate staff support to seek new tenants, manage the 500-acre park and its innovation centers, and serve the park's 39 tenants (many of them spinouts founded on important university research) and their 1,800 employees. The proposed reduction to the TIC would terminate the university's incubator program, which has nurtured more than 200 business ventures since its start in 1984.

Center for Advanced Drug Development (CADD) - The allocation from the state economic development appropriations for the CADD for FY17 (\$93,645) is being used to support the salary and fringe benefits cost for half of two positions. The 0.5 FTE's consist of one Associate Chemist and one Manager of Laboratory Quality. The Associate Chemist performs qualitative and quantitative chemical analyses of pharmaceutical products, conducted following cGMP and ICH guidelines, internal SOPs, United States Pharmacopeia (USP) monographs, and client-supplied methods. The Manager of Laboratory Quality assures testing is conducted in full compliance with FDA cGMP regulations. These positions are critical to supporting CADD drug discovery and development efforts. Eliminating these positions or reducing the effort of these critical individuals is not an option. If the funding is eliminated in FY18 the shortfall will be temporarily offset by deferring maintenance and other development projects. This deferral is not sustainable.

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Entrepreneurship and Economic Growth - lowa JPEC provides advanced entrepreneurial education and business support services to all UI students, community members and youth. The strategic entrepreneurial initiative funding has been crucial to meet the increased demand for entrepreneurial education and support services to prepare students for career success and launch new business ventures. Additionally, it has allowed JPEG to provide high quality training and support to lowa companies to foster economic growth and create connectivity to students for internships and full-time jobs.

Specifically, if the \$2M in funding is reduced and/or eliminated, the following impact is expected:

- Reduce entrepreneurial educational opportunities and support programs for UI student and faculty entrepreneurs.
- Significantly reduce and/or eliminate the only statewide, community-based entrepreneurial training program – UI Venture School across Iowa.
- Diminish our ability to support the growth of lowa small-to-medium size enterprises through a significant reduction in the number of companies we can assist through our faculty/student strategic business consulting and student internship programs.
- Limit our ability to disseminate the Jacobson Institute's STEM INNOVATOR high school education program across lowa—includes both teacher training and in-school curriculum.
- Most likely close two outreach centers in Council Bluffs and Sioux City, thus reducing our ability to support entrepreneurs in western lowa.

Regents Innovation Fund - The proposed \$1,050,000 budget cut would eliminate current and promising business incubator initiatives, terminating five positions and shuttering all University of lowa offices and programs dedicated to launching startups. It will derail three new initiatives one month before their scheduled launch: MERGE, the Translational Research Incubator, and protostudios (intended to be a statewide resource for prototyping). Faculty—like those behind such successful spinouts as Voxello (maker of a device that allows communication-impaired patients to interact with hospital staff and caretakers), SantosHuman (which creates computer avatars used by the U.S. military to "field test" vehicles and gear in a virtual environment), and Immortagen (which develops personalized cancer treatments)—will be left to determine on their own how to start a business and find investors, which means a likely dramatic and unrecoverable drop in startup launches going forward.

lowa State University – ISU's economic development programs would lose \$3.474 million under the Governor's proposed budget (\$2.424 million direct ISU Economic Development appropriation and \$1.050 million share of Regents Innovation Fund). ISU leverages this state funding with an additional \$4.717 million of external funding (federal, local, and industry), nearly all of which would disappear with the loss of the state funds. Stated differently, the State of lowa gets the equivalent of \$8.191 million to invest in economic development for its \$2.424 million appropriation to ISU Economic Development and ISU's \$1.050 million share of the Regents Innovation Fund. Most importantly, last year ISU Economic Development used these funds to help more than 4,800 lowa companies create or retain more than 2,800 jobs and achieve approximately \$400 million of economic benefit (i.e., increased capital, expanded sales, lower or avoided costs). Furthermore, the funds also support the commercialization of university developed technology and creation of innovative startup companies that are critical to the future of the state economy.

A complete loss of state funding and associated elimination of programming would impact more than 50 FTE positions directly. Additionally, federal data shows that programs that have lost funding have taken approximately 2.5 years after funding is restored to get back to the median level of impact. ISU's economic development appropriation includes the Center for Industrial Research and Service (CIRAS), Small Business Development Centers (SBDC), and the ISU Research Park.

The **Small Business Development Center**, administered by ISU, consists of 15 regional centers serving all 99 counties in lowa. SBDC assists individuals interested in starting new companies and provides business services and counsel to existing companies across lowa to solve management problems, to improve operations, to seek financing, and to pursue new opportunities. In 2016 SBDC assisted more than 4,400 lowa small businesses and helped them generate more than \$70 million in capital infusion, increase sales by almost \$69 million, and create approximately 1,700 new jobs.

The ISU Research Park provides a resource-rich environment including close proximity and easy access to lowa State University for its tenant companies, which include start-ups and established companies that range from growing entrepreneurial ventures to global corporations. The Research Park offers high quality labs and office space, as well as numerous services and amenities that support the efforts of science- and technology-based organizations. The ISU Research Park currently has more than 70 tenants occupying more than 650,000 square of office and lab space. These tenants employ more than 1,700 individuals and account for more than \$100 million annually in economic activity. A recent initiative, the ISU Startup Factory, launched in summer of 2016 and has more than 20 startup companies. In addition, companies that started at the Park but have since relocated elsewhere in lowa employ an additional 2,500 employees.

The Center for Industrial Research and Service (CIRAS) has a staff of engineering and business specialists who work with business and industry to enhance their performance through service offerings in four general areas: technology, growth, productivity, and enterprise leadership. Additionally, CIRAS pulls expertise from across campus as needed to assist in the performance of these services. CIRAS receives \$1.37 million for the CIRAS Technology Assistance Program (TAP), which provides assistance to lowa companies in the areas of testing, engineering, emerging technologies, safety, and initiatives to help grow the number of skilled workers (e.g. annual Manufacturing Day, Governor's Year of Manufacturing initiative, etc.). Annually CIRAS serves over 380 different manufacturers and bioscience companies, with over 90% of these considered small. Companies have reported over \$265 million of financial impact and 1,145 jobs as a result of these programs.

Note: the **Technology Assistance Program** was previously known as IPRT Company Assistance; university reorganization eliminated IPRT, an umbrella organization that oversaw a group of research and applied science centers on campus; language in the lowa Skilled Worker and Job Creation program was changed last year to reflect this organizational change at ISU.

<u>University of Northern Iowa</u> – Five programs receive nearly \$2M in funding from the economic development appropriation and the Regents Innovation Fund. The programs and the negative impact resulting from the proposed funding elimination is as follows:

Center for Business Growth and Innovation (CBGI) - This group of program works with startups, small businesses and second stage companies across the state through Advance lowa, assists IEDA with IASourceLink (22,000 users) and Business Concierge (1,300 users), Dream Big Grow here (100 companies) and hosts a regional Small Business Development Center (SBDC). CBGI, Advance lowa and the SBDC will no longer exist without state funding.

Institute for Decision Making (IDM) — has assisted more than 750 communities across lowa with their economic future. The program plays a substantial role in regional development, regional entrepreneurship, workforce development, and assisting IEDA, IWD and Dept of Education with special research and projects and is lowa's primary resource for local economic development strategies. State funding serves as a match for a 5-year US Economic Development Administration University Center program for regional entrepreneurship that requires a full match - \$150,000 per year. IDM will lose staff and need to focus more on out-of-state projects to maintain some of its staff.

Metal Casting Center and Additive Manufacturing – works with small and medium companies across the state and is the best equipped and innovative 3D design and printing center for casting companies in the US. All branches of the military are using UNI's MCC. Just finishing renovation and expansion of Additive Manufacturing space at TechWorks through a Strategic Infrastructure Fund grant of \$2.7 million. Services to lowa's foundries and supply chain will be reduced and the number of student employees will also be substantially reduced.

Strategic Marketing Services - uses some Regents Innovation Fund money to match the cost of market research for small lowa companies and special projects for IEDA and lowa utility companies. Iowa companies most likely not be served without matching funds.

Tech Transfer – supports early stage faculty research with commercial potential – Regents Innovation Fund is the only source of funds. We will need to substantially reduce or eliminate tech transfer activities.

Summary of Impacts

- Elimination of up to 3 programs, mostly focused business assistance and startups
- Loss of at least 10-15 positions. Most of these positions are long-term professionals.
 Once they leave, we cannot replace their expertise and gear back up in in FY19. After giving layoff notices, expenses will continue into FY18 due to timing of layoff notices.
- Loss of approximately \$1.5 million in leveraged funds grants, federal funding, fees for service and contracts
- Reduction of student participation by 75%
- Reducing Iowa clients from 3,120 to less than 1,000 and UNI will not be able to have projects every Iowa county. Rural areas will be the most impacted.
- Reduction statewide in new business starts and student businesses starts

GENERAL UNIVERSITY APPROPRIATIONS

The Governor's FY 2018 budget revision further reduces the Regent higher education operating appropriations by approximately \$3M in addition to the FY 2017 mid-year reductions of \$20.75M. Information related to the general university budget reductions is similar to that provided in earlier responses to proposed budget reductions.

<u>University of Iowa</u> – A permanent reduction of this magnitude in the University of Iowa's appropriation will be difficult to manage given today's extremely competitive higher education market, coupled with the university's dedication to offering excellent academic programs to students from Iowa, the nation, and the world.

The SUI strategic plan for 2016 to 2021, if successfully implemented, will help the university achieve the results our students, alumni, and the citizens of lowa expect. Previous strategic plans were adopted with similar goals; however, the funding needed to fully implement them fell short.

The proposed permanent reduction in the university's appropriation will require the university to deploy a much stricter resource allocation prioritization process over the next year and beyond and may also include tuition increases in order to implement its strategic plan successfully.

In particular, the following programs and services will be reduced if state appropriations are reduced:

- Statewide services
- Academic programs
- · Student financial aid

<u>lowa State University</u> – The strategic plan recently adopted consists of four overarching goals which are at the core of ISU's land grant mission, they are: (1) improving the quality and accessibility of an ISU education, (2) promoting innovation by expanding the research enterprise, (3) improving the quality of life for all lowans through ISU's extension and outreach activities and services, and (4) creating a safe and welcoming campus environment.

These permanent state funding reductions significantly impede the progress being made to meet the goals established in the strategic plan. The proposed cuts are concerning with the record growth in enrollment resulting in already high student-to faculty ratios, and sponsored research are considered. The permanent cuts require systemic changes to be developed through the annual budget planning process and may include program eliminations, staff reductions, tuition increases, deferral of building repair projects, and revising student financial aid packages.

<u>University of Northern Iowa</u> – The cuts have a disproportionate impact on UNI because a large percentage of operating funding comes from state appropriations since 89% of UNI's student population are lowa residents and have much lower tuition rates than non-resident students.

UNI has already eliminated key administrative positions and further reductions may occur that will impact their ability to respond to students. The university has already realized an increasing student-to-faculty ratio and further reductions will likely result. A reduction of other staff lines throughout the institution will also occur. Budget reductions will also negatively impact student debt, deferred maintenance projects, and will greatly reduce funds dedicated for advancing UNI's enrollment management initiatives, including increasing non-resident enrollment, as well as strategic plan goals, elevating student success projects that maintain or increase retention, persistence, and graduation.

Without the lowa Flood Center, it is likely we would have to surrender the HUD grant which would impact lowa Homeland Security funding (\$2.1 million) and the city of Dubuque funding (\$33 million) in housing and infrastructure projects. Iowa Award — HUD Disaster Resilience Grant: Reducing Flooding and Advancing Water Quality

Iowa Grant Award: \$96,787,177



Program Description — The Iowa Watershed Approach (IWA)

Through the Iowa Watershed Approach, Iowans will work together to address factors that contribute to floods and nutrient flows. Iowans will enjoy improvements in quality of life and health resulting from upstream watershed investments tied to community resilience activities. This adaptive model, supported by U.S. Housing & Urban Development dollars, will leverage the principles of Iowa's innovative Nutrient Reduction Strategy to make our communities more resilient to flooding and help improve water quality.

The IWA will accomplish six specific goals:

1) reduce flood risk; 2) improve water quality; 3) increase resilience; 4) engage stakeholders through collaboration and outreach/education; 5) improve quality of life and health, especially for vulnerable populations; and 6) develop a program that is scalable and replicable throughout the Midwest and the United States.

Nine distinct watersheds across Iowa will serve as project sites for the IWA. These are: Bee Branch Creek in Dubuque, Upper Iowa River, Upper Wapsipinicon River, Middle Cedar River, Clear Creek, English River, North Raccoon River, West Nishnabotna River, and East Nishnabotna River. Each will leverage a watershed management authority, develop a hydrologic assessment and watershed plan, and implement projects to reduce the magnitude of downstream flooding and to improve water quality during and after flood events. These projects will range from construction of farm ponds, wetlands, and storm water detention basins; restoration of floodplains and oxbows; and implementation of perennial cover and buffer strips.

The IWA includes a community resiliency program to help communities prepare for, respond to, recover from, and adapt to floods. IWA activities will include assessing resilience in the targeted watersheds, engaging communities in discussions about their unique resilience needs, and helping communities formulate and begin to act on resilience action plans.

The IWA represents a vision for Iowa's future that voluntarily engages stakeholders throughout the watershed to achieve common goals, while moving toward a more resilient state. It is a replicable model for other communities to improve the landscape's natural resilience to floods and retaining vital nutrients important to feeding and fueling the world. Although the IWA targets watersheds impacted by floods from 2011–2013, the impacts will ripple downstream from Iowa to the Mississippi River to the Gulf of Mexico. This program is not only about Iowans helping Iowans, but also about demonstrating Iowans' commitment to agricultural stewardship, to the environment, to their neighbors, and to the future.



Program Stakeholders

The IWA program is a collaboration of numerous universities. non-profits, and agencies. municipalities. Partners include: Iowa Economic Development Authority, Iowa Homeland Security & Emergency Management, University of Iowa/Iowa Flood Center, Iowa State University, University of Northern Iowa, Iowa Department of Agriculture & Land Stewardship, Iowa Department of Natural Resources, National Resources Conservation Service, County Soil & Water Conservation Districts, The Nature Conservancy, Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation, Iowa Soybean Association, Iowa Corn Growers Association, Iowa Farm Bureau, Iowa Agricultural Water Alliance, local Resource Conservation & Development offices, Department of Transportation, Iowa Association of Counties, Silver Jackets Flood Risk Management Team, and many more.


The City of Dubuque is also a key partner in the IWA and will implement an urban watershed initiative in an area impacted by devastating floods. Dubuque's IWA program includes infrastructure projects and the Bee Branch Healthy Homes Resiliency Program to repair flood damaged homes and make them more resilient to floods. The cities of Coralville and Storm Lake will also receive significant resources for water infrastructure projects.

Background

From 2011–2013, Iowa suffered eight Presidential Disaster Declarations, encompassing 73 counties and more than 70 percent of the state. In July 2011, more than 200 homes in Dubuque's Bee Branch neighborhood sustained severe flood damage. In 2013, hundreds of Storm Lake homes flooded, causing dangerous untreated sewage to back up into homes and the nearby lake. In June 2013, two heavy rain events washed out roads across Benton County, reducing residents' access to emergency services and causing \$5 million in infrastructure damage.

Devastating as these events were, 2011–2013 do not represent lowa's worst flood years. Long-term data show that heavy precipitation and flooding events are increasing in frequency across the Midwest. Under these circumstances, a new paradigm for flood resilience is needed—one that decreases flood risk, improves water quality, and increases community resilience.

This approach is consistent with other statewide programs in Iowa. For example, the IWA will complement the Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy, as the hundreds of built projects will help to improve Iowa's water quality. These projects will also complement the Iowa Flood Mitigation Program by reducing downstream flooding. All projects will be voluntary, with landowners receiving 75 percent costshare assistance on constructed practices.

Yesterday, we learned that the Republican legislative budget proposal for next year zeros out the \$1.5 million that supports the lowa Flood Center. This would effectively eliminate the lowa Flood Center.

This proposed cut will have a devastating impact on the Flood Center's ability to continue to provide flood mitigation and real-time flood support to communities, businesses, emergency managers, public works professionals and citizens that have come to depend on the Center's efforts.

These cuts will result in the end of the <u>lowa Flood Information System</u> (IFIS) a powerful on-line tool which supports flood alerts and flood forecasts, more than 250 IFC real-time river and stream gauge sensors, more than 50 soil moisture/temperature sensors, flood inundation maps for 22 lowa communities and rainfall products for the entire state.

It would also jeopardize Iowa's \$96 million dollar federal Iowa Watershed Approach HUD grant and the Center's ability to continue to implement projects in nine Iowa watersheds.

With so much at stake, we are reaching out to interested parties to encourage them to communicate with their state legislators about the value of the state's investment in flood prevention and resiliency work.

We urge you to contact your state senator and state representative **TODAY** to share your concerns. The cuts are contained in the Education Appropriations Bill that is moving through the legislature today and tomorrow. This bill is expected to move very quickly so it is imperative you reach out as soon as possible.

Dear ECICOG Legislators:

It's my understanding there is a current proposal within the Education Appropriations Bill to eliminate \$1.5 Million in support for the lowa Flood Center for Fiscal Year 2018. I recognize that the State faces budget challenges, but this proposed reduction only portends the chance of greater costs to the State, its residents, and its localities in the future. No region knows better the benefits of the lowa Flood Center than our own, and we only need look back to September of last year to be reminded (in a big way). The lowa Flood Information System was quite literally a life-saver, and helped those in the Cedar watersheds from replicating the devastation of 2008.

This reduction also imperils the \$96 Million in HUD National Disaster Resilience Competition funding recently awarded to Iowa. Our best chance for avoiding disasters like 2008 in the future is through multi-jurisdictional and public/private partnership efforts—the kind that this funding is enabling, and which in its absence, have failed to occur to any measurable extent previously.

Our agency is working actively with the Middle Cedar Watershed Management Authority, the Clear Creek Watershed Coalition, English River Watershed Management Authority, and the Indian Creek Watershed Management Authority. Yesterday, we learned that the Republican legislative budget proposal for next year zeros out the \$1.5 million that supports the lowa Flood Center. This would effectively eliminate the lowa

Flood Center.

This proposed cut will have a devastating impact on the Flood Center's ability to continue to provide flood mitigation and real-time flood support to communities, businesses, emergency managers, public works professionals and citizens that have come to depend on the Center's efforts.

These cuts will result in the end of the <u>lowa Flood Information System</u> (IFIS) a powerful on-line tool which supports flood alerts and flood forecasts, more than 250 IFC real-time river and stream gauge sensors, more than 50 soil moisture/temperature sensors, flood inundation maps for 22 lowa communities and rainfall products for the entire state.

It would also jeopardize Iowa's \$96 million dollar federal Iowa Watershed Approach HUD grant and the Center's ability to continue to implement projects in nine Iowa watersheds.

Program Description — The Iowa Watershed Approach (IWA)

Through the Iowa Watershed Approach, Iowans will work together to address factors that contribute to floods and nutrient flows. Iowans will enjoy improvements in quality of life and health resulting from upstream watershed investments tied to community resilience activities. This adaptive model, supported by U.S. Housing & Urban Development dollars, will leverage the principles of Iowa's innovative Nutrient Reduction Strategy to make our communities more resilient to flooding and help improve water quality.

The IWA will accomplish six specific goals:

- 1) reduce flood risk; 2) improve water quality;
- 3) increase resilience; 4) engage stakeholders through collaboration and outreach/education; 5) improve quality of life and health, especially for vulnerable populations; and 6) develop a program that is scalable and replicable throughout the Midwest and the United States.

Nine distinct watersheds across lowa will serve as project sites for the IWA. These are: Bee Branch Creek in Dubuque, Upper Iowa River, Upper Wapsipinicon River, Middle Cedar River, Clear Creek, English River, North Raccoon River, West Nishnabotna River, and East Nishnabotna River. Each will leverage a watershed management authority, develop a hydrologic assessment and watershed plan, and implement projects to reduce the magnitude of downstream flooding and to improve water quality during and after flood events. These projects will range from construction of farm ponds, wetlands, and storm water detention basins; restoration of floodplains and oxbows; and implementation of perennial cover and buffer strips.

The IWA includes a community resiliency program to help communities prepare for, respond to, recover from, and adapt to floods. IWA activities will include assessing resilience in the targeted watersheds, engaging communities in discussions about their unique resilience needs, and helping communities formulate and begin to act on resilience action plans.

The IWA represents a vision for lowa's future that voluntarily engages stakeholders throughout the watershed to achieve common goals, while moving toward a more resilient state. It is a replicable model for other communities to improve the landscape's natural resilience to floods and retaining vital nutrients important to feeding and fueling the world. Although the IWA targets watersheds impacted by floods from 2011–2013, the impacts will ripple downstream from Iowa to the Mississippi River to the Gulf of Mexico. This program is not only about Iowans helping Iowans, but also about demonstrating Iowans' commitment to agricultural stewardship, to the environment, to their neighbors, and to the future.



Program Stakeholders

The IWA program is a collaboration of numerous non-profits. agencies. universities. and municipalities. Partners include: Iowa Economic Development Authority, Iowa Homeland Security & Emergency Management, University of Iowa/Iowa Flood Center, Iowa State University, University of Northern Iowa, Iowa Department of Agriculture & Land Stewardship, Iowa Department of Natural Resources, National Resources Conservation Service, County Soil & Water Conservation Districts, The Nature Conservancy, Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation, Iowa Soybean Association, Iowa Corn Growers Association, Iowa Farm Bureau, Iowa Agricultural Water Alliance, local Resource Conservation & Development offices, Department of Transportation, Iowa Association of Counties, Silver Jackets Flood Risk Management Team, and many more.

The City of Dubuque is also a key partner in the IWA and will implement an urban watershed initiative in an area impacted by devastating floods. Dubuque's IWA program includes infrastructure projects and the Bee Branch Healthy Homes Resiliency Program to repair flood damaged homes and make them more resilient to floods. The cities of Coralville and Storm Lake will also receive significant resources for water infrastructure projects.

Background

From 2011–2013, Iowa suffered eight Presidential Disaster Declarations, encompassing 73 counties and more than 70 percent of the state. In July 2011, more than 200 homes in Dubuque's Bee Branch neighborhood sustained severe flood damage. In 2013, hundreds of Storm Lake homes flooded, causing dangerous untreated sewage to back up into homes and the nearby lake. In June 2013, two heavy rain events washed out roads across Benton County, reducing residents' access to emergency services and causing \$5 million in infrastructure damage.

Devastating as these events were, 2011–2013 do not represent lowa's worst flood years. Long-term data show that heavy precipitation and flooding events are increasing in frequency across the Midwest. Under these circumstances, a new paradigm for flood resilience is needed—one that decreases flood risk, improves water quality, and increases community resilience.

This approach is consistent with other statewide programs in Iowa. For example, the IWA will complement the Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy, as the hundreds of built projects will help to improve Iowa's water quality. These projects will also complement the Iowa Flood Mitigation Program by reducing downstream flooding. All projects will be voluntary, with landowners receiving 75 percent costshare assistance on constructed practices.

Dear Governor Branstad:

On behalf of the Board of Regents, I am writing to request your consideration of lineitem vetos in HF 654, the Economic Development Appropriations Bill and SF 510, the Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations Bill.

Specifically, we are asking that you item veto the sections of HF 654, the Economic Development Appropriations Bill, that repeal the funding streams for the Iowa Energy Center and the Center for Global and Regional Environmental Research (CGRER) effective July 1, 2022. The repeal language can be found in sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38 and 41.

While we understand and accept the General Assembly's intent to move the lowa Energy Center to the Iowa Economic Development Authority, we do not believe it to be in the best interest of the state to have an artificial sunset of the Energy Center's activity contained in Code. Many of the activities of the Energy Center deal with long-term funding proposals and the repeal provision would unnecessarily interrupt many of these projects and proposals.

Similarly, CGRER has a 27 year history of providing expert research on critical environmental topics in Iowa and the Midwest. CGRER currently serves over 120 faculty from institutions across Iowa. CGRER is currently teaming with the Iowa Department of Education to provide curricular materials for the Next Generation Science Standards in Iowa on climate, weather and earth science. In addition to this this work, CGRER has leveraged its state funding to attract over \$20 million in external research grants that stimulate the economy and provide for the innovation and knowledge base of Iowa.

Finally, we would also request an item veto related to the Leopold Center at Iowa State University. Specifically, in SF 510, the Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations Bill, we ask that you veto portions of section 33 that would prohibit Iowa State University from continuing to operate the Leopold Center in the absence of state funding.

The Leopold Center has sponsored the work of Iowans concerned about their water and soil resources through more than 600 research projects---on topics spanning water quality, manure management, livestock grazing, cover crops, alternative conservation practices, biomass production, soil health and the seminal work in local food systems development in Iowa. Iowa's thriving local foods networks benefitted from Leopold Center grants leveraged with nearly \$1 million in funds from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and the Wallace Foundation.

We appreciate your consideration of these requests and please let us know if you have questions or need additional information.
