Dear Ms. Johnson and Attorney General Miller:

Attached is correspondence from Colin Smith, legal counsel for Governor Reynolds, in response to a records request from me.

The response states that the Reynolds Administration is not the legal custodian of the records, insofar as the request covers a time period in the Branstad Administration. In a follow-up conversation, Mr. Smith asserted that the Reynolds Administration would not have the legal authority to release the documents, even if they were in the possession of the Reynolds Administration, because they are not the custodian.

Mr. Smith said that the records have been transferred to the Department of Cultural Affairs.

I ask for your assistance in answering the following questions:

- 1. Is Governor Reynolds accurate in her understanding of the legal status of Governor Branstad's records and that her office has no responsibility to fulfill requests for such records?
- 2. For Attorney General Miller: In light of your May 1 opinion related to Lt. Governor Reynolds assuming the duties and title of governor, does Governor Reynolds' succession constitute a change in administration justifying the removal of Governor Branstad's public records from the governor's office?
- 3. What responsibility does the Department of Cultural Affairs have -- under state code, administrative law or court rulings -- to respond in a timely and thorough manner to records requests related to the Branstad Administration?
