FEC RELEASES FINAL FIGURES ON 1979-80 MAJOR POLITICAL PARTY ACTIVITY

WASHINGTON - The Federal Election Commission today released final figures on political party spending for the 1980 elections which show that Republican Party committees at the national, state and local levels spent almost five times as much money as their Democratic counterparts and nearly doubled their spending over 1977-78 totals.

FEC data also shows that there has been a significant reduction in the number of political party committees, particularly at the state and local level, from 1977-78. At that time, state and local party committees numbered 744; in 1979-80, their number dropped to 585. This could be due in part to revisions in the federal election law which were aimed at promoting grass roots activity by state and local party committees while, at the same time, reducing their reporting requirements.

During the 1979-80 election cycle, Democratic Party committees raised \$37.2 million on top of their \$.7 million cash-on-hand. They spent \$35 million. Of the total spent, \$1.7 million was contributed to candidates' campaigns and \$4.9 million was spent on behalf of candidates in the general election.

Republican Party committees - national, state and local - began with \$2.0 million. They raised an additional \$169.5 million and spent \$161.8 million. Of that total, \$4.5 million was contributed to candidates and \$12.4 million was spent on their behalf.

Under federal election law, both national and state committees of a political party may spend certain amounts of money on behalf of their candidates in the general election. The amount allowed for House races for 1980 was \$14,720. The amount of money per Senate candidate is determined by multiplying 2¢ times the voting age population of a state and increasing that figure for inflation. expenditures are in addition to contributions allowed for the general election.

Based on Federal Election Commission figures:

** Republican Party committees raised four-and-one-half times as much money as Democratic Party committees;

** Republican Party committees contributed three times as much money to their

candidates; and ** Republican Party committees outspent their Democratic rivals by more than two-to-one, (coordinated expenditures in the general election.)

These figures are taken from the FEC 1979-80 Report on Financial Activity -Final Report, which is a four-volume study on PAC's and major party campaign finance for 1979-80.
