Hi Kyle,

Thanks for the time over the phone yesterday. It was good to catch up.

As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. Thanks for the time over the phone yesterday. It was good to catch up.

As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In doing so he has several different goals; to get out of his bubble here at Facebook and in Northern California, to visit communities and meet people he wouldn't otherwise wouldn't and most importantly learn. Here is a story the NY Times did on his travels.

We try to develop themes for the areas and people he meets with. So far, we haven't really done anything around natural resources and people who work to manage public lands. Thanks for the time over the phone yesterday. It was good to catch up.

As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In doing so he has several different goals; to get out of his bubble here at Facebook and in Northern California, to visit communities and meet people he wouldn't otherwise wouldn't and most importantly learn. National News Release: Endangered Turtle Skin Grown in Lab, Can Help Understand Deadly Virus (not the final title)

- What: Scientists with the USGS National Wildlife Health Center successfully assembled and grew marine turtle skin in a lab the first time this has been accomplished for a non-mammal. Using the skin culture, scientists were able to replicate a turtle tumor virus, which provides the opportunity to more accurately study how this virus replicates and its dynamics. Such information can help to better understand the disease and how to prevent it.

## Local News Release: Groundwater Pumping, Precipitation can Affect Lake Levels in Twin Cities

They studied groundwater and lake water exchanges in White Bear, Big Marine, Elmo and Snail lakes during 2003 through 2013, a period of increasing urbanization and declining water levels for some lakes in the area. They found that lake water levels are sensitive to precipitation changes, and increases in groundwater withdrawals during dry periods exacerbate lake water-level declines.

### **Regional Technical Announcement: New Portable Test Kit Shows Promise for Rapidly Detecting Asian Carp**

On June 26, USGS scientist Terry Sohl was interviewed by David Sparks of the Ag Information Network of the West (Aginfo.net) for a future story anticipated to run on 94 radio stations across the western U.S. The story is in response to a "Billion Ton" scenario for biofuel production and research to better model future agricultural change described in a science snippet.

Jeff Schaeffer (Great Lakes Science Center, Ann Arbor, Michigan) was interviewed by Dan Taekema of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) about large emergences of Hexagenia mayflies that are occurring throughout the Canadian shoreline of the St. Clair-Detroit River ecosystem during the weekend of June 17-18, 2017. ### Title: New study: Declines revisited: Long-term recovery and spatial population dynamics of tailed frog larvae after wildfire

Scientists re-surveyed 8 streams 11–12 years after a wildfire to determine of fire-associated declines in abundance of larval Rocky Mountain tailed frogs (*Ascaphus montanus*) persisted or if populations had recovered. Rocky Mountain tailed frogs have several unusual life-history traits that could slow population recovery, including an extended larval period (4 yrs), delayed sexual maturity (6–8 yrs), and low fecundity (<50 eggs/yr). Results showed that negative effects of burn extent on larval abundance weakened >58% within 12 yrs after the fire, allowing populations to recover to near pre-fire levels within 2 generations.

evaluated the influence of horses, mules, and other pack stock animals on subalpine meadow plant communities in Sequoia and Yosemite National Parks. Study results indicated that plant communities across meadows are generally resistant to current levels of recreational pack stock use. However, within-meadow responses such as increased stretches of bare, grazed ground or spatial variability in plant communities can depend on local hydrological conditions. Wilderness managers can improve monitoring of disturbance in Sierra Nevada meadows by adopting multiple plant community indices while also considering local moisture regimes.

#### Title: Pre-Publication Notification: Genetic Analysis of Northern Spotted and California Spotted Owl Hybrids

- Background: Northern spotted owls and California spotted owls are genetically different subspecies. To obtain a clearer depiction of owl genetic differentiation and investigate the possibility of hybridization, USGS researchers analyzed 131 owls where the subspecies have close contact in northern California. They combined this data with data from samples collected between 1990 and 2006. Their examination revealed a previously undocumented, highly genetically differentiated lineage of northern spotted owls close to the northern edge of the California spotted owl range, possibly due to this population's history of isolation. Over 50 percent of northern spotted owls showed evidence of hybrid ancestry; however, no first-generation hybrids were identified. This result may indicate that primary hybridization between subspecies is occurring elsewhere on the landscape or that recent large-scale landscape disturbances, such forest fires, have reduced interactions between subspecies. This study provides the most definitive insights to date regarding hybridization in spotted owls in the northern California contact zone.

• **Background:** In the Great Basin, soil erosion on burned slopes can be ten times that of unburned slopes. Additionally, revegetation projects often fail because of annual fluctuations in precipitation. Biological soil crusts can reduce soil erosion, and the moss component of these crusts can help retain soil water, improving native plant restoration after fires. USGS researchers will experiment with restoring mosses using two stabilization methods, a jute net or hydro-mulch tackifier. They will compare the jute net against the tackifier to determine how well each method prevents soil erosion, and

restores mosses and native plants. Scientists will use a rainfall simulator to mimic a 25year maximum storm event to determine soil erosion and water runoff amounts on treatments. #### Title: A New Earthquake Forecast Model for California

- What: A synopsis overview of a new earthquake forecast model for California (UCERF3) will be published

- **Background:** On July 12th, the USGS will publish a new earthquake forecast model for California, known as the 3rd Uniform California Earthquake Rupture Forecast (UCERF3). Building on previous models that quantify the long-term hazard posed by natural tectonic loading, the new model now also includes the short-term hazard posed by earthquake triggering, such as aftershocks. In fact, UCERF3 is the first earthquake forecast to include fault-based information when defining the evolution of cascading earthquake sequences, and to include the possibility that large earthquakes may involve multiple faults. Several recent earthquakes have demonstrated these phenomena, including the recent New Zealand earthquake sequence that culminated in the magnitude 7.8 Kaikoura earthquake. UCERF3 has been delivered to the California Earthquake Authority, the state issuer of earthquake insurance, and is now under evaluation by the USGS as a prototype component of an operational earthquake forecasting system.

- <u>What:</u> A new study used boosted regression tree (BRT) models to reveal interactions among geomorphological landform features (stream slope, elevation, network length, contributing area, and channel confinement) and seasonal precipitation patterns (winter, spring, and summer months) that were robust predictors of spatial and temporal variation in groundwater influence on stream temperatures. This is the first study linking spatial and temporal predictors to groundwater influence at ecologically relevant spatial scales.

This approach can assist natural resource managers in identifying and prioritizing stream reaches of potential climate refugia and understanding fish population dynamics by accounting for the spatial structure of thermally-suitable habitat and thermal refugia.

## **BOEM Report: Determining Fine-scale Use and Movement Patterns of Diving Bird Species in Federal Waters of the Mid-Atlantic United States Using Satellite Telemetry**

Additional objectives included: (1) better identifying connectivity and distribution of all three species across seasons (including delineating source breeding populations when possible); (2) designing and testing externally mounted transmitter attachment techniques on focal species, with goals of increasing tag longevity and reducing bird mortality; and (3) developing winter capture techniques for Northern Gannets which had not previously been captured at sea during winter. 

Title: New study: Declines revisited: Long-term recovery and spatial population dynamics of tailed frog larvae after wildfire

Scientists re-surveyed 8 streams 11–12 years after a wildfire to determine of fire-associated declines in abundance of larval Rocky Mountain tailed frogs (*Ascaphus montanus*) persisted or if populations had recovered. Rocky Mountain tailed frogs have several unusual life-history traits that could slow population recovery, including an extended larval period (4 yrs), delayed sexual maturity (6–8 yrs), and low fecundity (<50 eggs/yr). Results showed that negative effects of burn extent on larval abundance weakened >58% within 12 yrs after the fire, allowing populations to recover to near pre-fire levels within 2 generations.

- **Background**: This month, scientists from the USGS Western Ecological Research Center, Vibrant Data Labs, UC Davis, UC Merced, and the Institut des Sciences de l'Evolution published a new article on pack stock effects on subalpine meadows in PLOS ONE (<u>http://journals.plos.org/plosone/article?id=10.1371/journal.pone.0178536</u>). The researchers evaluated the influence of horses, mules, and other pack stock animals on subalpine meadow plant communities in Sequoia and Yosemite National Parks. Study results indicated that plant communities across meadows are generally resistant to current levels of recreational pack stock use. However, within-meadow responses such as increased stretches of bare, grazed ground or spatial variability in plant communities can depend on local hydrological conditions. Wilderness managers can improve monitoring of disturbance in Sierra Nevada meadows by adopting multiple plant community indices while also considering local moisture regimes.



#### Title: Pre-Publication Notification: Genetic Analysis of Northern Spotted and California Spotted Owl Hybrids

- What: A paper titled "Genetic Differentiation and Inferred Dynamics of a Hybrid Zone between Northern Spotted Owls *(Strix occidentalis caurina)* and California Spotted Owls *(S. o. occidentalis)* In Northern California" has been accepted for publication at the journal Ecology and Evolution.

- **Background:** Northern spotted owls and California spotted owls are genetically different subspecies. To obtain a clearer depiction of owl genetic differentiation and investigate the possibility of hybridization, USGS researchers analyzed 131 owls where the subspecies have close contact in northern California. They combined this data with data from samples collected between 1990 and 2006. Their examination revealed a previously undocumented, highly genetically differentiated lineage of northern spotted owls close to the northern edge of the California spotted owl range, possibly due to this population's history of isolation. Over 50 percent of northern spotted owls showed evidence of hybrid ancestry; however, no first-generation hybrids were identified. This result may indicate that primary hybridization between subspecies is occurring elsewhere on the landscape or that recent large-scale landscape disturbances, such forest fires, have reduced interactions between subspecies. This study provides the most definitive insights to date regarding hybridization in spotted owls in the northern California contact zone.

Movement and behavioral responses of eagles from drought-stricken areas are important to understand so that management decisions can be made at the appropriate scale. In a new study, researchers will combine already-existing data on nearly 300 telemetered eagles from numerous studies across the country to evaluate potential environmental drivers of long-distance movements by eagles, and to identify the demographic consequences of those movements. The results will aid the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in understanding golden eagle long-distance movements in the context of drought and other weather-related variables so they can take appropriate actions to mitigate threats by knowing when, where, and why eagles move. Combining these data sets presents a unique opportunity to study eagle movements and model underlying drivers of these movements and their conservation implications.

## Title: New Study: Holding Their Ground: Does Biocrust Restoration Enhance the Germination of Native Plants and Reduce Soil Degradation?

- What: USGS researchers will experiment with restoring mosses using two stabilization methods, a jute net or hydro-mulch tackifier, to see if they can enhance the germination of native plants and reduce soil degradation on arid lands.

- **Background:** In the Great Basin, soil erosion on burned slopes can be ten times that of unburned slopes. Additionally, revegetation projects often fail because of annual fluctuations in precipitation. Biological soil crusts can reduce soil erosion, and the moss component of these crusts can help retain soil water, improving native plant restoration after fires. USGS researchers will experiment with restoring mosses using two stabilization methods, a jute net or hydro-mulch tackifier. They will compare the jute net against the tackifier to determine how well each method prevents soil erosion, and restores mosses and native plants. Scientists will use a rainfall simulator to mimic a 25-year maximum storm event to determine soil erosion and water runoff amounts on



treatments. Findings from this work may aid tribal, federal, state, and private landowners throughout the Great Basin in protecting soils while restoring plants.

#### Title: A New Earthquake Forecast Model for California

- On July 12th, the USGS will publish a new earthquake forecast model for California, known as the 3rd Uniform California Earthquake Rupture Forecast (UCERF3). Building on previous models that quantify the long-term hazard posed by natural tectonic loading, the new model now also includes the short-term hazard posed by earthquake triggering, such as aftershocks. In fact, UCERF3 is the first earthquake forecast to include fault-based information when defining the evolution of cascading earthquake sequences, and to include the possibility that large earthquakes may involve multiple faults. Several recent earthquake sequence that culminated in the magnitude 7.8 Kaikoura earthquake. UCERF3 has been delivered to the California Earthquake Authority, the state issuer of earthquake insurance, and is now under evaluation by the USGS as a prototype component of an operational earthquake forecasting system.

### Alaska Science Center (ASC):

**Collaborative USGS and BLM Alaska Fire Service Campaign Investigates North Slope Tundra Fires**: During July, Alaska Science Center Geographers Benjamin Jones and Carson Baughman, will collaborate with BLM Fire Ecologists Eric Miller and Randi Jandt, of the Alaska Fire Science Consortium, to study post-fire effects within the Anaktuvuk River tundra fire. This year's survey marks ten years since the fire burned over 1,000 square kilometers of tundra on Alaska's North Slope. The team will revisit long term study plots to assess changes in vegetation and subsidence of permafrost-influenced terrain due to ground ice melt. They will also measure ecosystem components in very old and previously unrecognized tundra fires from the early 1900s. The aim of the research is to improve land manager's understanding of fire effects on Alaska's North Slope; a region expected to see more frequent and severe fires in the next century. Landsat Trend Analysis of Permafrost Region Lake Changes: USGS Alaska Science Center Research Geographer Benjamin Jones is co-author of a recently published paper in the journal *Remote Sensing* that uses machine-learning based classification of robust trends of multi-spectral indices of Landsat data (TM, ETM+, OLI) and object-based lake detection, to analyze and compare the individual, local and regional lake dynamics for four different study sites (Alaska North Slope, Western Alaska, Central Yakutia, Kolyma Lowland) in the northern permafrost zone from 1999 to 2014. Variability in lake dynamics across regions was associated with differences in permafrost characteristics, landscape position (i.e., upland vs. lowland), surface geology, and climate. With the global availability of Landsat data and a consistent methodology for processing the input data derived from robust trends of multi-spectral indices, the study demonstrates a transferability, scalability and consistency of lake change analysis within the northern permafrost region. **New Publication Presents Breakthrough in Diet Estimation:** Quantitative fatty acid signature analysis (QFASA) is a common method of estimating diet composition, particularly for marine species. The method assumes that calibration coefficients, which account for the differential metabolism of individual fatty acids, are known constants. In practice, however, the coefficients have been estimated in feeding trials with captive animals. The impossibility of verifying the accuracy of feeding-trial coefficients for application to wild animals is a shortcoming of QFASA that has drawn considerable criticism. A new paper in *Ecology and Evolution* by USGS Alaska Science Center researchers Jeff Bromaghin, Karyn Rode, and colleagues presents a new model that simultaneously estimates both diet composition and calibration coefficients. Significant advantages of the model are that feeding trials are no longer required and bias from using inaccurate coefficients is avoided. This breakthrough eliminates the primary criticism of QFASA and substantially increases the value of fatty acid data to investigate aspects of ecology linked to animal diets. **H2O concentration in clinopyroxene improves our understanding of the mantle's water budget:** Peridotite mantle xenoliths were analyzed from four active arcs, including: Mexico, Kamchatka, Philippines, and New Britain, as well as one intra-plate setting (western Victoria). All of the sub-arc xenoliths have been variably metasomatized and have strong arc trace element signatures. Water concentrations of the metasomatic melt that last reacted with the clinopyroxene in the sub-arc xenoliths are estimated to be between 0.5 and 5 weight percent H2O. Title: Bogoslof Volcano: Aviation Color Code and Alert Level at RED / WARNING Area: Alaska

Summary: Two explosive eruptions have occurred at Bogoslof volcano, at 00:45 and 11:17 UTC on June 27. Both events were relatively short-duration, lasting only ~14 minutes each based on seismic data, and the two explosions produced volcanic clouds reaching altitudes of 25,000 and 30,000 ft above sea level, respectively, based on satellite data. AVO raised the Aviation Color Code to RED and Volcano Alert Level to WARNING. Seismicity is currently at background levels, but Bogoslof volcano remains at a heightened state of unrest and in an unpredictable condition. Recent eruptive episodes have produced multiple short-duration explosions with pauses of minutes to hours. Additional explosions producing high-altitude volcanic clouds could occur at any time. AVO will continue to monitor seismic and infrasound data from nearby islands, as well as lightning data from the World Wide Lightning Location Network for signs of renewed activity.

- **Background**: This month, scientists from the USGS Western Ecological Research Center, Vibrant Data Labs, UC Davis, UC Merced, and the Institut des Sciences de

l'Evolution published a new article on pack stock effects on subalpine meadows in PLOS ONE (<u>http://journals.plos.org/plosone/article?id=10.1371/journal.pone.0178536</u>). The researchers evaluated the influence of horses, mules, and other pack stock animals on subalpine meadow plant communities in Sequoia and Yosemite National Parks. Study results indicated that plant communities across meadows are generally resistant to current levels of recreational pack stock use. However, within-meadow responses such as increased stretches of bare, grazed ground or spatial variability in plant communities can depend on local hydrological conditions. Wilderness managers can improve monitoring of disturbance in Sierra Nevada meadows by adopting multiple plant community indices while also considering local moisture regimes.

**Effects of Wildfire and Drought on Lahontan Cutthroat Trout Habitat:** Researchers studied how drought and wildfire influenced stream flow permanence and thermal regimes in the Willow and Whitehorse Creeks watershed in the Great Basin. They analyzed data from water temperature loggers installed across the study area before and after the Holloway Fire burned nearly the entire watershed in 2012. Stream temperatures warmed 2-4°C immediately in response to the fire, and effects appeared to persist for at least one year. Observed patterns of warming were highly localized, however, highlighting the role of local processes in hydrologic responses to drought. More than half of the sites sampled were dry in 2014 and 2015. The combination of drought and post-fire conditions appeared to greatly restrict suitable habitat for Lahontan cutthroat trout across this watershed. Understanding complex responses to drought can be revealed through more intensive on-the-ground monitoring of streamflow permanence and temperatures.

**Structured Decision Making for Conservation of Bull Trout in Long Creek**: Bull trout in Long Creek in south-central Oregon's Klamath River Basin are threatened with high densities of nonnative species and habitat fragmentation. To evaluate potential conservation options, the USGS convened a workshop with stakeholders from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, The Nature Conservancy, and private landowners. They used a structured decision making process to assist stakeholders in designing a bull trout recovery plan for Long Creek. Stakeholders identified their fundamental objectives for conserving bull trout, feasible management alternatives to achieve their objectives, and biological information and assumptions to incorporate in a decision model. The optimal management decision was to eradicate brook trout and improve downstream conditions for bull trout. The structured decision-making process allowed stakeholders from various entities to consensually identify the decision situation and objectives, as well as a suite of general actions that could be implemented.

**Season, Molt, and Body Size Influence Mercury Concentrations in Grebes**: Fish-eating waterbirds are often used as indicators for site-specific exposure risk of mercury contamination on environmental health. Sampling bird mercury concentrations at specific locations throughout the year may help identify periods of high and low mercury exposure and potential causes for these periods. USGS researchers studied seasonal and physiological influences on mercury concentrations in western grebes and Clark's grebes across 29 lakes and reservoirs in California. Grebe blood mercury concentrations were higher among males than females and higher among Clark's grebes than western grebes. Mercury blood concentrations decreased by 60 percent from spring to fall, yet seasonal trends were not consistent among lakes, indicating that lake-specific variation in mercury dynamics influence overall seasonal blood mercury decline. Results highlight the importance of accounting for sampling date and ecological processes that may influence mercury concentrations when developing monitoring programs to assess site-specific exposure risk of mercury to wildlife.

**New USGS report on natural salmon recolonization following dam removal:** A new USGS report on juvenile salmonid monitoring in the White Salmon River, Washington, following Condit Dam removal has just been released. Condit Dam was breached in 2011 and removed completely in 2012, allowing anadromous salmonids access to habitat that had been blocked for nearly 100 years. A multi-agency workgroup concluded that the preferred salmonid restoration alternative was natural recolonization with monitoring to assess efficacy, followed by a management evaluation 5 years after dam removal. Limited monitoring of salmon and steelhead spawning has occurred since 2011, but no monitoring of juveniles occurred until 2016. In 2016,

USGS scientists, in cooperation with the Mid-Columbia Fisheries Enhancement Group, used a rotary screw trap and backpack electrofishing to assess juvenile salmonid diversity, distribution, and abundance. The 2016 efforts provided the first post-dam smolt and juvenile abundance estimates for Coho Salmon and steelhead. As well as the first documentation of Coho Salmon juvenile production in tributaries upstream of the former Condit Dam site. This monitoring effort will help to better understand abundance trends, distribution, and life history patterns of recolonizing salmonids in the White Salmon River and assess efficacy of natural recolonization to inform management decisions. **New report on endangered suckers in the Upper Klamath Lake, OR:** A new report and data set have been released that summarizes inter-annual variability in apparent relative production, survival and growth of endangered juvenile Lost River and shortnose suckers in Upper Klamath Lake, Oregon. Sucker survival during the juvenile life stage is the primary factor limiting recovery of these species in Upper Klamath Lake. A report compiling data on juvenile suckers collected from 2001 to 2015 aims to identify correlations between annual variation in environmental conditions and juvenile sucker survival. The authors found that relatively high instream flows during the spawning season in the primary spawning tributary are correlated with high production of suckers. First year sucker growth varied among years but is unsynchronized between species, indicating the two species responded differently to similar environmental variables. **New USGS report on spatial and temporal distribution of bull trout in the North Fork Reservoir, OR**: In a new USGS report acoustic cameras were used to assess the behavior and abundance of bull trout (*Salvelinus confluentus*)-size fish at the entrance to the North Fork Reservoir juvenile fish floating surface collector (FSC). The purpose of the FSC is to collect downriver migrating juvenile salmonids at the North Fork Dam, and safely route them around the hydroelectric projects. The objective of the acoustic camera component of this study was to assess the behaviors of bull trout-size fish observed near the FSC, and to determine if the presence of bull trout-size fish influenced the collection or abundance of juvenile salmonids. On June 21, USGS scientist Annemarie Baltay was interviewed by reporters Tom Vacar and Sami Mamou of KTVU FOX 2 TV (Oakland, CA); Kristen Sze of KGO ABC 7 TV (San Francisco, CA); KPIX 5 CBS TV (San Francisco, CA) and Asian-language KTSF 26 TV about the magnitude 3.3 earthquake located half a mile west of Kensington, California, in the eastern San Francisco Bay Area.

A software glitch (now fixed) turned an update of the magnitude of a 1925 Santa Barbara M6.8 earthquake into an erroneous ENS notification. Numerous news media outlets contacted the USGS seeking confirmation about the alert.

On June 28, USGS scientist emeritus Brian Atwater was interviewed by reporter Christopher Dunagan of the Environmental Reporter (Kitsap Peninsula) about the paper titled "<u>Sediment</u> gravity flows triggered by remotely generated earthquake waves." This paper (co-authored by USGS scientist Joan Gomberg) provides an alternative explanation for deep-sea deposits in Cascadia that were previously interpreted as evidence for frequent (local) great earthquakes along the Cascadia Subduction Zone.



- On July 12th, the USGS will publish a new earthquake forecast model for California, known as the 3rd Uniform California Earthquake Rupture Forecast (UCERF3). Building on previous models that quantify the long-term hazard posed by natural tectonic loading, the new model now also includes the short-term hazard posed by earthquake triggering, such as aftershocks. In fact, UCERF3 is the first earthquake forecast to include fault-based information when defining the evolution of cascading earthquake sequences, and to include the possibility that large earthquakes may involve multiple faults. UCERF3 has been delivered to the California Earthquake Authority, the state issuer of earthquake insurance, and is now under evaluation by the USGS as a prototype component of an operational earthquake forecasting system.



As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In doing so he has several different goals; to get out of his bubble here at Facebook and in Northern California, to visit communities and meet people he wouldn't otherwise wouldn't and most importantly learn. <u>Here</u> is a story the NY Times did on his travels.



We try to develop themes for the areas and people he meets with. So far, we haven't really done anything around natural resources and people who work to manage public lands. Earlier in the



trip he'll be visiting a North Dakota community involved in oil production and thought that a visit to Glacier, where the effects of global warming have been widely documented, would be a good balance.

Mark would like to meet with people involved with the stewardship of the Park. This could include Superintendent Mow, park rangers, park volunteers, someone from the Glacier Institute and someone involved in the study of climate change on the park (someone from the USGS and/or Portland State who worked on this study). If you are free, I'd like you to attend to be able talk to Mark about your 30 years in the park and your role as a backcountry ranger.

We'd also like to do this meeting a little differently. Rather than at Park HQ in a conference room we'd like to do it in a Jammer heading up the Pass. Thought is to take the meeting outside and talk about the Park in the Park. It would be great to drive up to the Pass, get our and walk the boardwalk to the Hidden Lake overlook. This would give mark the opportunity to informally interact with some of the visitors along with giving us some great photos. Let me know if you have a contact at Xanterra I could talk to about renting a Jammer for the day.

Thanks for the time over the phone yesterday. It was good to catch up.

As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In doing so he has several different goals; to get out of his bubble here at Facebook and in Northern California, to visit communities and meet people he wouldn't otherwise wouldn't and most importantly learn. <u>Here</u> is a story the NY Times did on his travels.

We try to develop themes for the areas and people he meets with. So far, we haven't really done anything around natural resources and people who work to manage public lands. Earlier in the trip he'll be visiting a North Dakota community involved in oil production and thought that a visit to Glacier, where the effects of global warming have been widely documented, would be a good balance.

We'd also like to do this meeting a little differently. Rather than at Park HQ in a conference room we'd like to do it in a Jammer heading up the Pass. Thought is to take the meeting outside and talk about the Park in the Park. It would be great to drive up to the Pass, get our and walk the boardwalk to the Hidden Lake overlook. This would give mark the opportunity to informally interact with some of the visitors along with giving us some great photos. Let me know if you have a contact at Xanterra I could talk to about renting a Jammer for the day.

Thanks for the time over the phone yesterday. It was good to catch up.

As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In doing so he has several different goals; to get out of his bubble here at Facebook and in Northern California, to visit communities and meet people he wouldn't otherwise wouldn't and most importantly learn. <u>Here</u> is a story the NY Times did on his travels.

We try to develop themes for the areas and people he meets with. So far, we haven't really done anything around natural resources and people who work to manage public lands. This would give mark the opportunity to informally interact with some of the visitors along with giving us some great photos. Let me know if you have a contact at Xanterra I could talk to about renting a Jammer for the day.

Thanks for the time over the phone yesterday. It was good to catch up.

As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In doing so he has several different goals; to get out of his bubble here at Facebook and in Northern California, to visit communities and meet people he wouldn't otherwise wouldn't and most importantly learn. <u>Here</u> is a story the NY Times did on his travels.



As I mentioned, as part of a personal challenge for 2017, Mark is spending the year traveling across the country visiting approximately the 30 states he's never been to. In addition to the records requested above, American Oversight also requests records describing the processing of this request, including records sufficient to identify search terms used and locations and custodians searched and any tracking sheets used to track the processing of this request. If your agency uses FOIA questionnaires or certifications completed by individual custodians or components to determine whether they possess responsive materials or to describe how they conducted searches, we also request any such records prepared in connection with the processing of this request.

We provided two interim responses and records related to the subject matter of this request on August 25, 2017, and September 12, 2017, respectively. We are releasing one hundred and fortynine (149) pages previously released to another FOIA requester. Our Interim Responses cover items 1 (a), (d), (h) and (i); item 2 (d) and (h); and item 3.

After a thorough search of our files, the USGS did not locate records responsive to the remaining items of your request. Additionally, we did not possess records describing the processing of your request prior to searching for records responsive to your request. We did not compile tracking spreadsheets and search terms before the date of the search began; however, we did compile a tracking spreadsheet after our search began and while processing your request and the other requests for the same subject matter. Our office provides notifications to potential record-holders requesting a search for records, which includes information for conducting the records search, but we do not provide questionnaires or certifications. There are no records connected with the processing of the request that were in existence before the search began. If you would like copies of the tracking spreadsheet that we used while processing your request and the other requests, please submit an additional FOIA request.

We have classified you as an "other-use" requester. We granted your request for a fee waiver on July 24, 2017. As such, you are not being charged for the processing of your request.

Ms. Litsa Marinos, U.S. Geological Survey, Government Information Specialist, is responsible for this partial denial.

You may appeal this partial denial response to the Department's FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer. If you choose to appeal, the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer must receive your FOIA appeal **no later than 90 workdays** from the date of this letter.
