RE: Sexual Assault Allegations Involving Assemblyman Devon Mathis

Dear District Attorney Schubert:

Over the past few months, I have been doing some research on a number of California legislators. In the course of this research, I came across disturbing allegations that Assemblyman Devon Mathis may have committed a sexual assault crime.

Please find two attached documents containing statements by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] provided the bulk of the information regarding the sexual assault while [REDACTED] provided corroborating information. [REDACTED]

Together, they recount an incident that took place in the spring of 2016 where Mathis is accused of committing a sexual assault on a defenseless and unconscious victim.

As the story is told by [REDACTED] Mathis required his senior staff to attend after hours receptions hosted by legislators, lobbyists and special interest groups. One particular evening, Mathis gathered [REDACTED] another male staff member [REDACTED], and a [REDACTED] named [REDACTED]. This was unusual because she was not senior staff and this was the first time that Mathis asked for her to attend.

Once the receptions concluded at around 9 PM that evening, the group of four went to the Coin-Op restaurant on K Street for food and drink. They were joined by [REDACTED] who works nearby. [REDACTED] ended up having to leave at around 10 PM to go home to his family.

A short time later, Mathis, [REDACTED] take an Uber to [REDACTED] home that [REDACTED]. The four drink some more alcohol and also smoke marijuana.

Eventually, [REDACTED] starts getting sick and [REDACTED] leads her to [REDACTED] bedroom. In the guest bedroom, [REDACTED] ends up passing out.

Some point later, Assemblyman Mathis excuses himself saying he needs to go to the bathroom. A good amount of time passes before [REDACTED] begin to think that Mathis might have passed out in the restroom so she gets up to check on him.

She does not find him in the bathroom so she decides to check in on [REDACTED]. Once she opened the guest room door, she finds Assemblyman Mathis lying next to an unconscious [REDACTED] with his hand(s) on her pubic region and/or digitally penetrating her vagina.

[REDACTED] is upset and kicks Assemblyman Mathis out of the room. [REDACTED] subsequently wakes up and [REDACTED] recommends that she go back to sleep and gives her some pajamas to wear.

Mathis then excuses himself to [REDACTED] and says he is headed outside to have a smoke. But when [REDACTED] goes out to look for him, he finds that Mathis has made his way around to the backyard and was peering into the bathroom where he was watching [REDACTED] change.

[REDACTED] then call an Uber to send Assemblyman Mathis back to his hotel room.

The above information was an account provided by [REDACTED] during an interview. A set of notes of that interview were memorialized in a document. The document was [REDACTED] to verify the facts and that [REDACTED] would be willing to provide the account to law enforcement authorities. [REDACTED] made some changes to the document which is being sent to you as an attachment labeled "Statements from [REDACTED]"

[REDACTED] also provided information regarding this issue. [REDACTED] was speaking to Assemblyman Mathis outside of an event in Visalia. [REDACTED] " [REDACTED] helps protect me with the [REDACTED] issue."

Notes from an interview with [REDACTED] were memorialized in a series of emails with [REDACTED] replied to the emails with corrections and clarifications of [REDACTED]. The final set of facts are attached and labeled "Statements from [REDACTED]"
