The overall Winter Operations costs were driven by the significant snow accumulation over the January-April winter season, which was 12% and 22% higher than the 5-year and 20-year averages. There were also 60 winter events (snow, freezing rain, rain), which is the highest number in the last 20 years (in 2016, there were 55). The increased snow accumulation resulted in an increased number of snow removals and more snow clearing. This also led to higher operating costs at the snow disposal facilities. There were 17 days where freezing rain occurred, which is almost double the norm of 9 days. The higher than normal precipitation (snow, freezing rain, rain) resulted in an increased application of abrasives on roadways, sidewalks and pathways. Further, this led to increased costs in fleet usage and maintenance.
