Dear Mr. Bassin:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated February 15, 2017, and received in this Office on February 27, 2017, in which you requested communication between the Offices of the Attorney General, Deputy Attorney General, or Associate Attorney General and either President-Elect Trump's transition team or President Trump's Administration from November 9, 2016, through February 15, 2017, pertaining to former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. This response is made on behalf of the Offices of the Attorney General, Deputy Attorney General, and Associate Attorney General.

Pursuant to your March 1, 2017 conversation with Douglas Hibbard of this Office, you indicated that you are not interested in receiving news articles, to the extent that they do not include any Department commentary on them. Your request will be processed accordingly.

The records you seek require searches in other Offices, and so your request falls within "unusual circumstances." See 5 U.S.C. 552 § (a)(6)(B)(i)-(iii). Because of these unusual circumstances, we need to extend the time limit to respond to your request beyond the ten additional days provided by the statute. For your information, we use multiple tracks to process requests, but within those tracks we work in an agile manner, and the time needed to complete our work on your request will necessarily depend on a variety of factors, including the complexity of our records search, the volume and complexity of any material located, and the order of receipt of your request. At this time we have assigned your request to the complex track. In an effort to speed up our process, you may wish to narrow the scope of your request to limit the number of potentially responsive records so that it can be placed in a different processing track. You can also agree to an alternative time frame for processing, should records be located; or you may wish to await the completion of our records search to discuss either of these options. You may also contact the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) of the National Archives and Records Administration to inquire into the FOIA mediation services they provide.
