This is in response to items 2 and 3 of your July 13, 2017 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for information pertaining to several listed third party individuals. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any records responsive to these items of your request per FOIA exemptions (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C), 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C). Even to acknowledge the existence of such records could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This is a standard response to such requests and should not be taken to mean that records do, or do not, exist. Therefore, your request for items 2 and 3 is closed.
