Dear Ms. Christ:

This is in response to your U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request (GSA-2017-001699), dated September 27, 2017, in which you requested the following:

"...all Senior Federal Travel Reports submitted to the General Services Administration in calendar year 2017..."

Per Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 41 § 301-70.906, agencies must report to GSA use of Government aircraft to carry senior Federal officials and non-Federal travelers. However, agencies maintain ownership of their travel data and determine how that data is made available to the public, per CFR 41 § 301-70.908. Therefore, in order to obtain the travel information requested, you should submit your request directly to the agencies.

Based on the above information, this constitutes a denial of your request. You have the right to appeal the denial of the information being withheld. As such, you may administratively submit your appeal online via

(https://foiaonline.regulations.gov/foia/action/public/home) or by writing to U.S. General Services Administration at the address shown below. Your appeal must be postmarked or electronically transmitted within 120 days of the date of the response to your request.

Your appeal must be in writing and should contain a brief statement of the reasons why the withheld information should be released. Enclose a copy of your initial request and this partial denial. Both the appeal letter and envelope should be marked prominently, "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."
