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- A. It does say that. 1
- Q. So wouldn't it be assumed they didn't 2
- 3 find anything wrong, or do you think they found
- something wrong and just chose to honor my 4
- request? 5

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- MR. CHABOT: Objection, foundation.
- MR. KAPLAN: Objection, foundation. 7
- A. I can't really sav. 8
- Q. So you think it's possible that they 9
- determined against me but chose not to tell 10
- anyone? 11
- 12 MR. CHABOT: Same objection.
- A. I'm not familiar with their policies 13
- or procedures regarding the application 14
- requirements. 15
- 16 Q. If they agreed with my interpretation
- of the two settlement agreements, would you 17
- believe that you were wrong on your termination 18
- 19 letter regarding USC?
- 20 MR. KAPLAN: Note my objection.
- A. I think that the USC information was 21
- in line with other previous concerns about 22
- lying, but again, was not found out until 23

- decisions? 1
- A. Yes. 2

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- Q. So if they decided that there was no
- problem with USC on my application, would your
- 5 statement on the termination letter be wrong?
 - MR. CHABOT: I'm going to object to
- the question for the reasons stated by Attorney 7
- 8 Kaplan earlier.
 - A. What was the question?
- 10 Q. I'll just repeat it.
 - (The record was read as requested.)
 - MR. CHABOT: Did you get that, Dr.
- Finn? 13
- 14 A. I guess I'm still not clear what
- 15 statement you're referring to, the statement,
- that that together with the other concerns. 16
- 17 Q. So you enumerated certain items in
- the termination letter. One of them was you 18
- 19 failed to disclose USC Keck on your ERAS
- application. So there's that statement which 20
- is an enumerated cause of termination among 21
- about six others. But that statement is what 22
- I'm referring to. And we can go back and look, 23

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- but that statement, if ERAS investigations
- determined differently, would you say you were 2
 - wrong or would you disagree with ERAS?
- MR. CHABOT: Hypothetically speaking? 4
- Q. I don't think it's hypothetical. She 5
- just doesn't know who ERAS investigations is, 6
- but it's not really hypothetical. 7
- MR. CHABOT: That's also not what the 8
- document says. Just note my objection. 9
- MR. KAPLAN: Note my objection as well. 10
- Q. Well, I don't think it's a 11
 - hypothetical, but if that's how she wants to
- answer it. 13
- A. It's hypothetical in the sense that 14
- this information was not available to me at 15
- that time. 16
- Q. I'm saying now. Now if you agree that 17
- 18 they made that determination but you don't seem
- to know but if that was proven to you, would 19
- you then believe your letter, that enumerated 20
- item was wrong or would you think they were 21
- 22 incorrect, ERAS? MR. CHABOT: Objection to the form of 23

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- significantly after the decision was already 1
- made. 2
- Q. But you do have to answer the 3
- question. Do you think you were wrong on the 4
- USC matter and the termination letter if 5
- indeed ERAS agreed with interpretation of the 6
- 7 settlement?
- MR. KAPLAN: I'm going to object to 8
- the question because it calls for a conclusion 9
- I don't believe this witness is qualified to 10
- make, but you can go ahead. 11
- A. I think the general omission was the 12
- concern. It was never specific to the USC 13
- 14 complaint.
- 15 Q. I'll rephrase the question. Is ERAS
- or is AAMC the administrator for ERAS? Do they 16
- have authority over their service? 17
- A I don't know. 18
- Q. Don't they have an investigation unit 19
- called ERAS Investigations? 20
- A. I don't know. 21
- Q. So would you trust, if they do have an 22
- investigation unit, would you trust their 23
