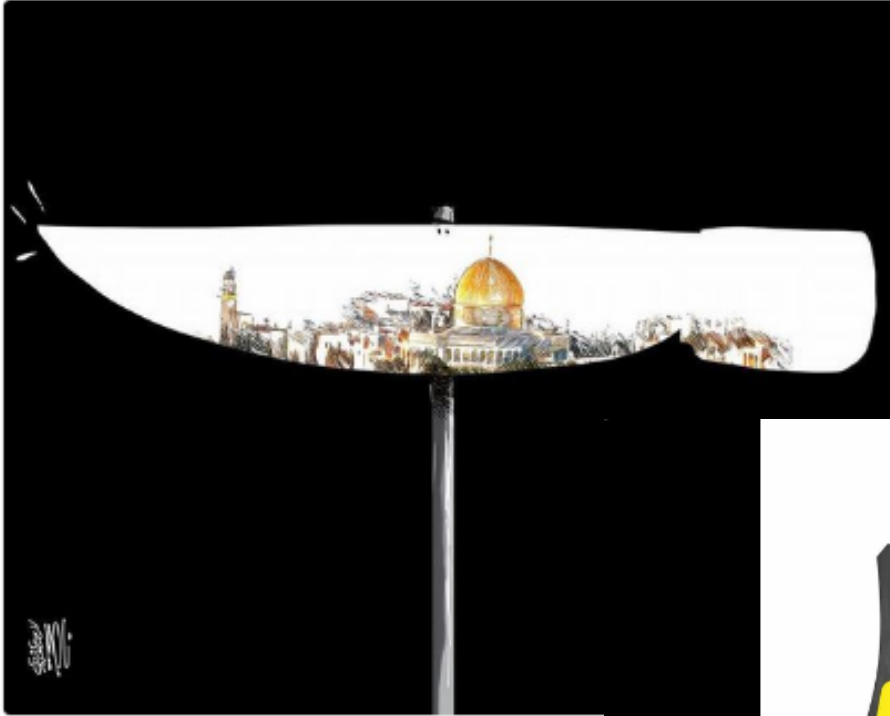

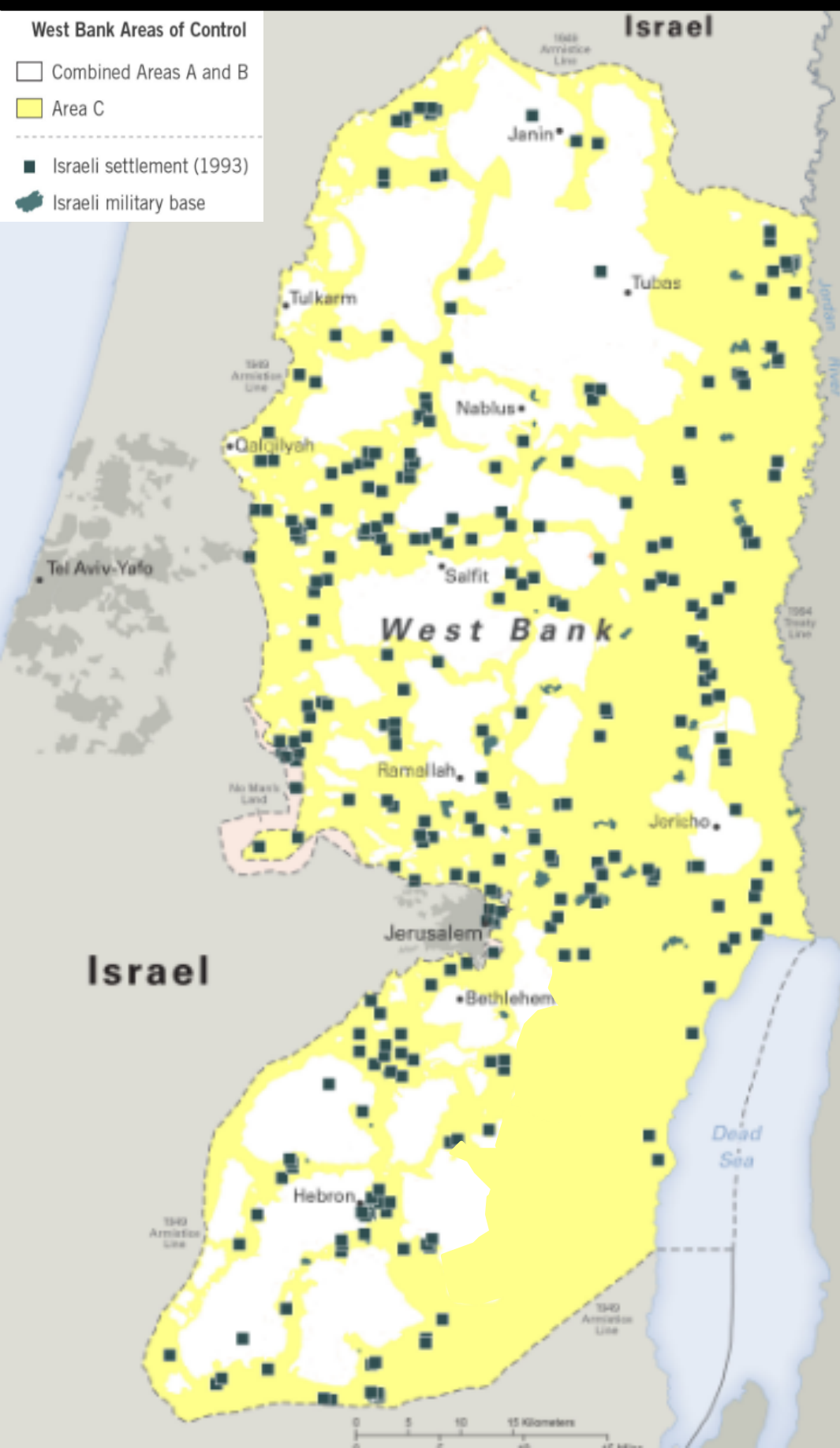

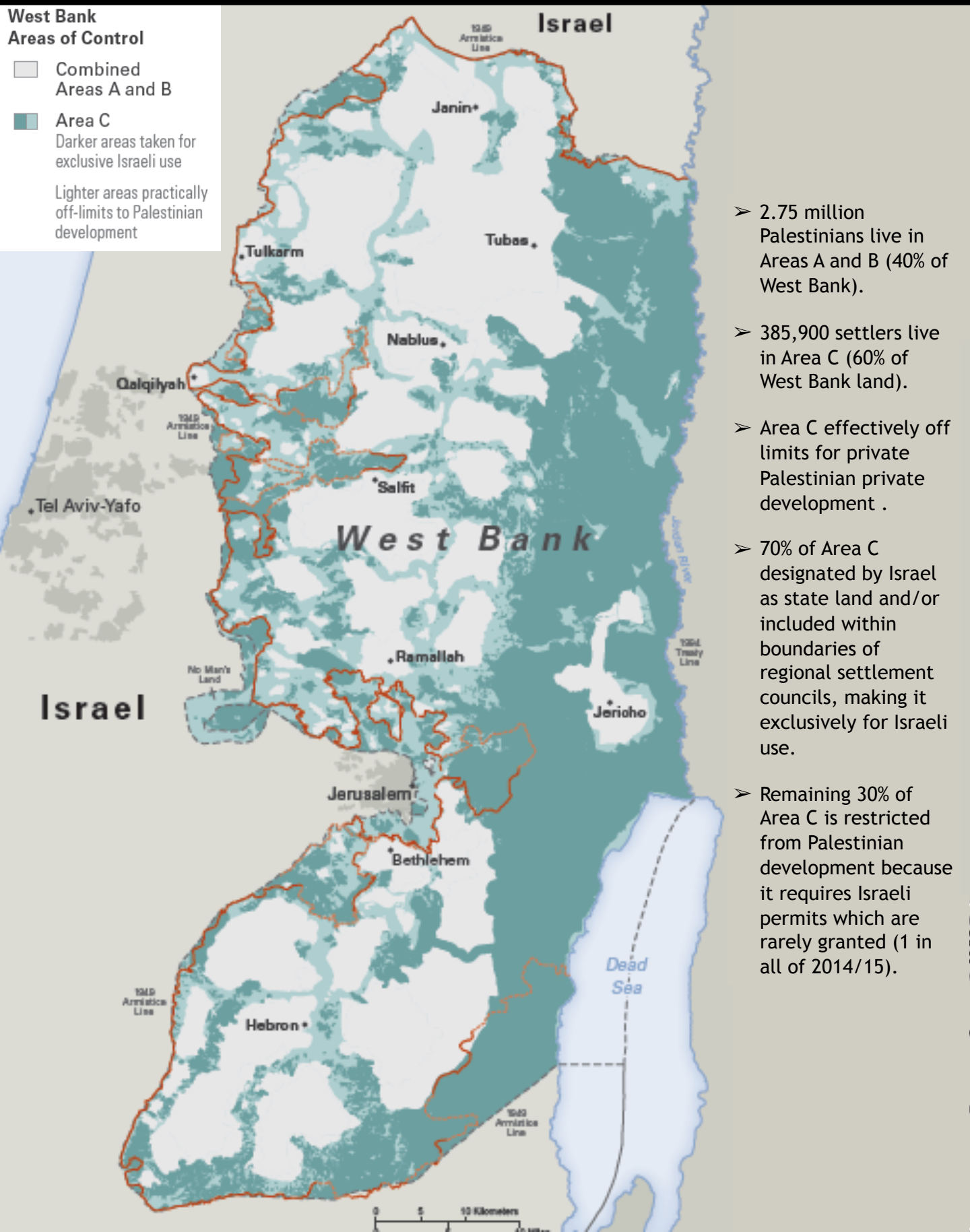
**ARTICLE XI—
Land (Excerpts)**

2. The two sides agree that territory, except for issues that will be negotiated in the permanent status negotiations*, will come under the jurisdiction of the Palestinian Authority within 18 months:

*permanent status negotiations: Jerusalem, settlements, specified military locations, Palestinian refugees, borders, foreign relations and Israelis.

- In Oslo, the two sides agreed Area C territory would come under PA jurisdiction within 18 months (excluding settlements and military locations, which are final status issues).
- In the 1998 Wye River Memorandum, Netanyahu agreed to transition 13% of Area C to Area B, and in the 1999 Sharm el-Sheikh Memorandum, Barak agreed to transfer 11% of Area C to Area B. Neither occurred.
- In 1993, there were 110,000 settlers living in the West Bank. Today, there are approximately 385,900 settlers in the West Bank.

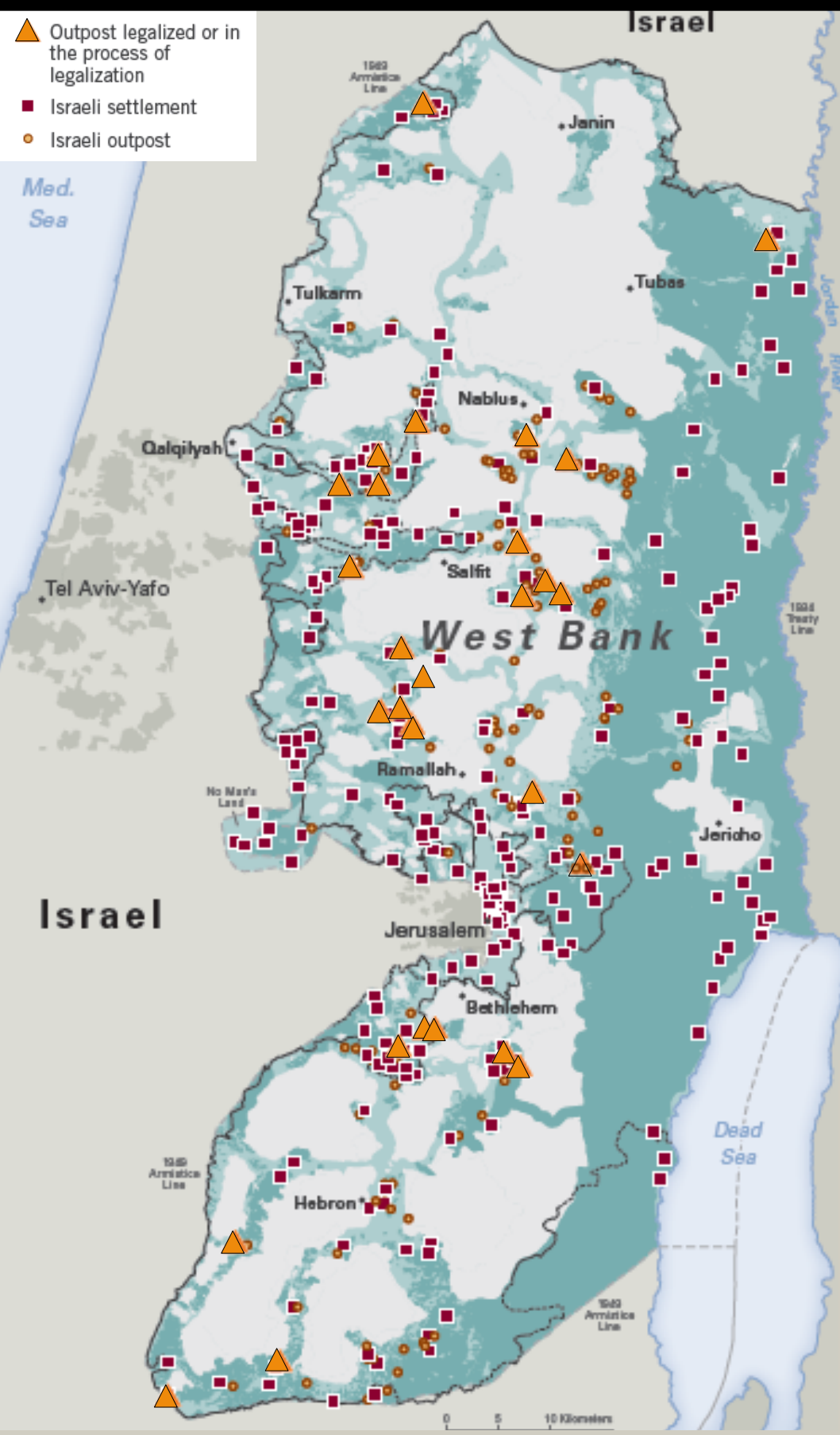
WEST BANK: Territory Breakdown



- 2.75 million Palestinians live in Areas A and B (40% of West Bank).
- 385,900 settlers live in Area C (60% of West Bank land).
- Area C effectively off limits for private Palestinian private development .
- 70% of Area C designated by Israel as state land and/or included within boundaries of regional settlement councils, making it exclusively for Israeli use.
- Remaining 30% of Area C is restricted from Palestinian development because it requires Israeli permits which are rarely granted (1 in all of 2014/15).

WEST BANK: Settlements and Outposts

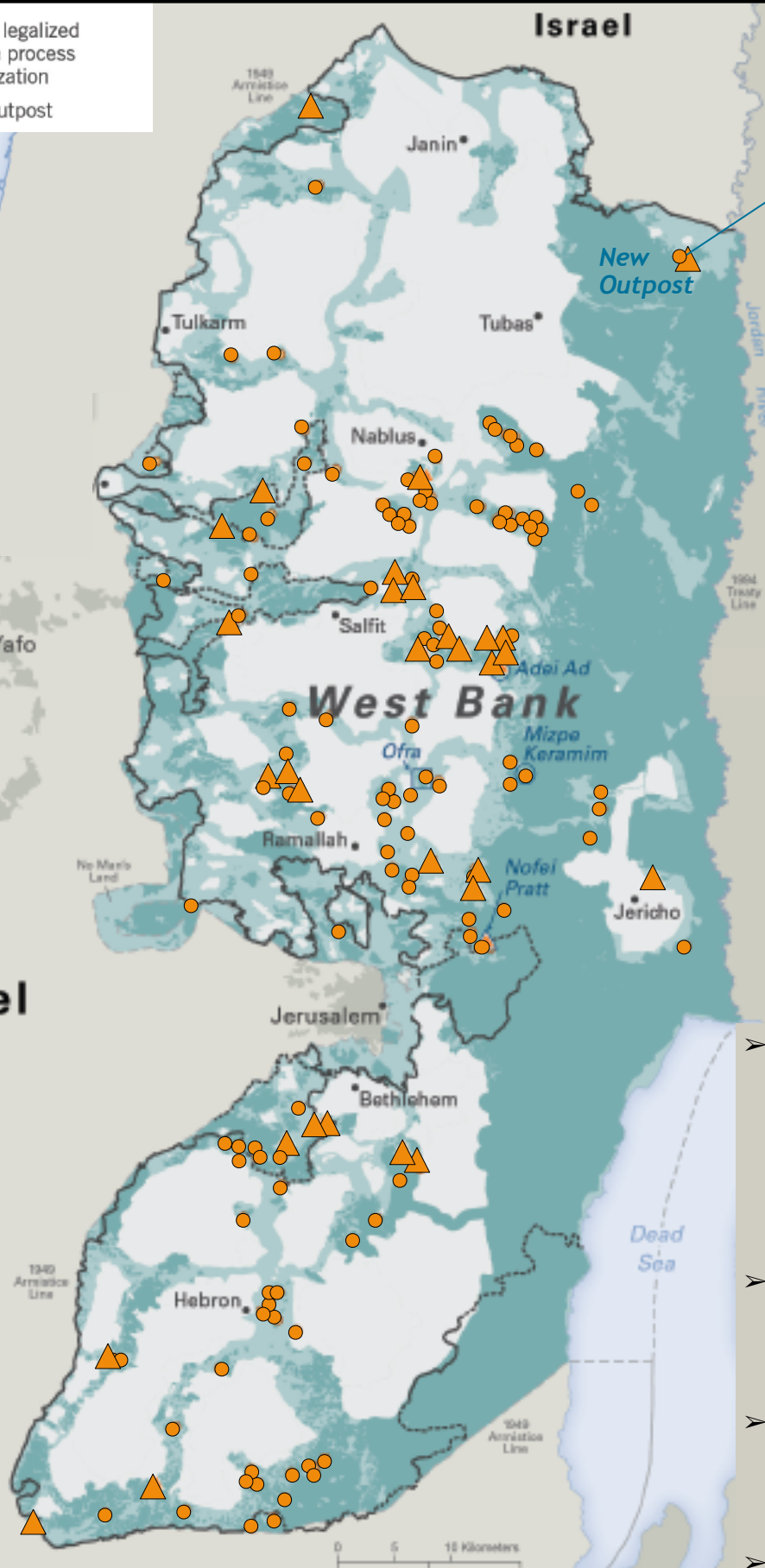

- 385,900 settlers live in 129 settlements and more than 100 illegal outposts.
- 89,000 settlers live east of the separation barrier.
- 79 of the settlements are east of the barrier.
- Sharon Bush letter committed to dismantling all post 2001 outposts.
- Since 2011, 19 outposts have been retroactively legalized and 13 are in the process of being legalized.
- GOI has spent at least \$280 million annually on West Bank settlements in recent years.

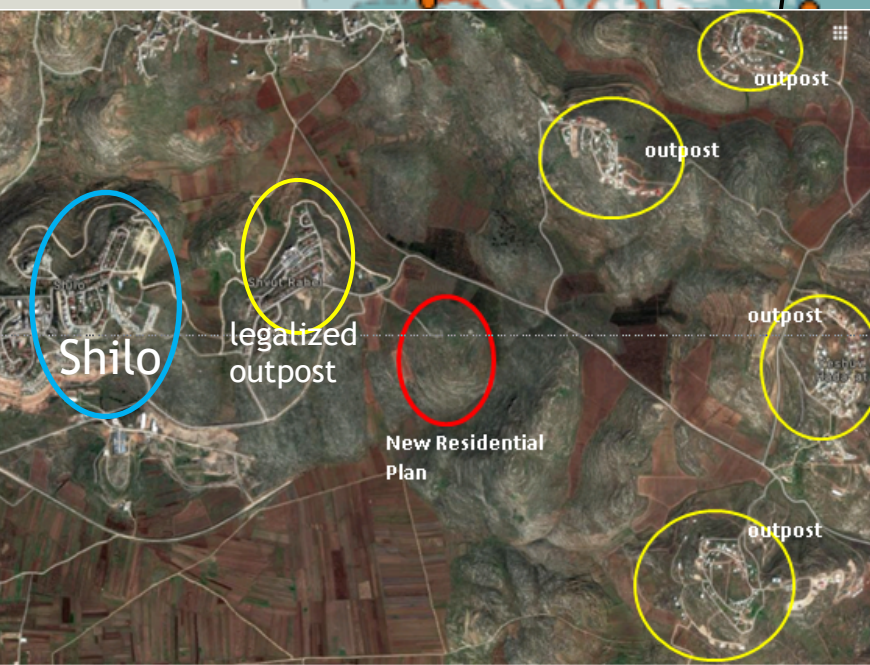
- Pending legislation would legalize 54 additional outposts east of separation barrier, including on private Palestinian land for 1st time.
- Nearly 4,000 unauthorized units would be legalized, and at least 8,000 dunams of private land taken.
- Illegal construction in the outposts has since increased by 30% since 2011.
- In 2015, 265 new units

WEST BANK: Amona and New Settlement Plan



Illegal Outpost of Amona:

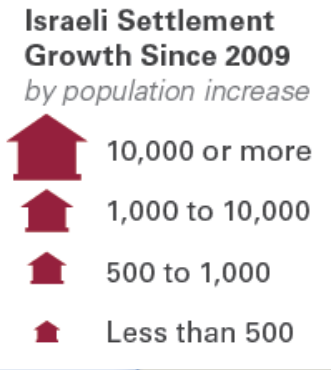
- Established 1994 without permit on private Palestinian land.
- Court ordered demolition of all 41 units by end of 2016.



New Settlement Plan 9/16:

- 300 permanent units authorized for relocation of Amona residents.
- Located 1.4k from Shilo, between a recently legalized outpost and four in process.
- Closer to Jordan than Israel

WEST BANK: Israeli Settlement Population Growth Since 2009



- From 2009 through 2015, the number of settlers living in the West Bank increased by over 104,000.
- The settler population east of the barrier increased by over 21,000 settlers.
- The population growth rate in the settlements has been double the rate of inside Israel.

WEST BANK: Israeli Construction Starts Since 2013

Israeli Construction Starts Since 2013



- From 2013-2015, construction began on approx. 5,500 settlement units.
- In the same period, plans were advanced for about 11,500 West Bank settlement units, including approx. 4,000 units east of the barrier.
- Tenders were published for approx. 4,700 units, including approx. 500 units east of the barrier.

WEST BANK: Sites of Violent Incidents

X Location of Violent Incident

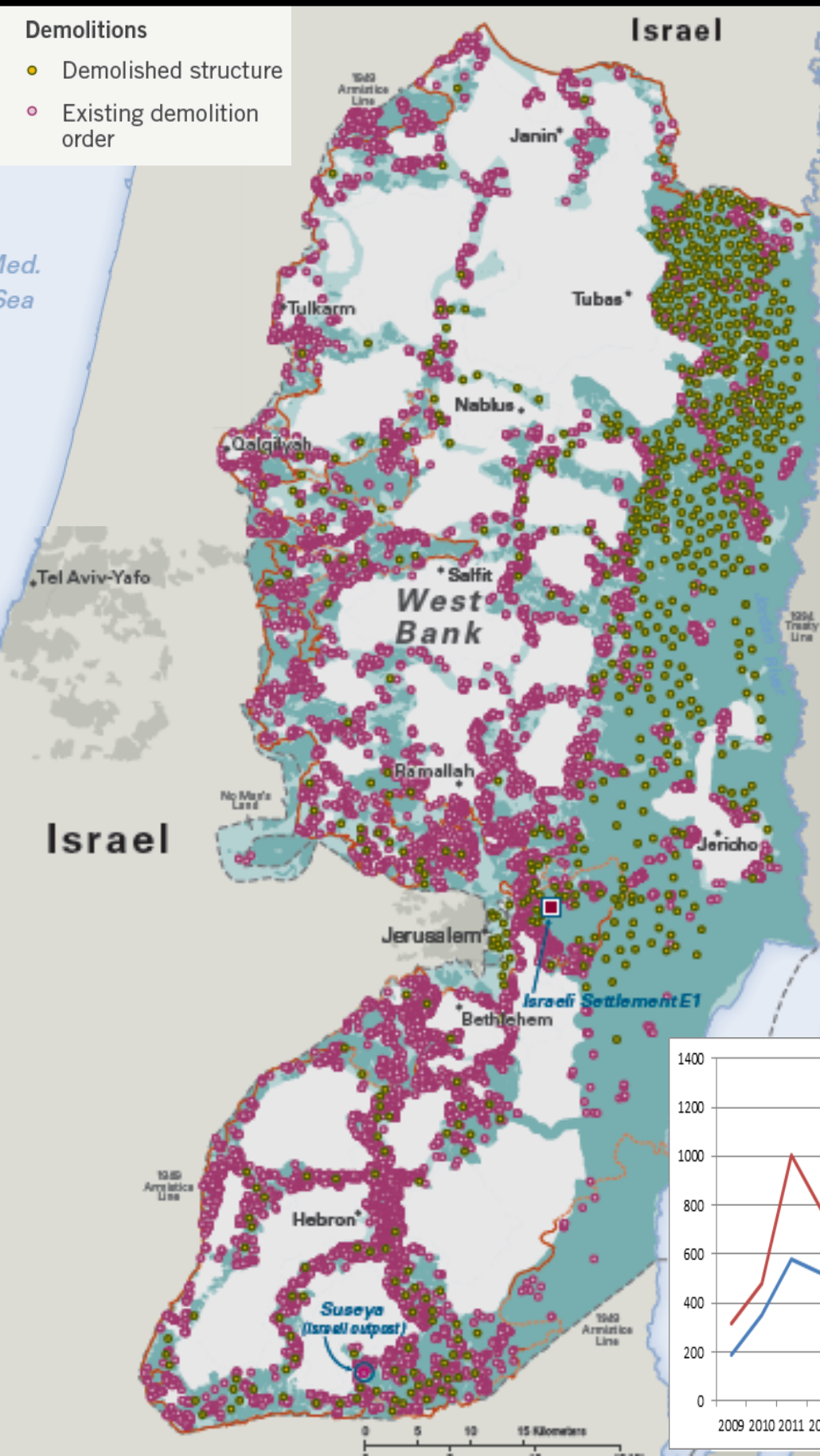


- Since 2009, there have been thousands of violent incidents between Israelis and Palestinians in Area C., including violent demonstrations, assaults and recent terrorist attacks.
- Most have occurred repeatedly in areas where Israelis and Palestinians live in close proximity.
- Israelis and Palestinians in the West Bank live under separate laws: IDF military law applies to Palestinians and Israeli civilian law applies to settlers.

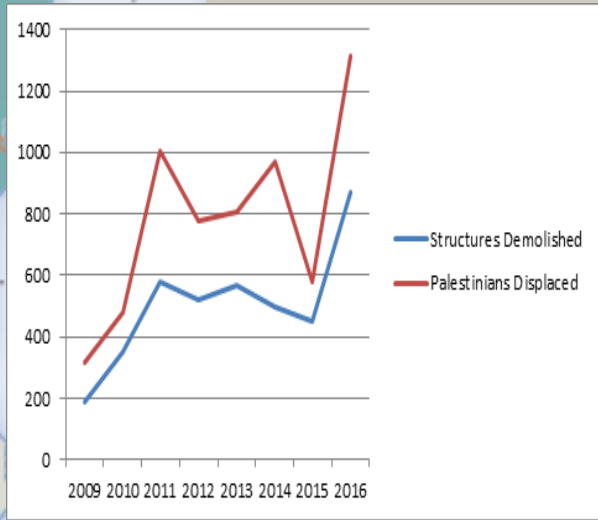
WEST BANK: Demolitions in Area C

Demolitions

- Demolished structure
- Existing demolition order



- From 2009 to November 2016, 4,072 Palestinian structures have been demolished, and 6,360 Palestinians were displaced.
- There are more than 13,000 pending demolition orders against Palestinian structures, 77% of which are for structures on private Palestinian land.
- Every structure built since 1967 is subject to demolition unless it has an Israeli permit, which are rarely granted (1 in 2014/15).
- In 2016, the pace of demolitions has accelerated dramatically, with 875 structures destroyed and 1,300 displaced.

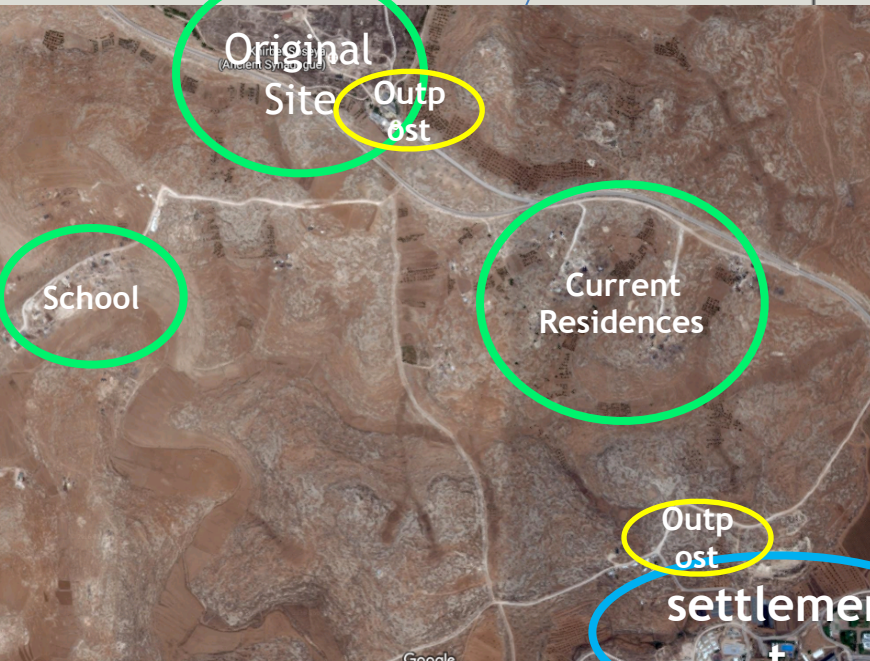
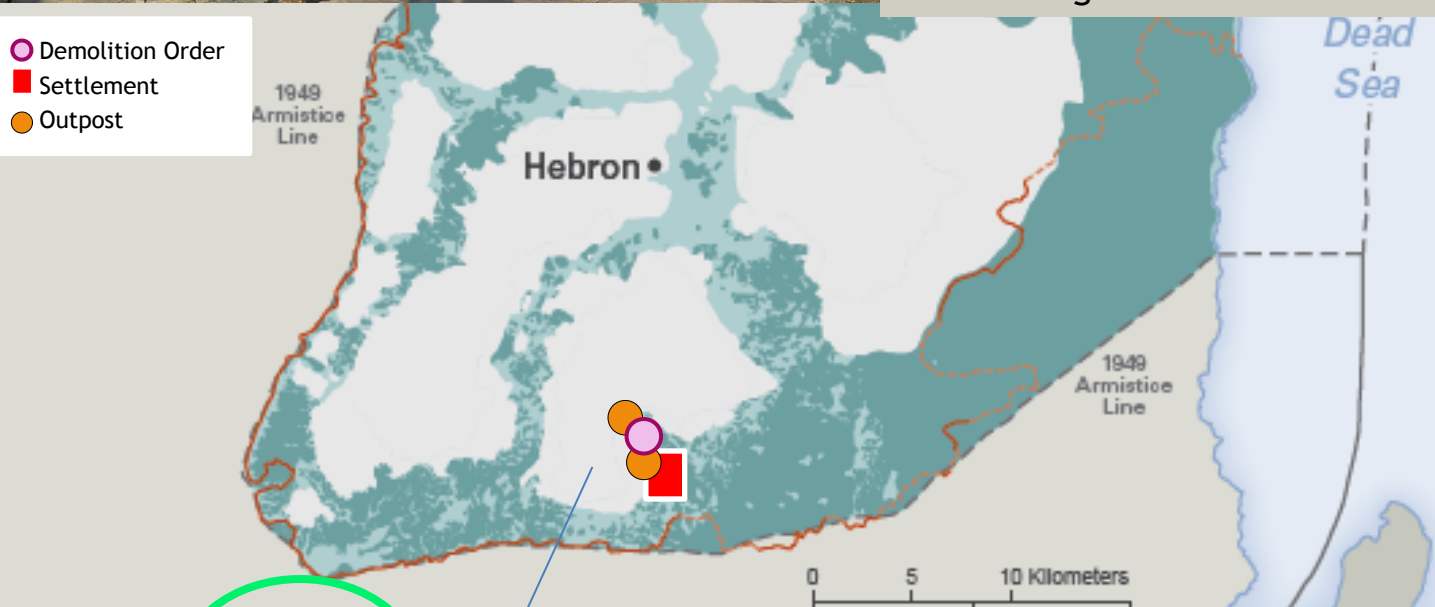


WEST BANK: Susiya Demolition



Susiya:

- Records show original village of Susiya was built before 1917 on private Palestinian land.
- An Israeli settlement by the same name was established nearby in 1983.
- IDF first evicted over 300 from Susiya to clear archeological site in 1986.



- IDF demolished the village again in 1991, 2001, 2011.
- Illegal Israeli outposts built on original site and near Israeli settlement of Susiya.
- Israel has repeatedly rejected building permits for Palestinians in Susiya.
- All current structures have pending demolition orders, impacting 250 residents.

WEST BANK: Recent Settlement Actions and Demolitions



- In 2015, the settler population increased by 15,000, including over 3,000 east of the barrier .
- From 6/15 -6/16 construction started on over 2,000 West Bank settlement units.
- In the first half of 2016, construction starts were up 17% in the West Bank.
- In 2016, plans advanced for over 2,600 settlement units
- In 2016, 875 Palestinian structures demolished, displacing over 1,300 people.

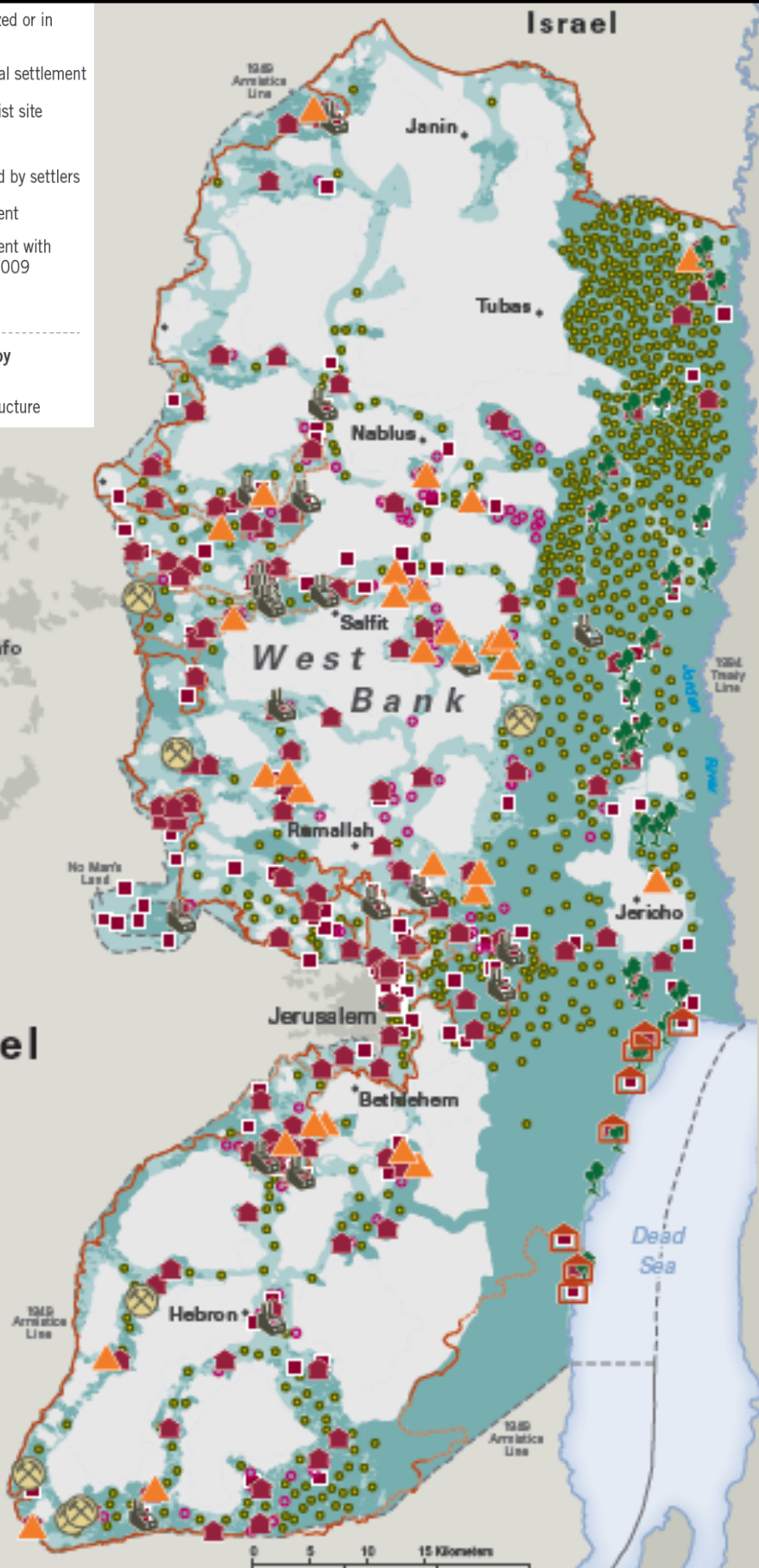


- Israeli economic activity in parts of the West Bank that are off-limits to the Palestinians generates billions of dollars annually for Israel's economy.
- 15 Israeli industrial settlements generate \$1 billion in manufacturing output.
- 9 Israeli quarries yield 12 million tons of material, valued annually at \$900 million.
- More than 23,000 acres of agricultural land generate hundreds of millions of dollars in revenue for Israel.
- Israel also benefits economically from wineries, Dead Sea mineral extraction, and tourism sites in the West Bank.

- Instead of Israel transferring Area C to Palestinian control, there has been a systematic reversal of this process.
- 70% of Area C taken for exclusive Israeli use, settlements expanding and population growing outposts legalized and economic activity increasing.
- Virtually no Area C land transferred to Palestinian control in the past 20 years.
- Palestinians displaced, homes and agriculture destroyed.
- Palestinian growth prevented in the majority (60%) of West Bank land - only one permit issued in 2014/15.


WEST BANK: Palestinian Archipelago

- Areas A and B of the West Bank actually consist of **167 distinct areas** or “islands,” lacking geographic contiguity.
- Palestinians moving between A and B Areas face significant restrictions crossing through Israeli-controlled Area C.
- There are currently over 20 fixed Israeli checkpoints in the West Bank.
- On average, there are also over 100 “flying checkpoints” per week.
- In addition, over 500 road obstacles, including dirt mounds and road gates, significantly restrict movement.

WEST BANK: What a One State Reality Looks Like

 Area A and B

 Nature Preserve - No building

- As of December 2015, there are 6.335 million Jews in the area from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea, and 6.561 million non-Jews.
- In the combined areas of Israel, Jerusalem, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip, Jews no longer represent the majority.
