Thanks for your help in completing this file.

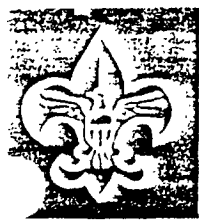

# Say: French government cares, but U.S. doesn't

BATAVIA (AP) — If the French government can get its Middle East hostages released, the U.S. government should be able to do the same, said Peggy Say, the sister of captive American journalist Terry Anderson.

"I hope they pursue whatever channels the French used, but I doubt they will," Say said Thursday. "It almost appears that the French government places a higher priority on the lives of their people."

Three French hostages, including one who said he was a cellmate of Anderson, were released Wednesday by their pro-Iranian captors. High-ranking officials of the French government apparently negotiated for their release.

U.S. Bankruptcy Judge George F. Bason Jr. found in INSLAW's favor and ordered the Justice Department to pay the company \$6.3 million after ruling that government officials engaged in "trickery, fraud and deceit" to steal the company's software. The department is appealing.

Conversion of the case from a Chapter 11 reorganization to a Chapter 7 liquidation would have put INSLAW out of business.

"What they are saying is that they know of no other solution to this situation than to let these men die," she said.

Anderson, chief Middle East correspondent for the Associated Press, has been held since March 16, 1985, the longest of any hostage.

One of the freed French hostages, Marcel Fontaine, said he was Anderson's cellmate and that he recently played chess and dominoes with him.

"It's good to know Terry is alive, but I'm afraid this doesn't necessarily mean anything will be forthcoming," Say said from her upstate New York home.

Earlier in the day Thursday, Mrs. Say said that the release of the

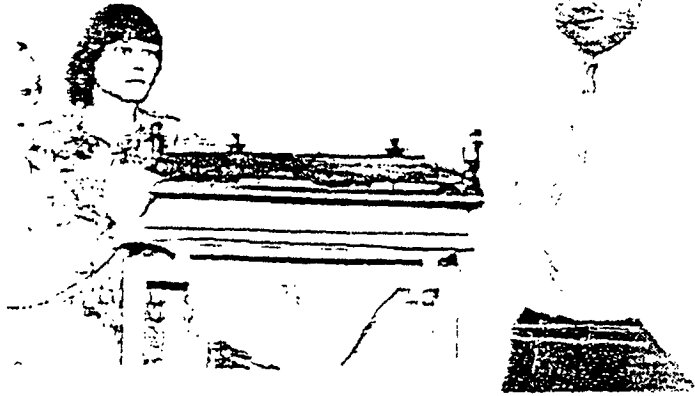

Justice Department's public section also is reviewing the sworn testimony of her federal bankruptcy judge Justice Department bankruptcy court judge involving INSLAW, to sources who spoke on of anonymity.

testimony dealt with INSLAW's allegations that Justice Department officials sought to put INSLAW out of business by unsuccessfully, to convert its bankruptcy reorganization to an liquidation.

Senior counsel James C. Meese is conducting a criminal investigation of Meese in several states, not probing the INSLAW bankruptcy refer information about Meese's integrity section. Meese is not conducting an in-

vestigation that the company's original lawyer, Leigh Ratiner, was fired from his Washington law firm after Meese discussed the case with Leonard Garment, a politically connected partner in the same firm.

The Justice Department acknowledged to INSLAW in pre-trial discovery that Meese recalled talking to Garment about the case in the fall of 1986.

Ratiner was soon asked to leave the law firm of Dickstein, Shapiro & Morin. INSLAW says in court papers that Ratiner was told Garment was instrumental in the decision to ask him to leave.

Garment called the allegation "pure baloney" but acknowledged that he was questioned about it two months ago by public-integrity investigators. The current status of the Meese investigation could not immediately be determined.

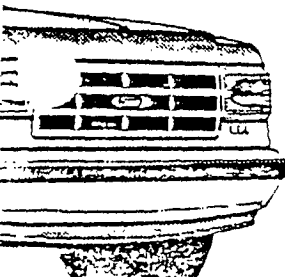
