Any and all records concerning the U.S. Marshals Service Southeast Regional Task Force (SERTF) Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), Directives, rules, or procedures regarding the following: 1. Any required Oath of Office or similar sworn statement required and/or taken by U.S. Marshals; 2. How members of the USMS, or a group of law enforcement agents or officers working with USMS, or a task force in which USMS members participate are to enter a dwelling belonging to the subject of an arrest warrant or a dwelling belonging to a third party without a search warrant; 3. The procedure involved when the subject of an arrest warrant is known, alleged, or believed to be mentally ill, noting that the information regarding mental illness may be formally diagnosed or obtained anecdotally through some other means; 4. When USMS members are required to obtain a search warrant, including but not limited warrant procedures pursuant to Steagald v. United States, 451 U.S. 204 (1981); 5. The use of a "flash bang" or similar device (also known as a stun grenade or sound bomb), particularly in what instances such a device would be employed, when such a device would be deployed, and the size/quality/force selected for deployment; 6. The use of a "throwbot" or similar device used for robotic or remote reconnaissance, including when such devices are to be deployed and in what instances, how such devices are to be deployed, and the use and operation of any recording mechanism of any such device; 7. Report writing, reporting, or debriefing after an incident in which a death has occurred; 8. Moving a body within a crime scene; 9. Cooperation

with local law enforcement agencies; 10. Permitted and prohibited communication with fellow officers; USMS members, task force members or witnesses once a use of force incident occurs and a criminal investigation begins, including, but not limited to, arrest, confrontation, or shooting; 11. The types and calibers of weapons which may be used by USMS members or task force members; 12. The making, storing, protecting, and disclosing of any video or audio recordings made during any USMS operation, including operations involving cooperation between USMS and other law enforcement agencies; 13. Securing or "clearing" adjacent residences, properties or premises within a community in which an operation is undertaken in order to ensure the safety of surrounding residents or property; and 14. Any policies addressing contacting family members of the subject of an arrest. Furthermore, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. Section 552(a)(3)(B), please provide the requested information in an electronic format. Please note that 5 U.S.C. Section 552(a)(3)(B) states that an "agency shall provide the record in any form or format requested by the person if the record is readily reproducible by the agency in that form or format." If this request is denied in whole or part, please provide a justification for all exemptions by reference to the specific statutory code-section relied upon for said exemption. If any portion of this request is denied, please let this also serve as notice that the requester reserves the right to appeal any such denial.
