It was also decided that [redacted] another 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. employee at SEMA be interviewed due to the fact that [redacted] is a known friend of [redacted] and has reportedly contacted [redacted] on a social basis from time to time. [redacted] is a Nigerian male who is a licensed physician in Nigeria. However, as of this writing, is not yet licensed in the United States however is being considered for candidacy at the Georgetown University Medical Center as a Gynecologist.

On March 5, 1987 [redacted] National Association of Bio-Medical Research, was contacted for any information she could provide regarding the activities of known animal rights groups in the greater Washington Metropolitan area. [redacted] advised that, as the most prominent, non-profit national pro-research organization in the United States, her office maintains a large intelligence file on the activities of most of the significant animal rights groups in the world. [redacted] furnished the FBI with many documents which deal with these groups as well as outline their significant activities dating back to 1976. [redacted] advised that she will continue to forward pertinent information to the FBI as it relates to PETA and other animal rights groups should it come to her attention. [redacted] stated that she had no specific information regarding the SEMA break-in but that her office continues to monitor the activities of PETA and the group known as "TRUE FRIENDS".

On March 10, 1987, [redacted] SEMA, INC., telephone number [redacted] contacted the FBI and stated that the United States Department of Agricultural (USDA) regularly inspects the SEMA facility for compliance purposes based on the fact that the National Institutes of Health (NIH) gives SEMA over one million dollars a year to perform experimental research on laboratory animals. The facilities and actual experimentation, therefore, falls under the purview of the USDA. The last inspection took place on February 5, 1987 and no specific discrepancies were noted by USDA. However, [redacted] [redacted] advised that on March 3, 1987, an expired bottle of medicine was found exposed in a medicine cabinet that had been previously inspected by SEMA employees and found to contain all current medicine. [redacted] explained that he felt that there was a PETA sympathizer still employed at SEMA and that this bottle of expired medicine was planted there to discredit SEMA. [redacted] advised that, per procedure, all expired medicines are disposed of immediately and that this particular bottle of medicine (expired in 1984) would have had to have been either brought in or previously concealed at SEMA in order to be utilized as described above.

On March 23, 1987, [redacted] (supra), was contacted for any additional information he could furnish regarding the activities on his shift with [redacted] on December 6, 1986. It has previously been determined from [redacted] had been employed on December 6, 1986 and therefore served his first shift the night of the burglary. [redacted] was fired from SEMA on January 11, 1987 for what [redacted] described as unsatisfactory performance. [redacted] advised writer that he had no idea as to why he was terminated but stated that it had nothing to do with the break-in on December 6, 1986. He did state however that he met with [redacted] upon reporting to work that night and [redacted] instructed him to [redacted] in the other side of the building from where most of the primates are caged. [redacted] complied with this and stated that for the remainder of the shift never saw or heard anything that transpired on the otherside of the building.

On March 24, 1987, [redacted] male [redacted] date of birth [redacted] Gaithersburg, Maryland, [redacted] was contacted regarding any knowledge he may have concerning the theft of the four chimpanzees on December 6, 1986. [redacted] advised that he has been employed at SEMA for [redacted] months in the capacity of [redacted] and has maintained what he describes as a high level of productivity during that period of employment. He advised that [redacted] He states that he feels it somewhat demeaning to work [redacted] He states that he does know [redacted] but only as a former fellow employee at SEMA. [redacted] stated that he works the [redacted] p.m. to [redacted] shift Monday through Friday and therefore never worked with [redacted] who worked only on weekends during the 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. shift. He stated that he has not contacted [redacted] since November of 1986 and does not even know where [redacted] lives at this time. He stated that he has no idea as to whether or not [redacted] was involved in the theft of the chimpanzees, and, prior to the theft, did not know that [redacted] was a PETA member. [redacted] stated that his immigration status in the United States is that of Permanent Resident Alien and he has a Social Security Number of [redacted] advised that he will contact the FBI at a later date should any pertinent information regarding this incident come to his attention.
