deference is made to my memorandum to you dated December 31, 1943, instructing you to institute a vigorous investigation of this woman in an effort to determine if she is still engaged in activities as a Soviet Espionage Agent. The following additional information is being submitted to you which should be the subject of immediate and exhaustive investigative attention. The person who recruited Sime, (Judith Coplon), was one Tora (code name), who, in December 1944, was apparently working for the Government and was considering transferring to the State Department, 033 or some other analogous agency. It was stated that the agency where Zora was employed would cease its independent operation in one half year. Another message mentions her mother and stepfather who were listed as having been active in the progressive movement, apparently meaning the Communist movement. An immediate attempt should be made through appropriate sources to determine what agency or agencies intended to cease independent operations 6 months after December, 1944. In the investigation of Judith Coplon's momen associates, consideration should be given to determining that Government agencies they have been employed by and whether any has a stepfather, which you realize is the only identifying information we have concerning fora. You will also note, however, that Judith Coplon was living in New York City prior to her transfer to Washington, D. C. Therefore, it might be assumed that lora was also working for a Government agency in New York City although this is not con- b6 clusive.
