It is reported that he learned in May of 1945, subject's brother, Jacob Levy Civan had met an individual whom he thought "looks like a Russian general" and was considering entering into some business relationship with him. Subject advised against it unless the individual would be willing to put up \$5,000 for a survey of the Mexican situation. It is thought that the person discussed was Joe Pikker (phonetic) or Joe Packer. Later Civan entered the country having in his possession five packages of \$1,000 each in \$20 bills. It is noted that this denomination has frequently been used in Soviet espionage payoffs.
