On 10-03-16 at 0016 hours, I responded to 1821 Lacey Street, to assist Officers McIrvin #1043 and Burdick #1223, with a weapon brandishing investigation. I responded to the call, after medical aid was requested for the suspect, JOSE VILORIO. Force had to be used, to take VILORIO into custody, and he was ultimately transported to San Joaquin Hospital, with symptoms that appeared to indicate he had a heart attack. At the time of this report, he remains there for treatment. Sergeants Toler #924 and Galland #1027 were advised and responded to the scene.

Upon arrival, I contacted , who were sitting on the sidewalk, to the front of the residence. daughter, 1 % year old was with her. Interviews I conducted were digitally recorded and submitted to DIMS.

stated she came to the location to spend the night, after getting into an argument, with her boyfriend. Stated she arrived at around 8 PM and was allowed to stay, by her friend who lives there, stated shortly after arriving, an additional roommate, came out of his room and accused she and of something, by telling them, "I know what you did!" stated this was the first time she had been inside the location and she was confused by this, because she had never met

stated she and went into the northwest bedroom, which belongs to another resident of the house, where they stayed until around 11 PM. Stated she walked back into the living room and found her diaper bag had been gone through, and she was now missing the following items:

- 1) Samsung Galaxy "On 5" cell phone, w/black plastic cover that has gray rubber edges (805)422-9644
- 2) Alcatel One cell phone, w/leaves and flower sticker on the back, black in color (661)546-4560
- 3) Portable cell phone charger, hot pink in color
- , 1) California Advantage EBT card, in the name

stated she also discovered cell phone had been stolen, from the living room, after he told her it was also missing. Stated she borrowed phone, which they used to call missing comphone, which they heard ringing inside bedroom (the southeast bedroom). This bedroom is an add-on room, which is accessed from the interior of the house, by a set of sliding closet doors, for a closet the was previously where the room now is. Stated she and knocked the sliding doors of VILORIO's room, which caused the wood door to fall because it was previously damaged and put back together.	and ell hat on
Stated she stepped into the doorway of the bedroom, to confront VILORIO about stealing her phone, he was holding a large machete in his hand. Stated VILORIO told her, "I'm gonna chop your head off, if y get any closer!" Stated VILORIO swung the blade of the machete at neck, in a slicing motion, which she demonstrated, with her hands. Stated VILORIO missed cutting her throat, by a few inches, with the tip he blade. Stated VILORIO swung the knife at her throat, two times pefore she backed away. Stated she borrowed phone, which so used to call 911, after she and exited the front of the house, wi her daughter. Stated after waiting to the front of the location, for about 15 minutes, Officers McIrvin and Burdick arrived and pointed out where VILORIO's room was, in the house. Stated she told the officers about the theft, and about how VILORIO had swung the machete, her throat, before they entered the front door of the house.	her  of  he  th  or  d
stated she and remained outside, until being contacted by me stated she did not hear or see officers using force on VILORIO, no did she hear or see any signs of a struggle occurring, from her position outside the residence.	r
was primarily Spanish speaking. Igreed to translate his statement for me, after I advised her only to relay the questions I ask to him, and to tell me only the answers provided, when answering. Stated at around 7 PM, before arrived, he was watching TV, when he heard the piece of wood that is attached to the sliding door of VILORIO's bedroom fall onto the ground. Stated this caused VILORIO wake up, before calling him stupid, and accusing him of knocking over the piece of wood. Stated VILORIO went back into his room.	hen to
stated after RUIZ arrived, they hung out in bedroom, unti	1




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stated VILORIO had lived at the residence, for about a year, and was a former security guard. Stated VILORIO had not been working, since he fell, in the Vallarta parking lot, at work, and injured his back. Stated there had been issues, between VILORIO and another roommate, in the past. Stated VILORIO once pointed a Taser at when they were arguing. Described VILORIO as being angry and said he was the one roommate in the house who kept to himself, and was not considered a friend to anyone.

stated he did not witness VILORIO brandish a weapon, or assault I with the machete, but she and told him about it, afterwards, when they asked to use his phone to call 911. Stated when and went outside, he walked to the front door and stood on the front step, outside. Stated he heard what he described as the sound of someone throwing items onto the ground, coming from the east side yard, of the house, somewhere near the block wall. The side yard area can be accessed from VILIRIO's room, via an east facing exit door. Stated he heard items strike the ground, two to three times, which led him to believe this was VILORIO discarding the stolen cell phones and other items he took.

stated when Officers McIrvin and Burdick arrived, they announced their presence, before entering the front door of the house. Stated officers ordered anyone in the house to come into the living room, with their hands up, but they soon realized he was not the subject with the machete, after he began to direct them to VILORIO's bedroom. Stated he did not witness a use of force and went back to his bedroom, when

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officers went to contact VILORIO. stated he only heard VILORIO telling someone to stop hitting him, which was followed by VILORIO stating either "Jesus" or "God". I asked to clarify this for me, by telling me the manner in which these things were said. I began by obtaining identifying information. I also obtained her cellular phone numbers for her two phones. The first number she provided was She described this phone as a Samsung Galaxy On5, black phone with a black/gray case. The second phone was She described this phone as an Alcatell government phone, black with a pink cord attaching it to a pink portable charger. Confirmed that both of these phone had been stolen from her.
I asked of the people she knew in regards to this incident. She said she is a co-worker of the people she knew in regards to this he said they work together at Vignolo arms, picking grapes. She said she has worked for that company for about six months and she met through work. She said she does not know the names of anyone else involved in this incident.
I asked what her relationship was with She told me they are just friends. She said she has a boyfriend. She then mentioned that she had a fight with her boyfriend and she came to residence to get away from the incident occurring with her boyfriend said she left her apartment at about 1900 hours, along with her child, She said she began texting and talking with She said she took a taxicab to residence, arriving at about 2000 or 2030 hours.
said she and began watching television in the living room to his residence. While they were watching television 'the man' (JOSE VILORIO) came out and was yelling "I know you guys did it". She described that he came out from his bedroom. She said she had no idea what he was talking about. She said JOSE VILARIO was talking in Spanish. She said she speaks both Spanish and English.  said this occurred for about five minutes before JOSE VILORIO left and returned to his room. She said they continued watching television.

On 10-3-16, at 0811 hours, Detective Burich and I entered the Investigations Interview room along with Officer Zachary Burdick #1223, in order to obtain his statement in regards to this incident. I utilized my digital recorder to record the interview with Officer Burdick. Officer Burdick was aware that the interview was being recorded. The recording was later downloaded into DIMS. The following is a summary of the interview, refer to the recording for further details.

I began by thanking Officer Burdick for agreeing to be interviewed. I confirmed with him that he declined to have either an attorney present or a Union representative. Officer Burdick advised he wished to provide a voluntary statement, without an attorney or Union representative present. I explained to Officer Burdick that he could stop the interview at any time to seek counsel if he wished.

Officer Burdick told me his date of hire with the Bakersfield Police Department was in March of 2014. He does not have any prior police experience. His call sign at the time of this incident was 1V4. He was assigned as a two officer unit with his partner, Officer Timothy McIrvin. He advised they were operating Officer McIrvin's patrol behicle, #5719. Officer Burdick was the passenger in the patrol vehicle.

Officer Burdick advised he was not injured and he did not need any medical attention. He added that he did not have any scrapes or scratches on him. I asked Officer Burdick if he had consumed any intoxicants today, he stated he had not consumed any intoxicants. He advised he does not take any prescription medications. I noted that he was not displaying any signs of being under the influence of any intoxicants.

I asked Officer Burdick to stand up, in order for me to better view him, to obtain a description of his uniform. He was wearing the same uniform and equipment that he had been wearing at the time of this incident. I noted that Officer Burdick was wearing a Class 'B', short sleeve standard Bakersfield Police Department uniform with department patches on each outer sleeve. He advised his uniform was an Elbeco brand uniform. I noted his uniform had his department issued badge, #1223 on his left chest. He had a gold nameplate on his right chest with his name 'Z. Burdick'. I then made a note of everything on Officer Burdick's duty belt, starting with his open top double magazine pouch, with two magazines inside. To the left (his left) of the magazine pouch and continuing around his body were the following items, a 'Peacekeeper' brand baton and holder, flashlight with holder, taser X26 with holster, taser serial # X130030PY, department issued radio with holder, to Officer Burdick's back were two belt keepers, to the right rear of his body was a pepper spray holder with pepper spray inside, right side of his body was his duty firearm, a Glock model 17, 9mm, Gen IV, Serial #XTC505, with an attached flashlight, to the right front of his body was a key holder, then a double handcuff case. I noted he had a 'Tops' brand folding pocket knife in his right rear pants pocket. In his left side cargo pocket, he had a backup firearm, a Smith and Wesson .38 revolver, Serial #CYA0839. I also noted he was wearing black uniform boots, 11 brand. He advised he was wearing a hobble on his right ankle and he had a tourniquet in his right side cargo



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pocket. I noted he was wearing body armor. He advised he does not wear contacts or glasses. He was not wearing sunglasses during this incident. He advised that the Crime Lab had already taken his picture to document his uniform and equipment.

I explained to Officer Burdick that I was going to allow him to provide his initial statement, uninterrupted. I asked him to provide me with as much detail as possible, starting from the first radio traffic regarding the call for service, up until the conclusion of the call. I did not speak or ask any questions during this initial statement made by Officer Burdick.

Officer Burdick stated he could not recall the exact time, but said it was close to midnight. He advised he and Officer McIrvin were in their patrol car, with Officer McIrvin the driver of the vehicle. He said they received a priority 1 call of a '417' with a machete. He advised he could not recall the exact details of the initial call. He said they were in the area of Planz Rd and S. H Street when the call was initiated. He said they responded to the call on Lacey Street. He could not recall the exact address. He remembered that they drove past the residence, because he saw two subjects, a male and a female, along with a stroller, were to the front of the house. He advised they were just west of the residence. He said they made contact with these subjects and learned they were the reporting parties.

The reporting party told him that the subject with the machete was still inside the residence. They added that there were possibly three other subjects still inside the residence. He said they obtained a description of the subject with the machete, adding that they only obtained a clothing description, blue shirt and gray shorts. They advised the reporting parties to remain outside the residence while they entered the residence. He said they approached the east side, side door, to the residence. They noted that the side door was ajar when they approached the door. He said Officer McIrvin announced "Police!" one time. He said Officer McIrvin attempted to push open the door but realized something was partially blocking the door from the inside. Officer Burdick said Officer McIrvin kicked the door, pushing the door open, without causing any damage to the door or the frame.

Officer Burdick said that he and Officer McIrvin entered the residence, with their duty firearms drawn. He said they saw a subject sitting inside the room, to their left (this was later determined to be JOSE VILORIO). This subject was sitting on a rear seat from either a truck or an SUV. He said there was a table in front of the subject and the subject was writing something. Officer Burdick said this subject was not wearing the same clothing described by the reporting party (later determined to be He said the subject was wearing a gray long sleeve shirt. Officer Burdick said they asked JOSE VILORIO if he was involved and if he was okay. He seemed calm and did not appear to be the person involved in this incident. He recalled that although they asked JOSE VILORIO questions, he did not seem to respond.

Officer Burdick said he and Officer McIrvin bypassed JOSE VILORIO and entered the main portion of the residence to look for the involved parties. He said the kitchen and living room areas were empty, nobody was located in those areas. They moved towards the hallway and announced their presence. He said a subject (later identified as exited one of the rear bedrooms and approached them. He said they began to escort this subject outside, towards the front door, when the front door was opened from someone outside of the



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residence. He advised the reporting parties,	were standing just outside
the front door. He said they were told again to stay outside.	was told to exit the residence.

Officer Burdick said the reporting parties told him that the involved person was the person in the first room they had entered, JOSE VILORIO. He advised they were able to see JOSE VILORIO from their location and they pointed at him and said "that's him". Officer Burdick said they again told everyone to wait outside.

Officer Burdick said he and Officer McIrvin entered back into JOSE VILORIO's bedroom. Officer Burdick said Officer McIrvin asked JOSE VILORIO to stand up. He said it appeared there may have been a language barrier. He then added that JOSE VILORIO was possibly pretending there was a language barrier. He said the subject did stand up after being told to do so. He said Officer McIrvin approached JOSE VILORIO to detain him, at which time JOSE VILORIO sat back onto the bench seat. Officer Burdick advised he could not see the seat where JOSE VILORIO was sitting, due to the table to the front of the seat. He said it appeared that Officer McIrvin saw something that concerned him, at which time he reached forward to grab JOSE VILORIO by his left arm. Officer Burdick saw JOSE VILORIO reaching back for something, with his right hand. JOSE VILORIO then began to pull away from Officer McIrvin and Officer McIrvin appeared to struggle with maintaining control of JOSE VILORIO. Officer McIrvin then punched JOSE VILORIO on his face, about 8 to 12 times, in an attempt to gain compliance from JOSE VILORIO. Officer Burdick said he approached JOSE VILORIO at this time and attempted to take hold of his right arm, to assist with taking him into custody. When Officer Burdick took hold of JOSE VILORIO's right arm, he looked down and saw a machete, about two feet long, under JOSE VILORIO's lower body.

Officer Burdick said he yelled out that there was a machete. He said he assumed Officer McIrvin had observed the machete, but he wanted to ensure he was also aware of the machete's presence. Officer Burdick said that Officer McIrvin then placed a carotid control hold on JOSE VILORIO, in order to effect his arrest. Officer Burdick advised that while Officer McIrvin was applying the carotid control hold, he was able to reach down and take control of the machete, from the chair. He said he placed the machete on a table, just out of reach of JOSE VILIRIO.

Officer Burdick advised that Officer McIrvin applied the carotid control hold for about 10 to 15 seconds, at which time JOSE VILORIO lost consciousness. When JOSE VILORIO lost consciousness, Officer Burdick handcuffed him, to the front of his body. He said they then laid JOSE VILORIO onto the ground.

Officer Burdick said it was about 10 to 15 seconds later that they realized JOSE VILORIO was not breathing. Officer Burdick said he began providing chest compressions to JOSE VILORIO. While he was doing so, Officer McIrvin used his radio to request medical aide and he asked for a sergeant to respond. Officer Burdick advised he continued administering chest compressions for about three minutes, at which time Officer McIrvin took over until medical aide arrived on scene.

At this point in the interview, I began asking Officer Burdick questions to clarify certain details of this incident. I began by asking him about medical attention provided to JOSE VILORIO. He again said that Officer McIrvin continued performing chest compressions, until he was relieved by medical personnel. Hall Ambulance personnel

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did continue providing medical aide once Officer McIrvin stopped. He believed they used a breathing apparatus and continued providing chest compressions. Officer Burdick advised he was escorted out of the room shortly after Hall Ambulance personnel took over, preventing him from seeing what other medical attention was provided to JOSE VILORIO.

Officer Burdick advised it was Sergeant Galland who escorted him from the room.

I asked Officer Burdick what actions he took after Officer McIrvin took over the CPR from him. He advised he moved a table out of the room to provide room for medical aide to enter the room. He said he did not perform any other actions before additional officers arrived.

Officer Burdick advised Officer Skidmore was the next officer to respond. Officer Malley arrived shortly after that, along with Sergeant Galland shortly after that. He advised all of the additional officers entered the residence through that same side door that he entered the residence through. Officer Burdick advised that Senior Officer Galvan also responded to the scene and he was the officer who escorted Officer Burdick back to the station and stayed with him up until I contacted him for this interview.

I asked Officer Burdick if he was in service at the time of this call, or if he responded since he was close by. He advised he had been headed to a different call, but they were preempted from that call to respond to this call. I asked Officer Burdick if he was able to read any additional details about this call on his computer prior to arriving at the call, or if he only obtained the call information from the radio. He advised he did have time to read the call, but he could not recall what the details were. He said there may have been a description of the subject in the call, but he could not remember what the description was.

I asked Officer Burdick if there were any additional people out on the street when he arrived in the area. He did not recall seeing anyone, other than the reporting parties. I asked about the lighting conditions in the neighborhood and at the residence. He said there were street lights in the area, but said he used his flashlight for additional illumination. He said there was a porch light on at the residence when they arrived. I asked about the lighting when they entered the residence, into JOSE VILORIO's room. He said he believed there was a lamp on inside the room.

I asked Officer Burdick to describe where the couch or vehicle seat that JOSE VILORIO was sitting at was located within the room. He said the table was to the left or south as you entered the room. He said the table was sitting in front of him. He described the table as being rectangular and small.

Officer Burdick advised that Officer McIrvin entered the residence first. He said Officer McIrvin's focus was to the left, where JOSE VILORIO was sitting, and his focus was to the right, towards the main portion of the residence.

I asked Officer Burdick if he recalled what Officer McIrvin said to JOSE VILORIO when they first entered the residence. He said he could not recall exactly was said, but said it was to the effect of "are you okay?" and "where is the guy with the machete?" Officer Burdick said he was unsure what JOSE VILORIO's response was,



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adding that he may have been speaking Spanish, but he was uncertain. Officer Burdick advised he does not speak Spanish. He said he does not believe Officer McIrvin speaks Spanish.

I asked Officer Burdick how long he and Officer McIrvin were in JOSE VILORIO's room after they initially entered the residence. He said it was only for about 20 seconds. Officer Burdick said he did not see any obvious weapons in the room during that initial time he was in the room. I asked Officer Burdick if the table that he previously described that was in front of JOSE VILORIO prevented him from seeing the seat where JOSE VILORIO had been sitting. He said the table did obstruct his view.

I asked Officer Burdick about any commands or statements he and Officer McIrvin advised while inside the residence. He said that once they entered the main portion of the residence, they announced "Bakersfield Police!" He advised he walked into the kitchen area and Officer McIrvin entered the living room. He said they approached a hallway that leads to the bedrooms, at which time they announced again "Bakersfield Police!" He said that was when the subject exited one of the bedrooms and walked to them (MANUEL ORDAZ). He said they were approaching the front door when the door was opened from the outside. He said both of the reporting parties, were at the door when it opened. He said they primarily spoke with He believed she was translating for CARLOS LOPEZ.

Officer Burdick confirmed that it was who was at the front door and who pointed at JOSE I/ILORIO and stated that he was the person who had been in possession of the machete.

I asked Officer Burdick to describe to me again the events after he and Officer McIrvin went back into JOSE VILORIO's room. He said Officer McIrvin entered the room first and he ordered JOSE VILORIO to stand up and to keep his hands up. He said he believed JOSE VILORIO responded in Spanish, but he stood up when told to do so. Officer McIrvin approached JOSE VILORIO and Officer Burdick said he felt that Officer McIrvin must have seen something, based on his reaction. He said Officer McIrvin grabbed JOSE VILORIO's left arm, at which time JOSE VILORIO began pulling away. Officer McIrvin then began striking JOSE VILORIO in his face, with his fist. Officer Burdick advised he moved to JOSE VILORIO's right side to attempt to gain control of him. He described JOSE VILORIO as sitting, but leaning or lying towards his left. Officer Burdick said it was as he was trying to gain control of JOSE VILORIO's right arm that he saw the machete underneath him. He again estimated that Officer McIrvin punched JOSE VILORIO about 8 to 12 times in his face/head. Officer Burdick said that during this portion of the incident, he used his knee to strike JOSE VILORIO in the right side of his body, two times, in an effort to gain control of his right arm. Officer Burdick said it was at this time he announced the presence of the machete. He said this was when Officer McIrvin stopped punching JOSE VILORIO and he moved into position and applied the carotid control hold on him. Officer Burdick was then able to remove the machete. He placed the machete on a table. He said it was after about 10 to 15 seconds when JOSE VILORIO lost consciousness. He handcuffed him and Officer McIrvin placed him on the ground, on his right side. Officer Burdick said it was about 10 to 15 seconds later that they saw that JOSE VILORIO was not breathing, and he began to perform chest compressions on him.

I asked Officer Burdick when he and Officer McIrvin put up their firearms. He said Officer McIrvin put his have shortly after entering the room for the second time. Officer Burdick advised that due to the potential



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involvement of a machete in this incident, he kept his firearm out to cover Officer McIrvin. He said that when JOSE VILORIO stood up and he saw there was nothing in his hands, he holstered his firearm.

I asked Officer Burdick if he ever transitioned to another other weapons in his possession. He advised he did not use any other weapons.

I asked Officer Burdick if Officer McIrvin or JOSE VILORIO were saying anything while Officer McIrvin was striking JOSE VILORIO to attempt to gain compliance from him. Officer Burdick said Officer McIrvin said several times "give me your hands, give me your hands!" He said JOSE VILORIO was tensing his arms to the center of his body.

I asked Officer Burdick if the lighting conditions were the same inside the bedroom during the struggle. He advised the same lamp was on from when they first entered the residence, no additional lights were on.

I asked Officer Burdick if he heard JOSE VILORIO make any additional noises, other than speaking. He said he may have been speaking Spanish, but he could not understand.

Officer Burdick said he believed Officer McIrvin used his right arm to apply the carotid control hold onto JOSE VILORIO. Officer Burdick said he has been trained in the use of the carotid control hold and he said Officer McIrvin's use of the carotid control hold was consistent with the training he has received in the hold. I clarified that Officer McIrvin applied the carotid control hold for a total of 10 to 15 seconds. Officer Burdick said the hold was only applied for the 10 to 15 seconds, no longer.

I asked Officer Burdick again about the machete. He said he had moved the machete to a table nearby. He said the machete would still have been close enough for JOSE VILORIO to reach if he had been able to break out of the carotid control hold.

Officer Burdick said JOSE VILORIO did not have any visible marks on him before the struggle started. He said he was able to see that he had visible swelling to his face and there was some blood visible, but he was unsure if it was his blood or Officer McIrvin's.

Officer Burdick again said he provided CPR to JOSE VILORIO for about two to three minutes. He said he gave chest compressions only. He said he administered CPR in the manner he had been trained during CPR training provided by the department.

Officer Burdick said it was Officer McIrvin who requested medical aide for JOSE VILORIO. He said he was handcuffing JOSE VILORIO when Officer McIrvin called for medical aide. I asked Officer Burdick why he chose to handcuff JOSE VILORIO to the front of his body. He said he was aware that when the carotid control hold is used to render a subject unconscious, he knows the person may regain consciousness quickly. He also said that since JOSE VILORIO had a heavy build, he did not think he could have been handcuffed with only one pair of handcuffs.

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I asked Officer Burdick how he saw that JOSE VILORIO was not breathing. He said he and Officer McIrvin both saw that it appeared he was not breathing. He said he checked for a pulse on the left side of JOSE VILORIO's neck and did not locate a pulse. Officer Burdick advised he does not have any additional medical training, other than what has been provided through training at the Bakersfield Police Department.

Detective Burich asked several clarifying questions. He asked Officer Burdick to advise all of the statements made by anyone he came into contact with during this incident. Officer Burdick advised he approached the reporting parties and asked if they called the police. They advised they had called. He asked where the subject with the machete was located; they said he was still inside. He learned there were three more people inside. He said the male subject, made a gesture to the side entrance to the residence and he said something in Spanish to She told him they should enter the residence through the side entrance.

Officer Burdick advised they approached the side door to the residence. Officer McIrvin announced "police!" and he pushed the side door to the residence open. Officer Burdick advised there was an ironing board, a basket and a board or another door, blocking the side door, from inside the residence. Officer Burdick said Officer McIrvin had some conversation with JOSE VILORIO, while Officer Burdick focused on the main portion of the residence. He said he did not initially believe JOSE VILORIO was involved, because he expected to see someone who was agitated.

Officer Burdick said he and Officer McIrvin then directed their attention to the main portion of the residence. He told Officer McIrvin that he would clear the kitchen. Officer McIrvin walked into and cleared the living room. He heard Officer McIrvin announce "Bakersfield Police" while inside the residence. He said exited from one of the bedrooms and exited the residence. That was when said they had already passed the suspect, pointing out JOSE VILORIO and stating he was involved.

Officer Burdick said they then entered the room where JOSE VILORIO was located. Officer McIrvin gave several commands to JOSE VILORIO. Detective Burich asked Officer Burdick if it appeared that JOSE VILORIO understood what he was being told to do. He said JOSE VILORIO did comply and stand up when Officer McIrvin told him to do so. When Officer McIrvin asked JOSE VILORIO to come to him, he replied, but in Spanish. Officer Burdick said it appeared JOSE VILORIO understood what he was being told, but that he was unable to respond back in English.

Officer Burdick said the person who came out of the hallway prior to the confrontation, exited from the far right doorway bedroom).

We took a short break at this time.

When we returned from the break, I advised Officer Burdick I had a few clarifying questions.



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I asked Officer Burdick what happened to the machete after he placed it on the table. He said he believes he moved it to the floor or onto another object when he picked up the table to move it to another room. He could not recall what he placed the machete onto.

I asked Officer Burdick to describe the size of the room where this incident occurred. He advised it was about 10 to 12 feet wide and 15 to 17 feet long. He said there was furniture inside the room, and recalled that the center space of the room was fairly small. I asked him what happened to the items that had been pushed out of the way by Officer McIrvin when they first entered the residence. He said these items were in the same location, but said they were able to move to the right and around the items as they re-entered the room for the second time.

I asked Officer Burdick how far behind Officer McIrvin was when they walked back into the room when the incident occurred. He described being only a couple of feet behind him. He said he was close enough to reach and touch Officer McIrvin. I asked if this distance changed once they entered the room, during the time when Officer McIrvin was approaching JOSE VILORIO. He said he remained in the center of the room, about six feet away from Officer McIrvin.

I asked Officer Burdick if he felt any other types of force could have been applied during this incident. He said he thought about using his taser, but said that since Officer McIrvin was already struggling with JOSE VILARIO, he would have to deploy the taser from a closer distance. He advised that the taser is less effective from a closer istance. He then advised he did not feel the use of pepper spray would have been effective due to the small from they were contained inside. I asked him if he received any training on the use of a taser. He said he recently received a refresher course on the use of the taser a week or two ago. He said he also received initial training with the taser about two years ago. I asked him to explain how the taser works. He said one of the darts comes straight out and the second dart comes out at an angle. He described that the greater the spread of the two darts, the greater the area affected by the use of the taser. He said this was why he chose not to deploy the taser, due to his close proximity of JOSE VILORIO.

I asked Officer Burdick his height and weight. He advised he is 5'11" and 160 lbs. He estimated that JOSE VILORIO was 5"8" and 250 to 300 lbs.

I asked Officer Burdick about his decision to not use pepper spray. He explained that since they were indoors, in a small confined space, that everyone would have been affected by the use of pepper spray, not just JOSE VILORIO. He added that Officer McIrvin was already wrestling with and was hitting JOSE VILORIO. He felt that if he deployed pepper spray, he would have sprayed both JOSE VILORIO and Officer McIrvin.

Officer Burdick then advised he was in possession of a 'Peacekeeper' brand collapsible baton. He said he did not feel he could have used his baton due to the confined space inside the room they were in.

I asked Officer Burdick about his training with the use of the carotid control hold. He said he was trained in the use of the carotid control hold during the police academy, about two and a half years ago. He said he has applied the carotid control hold, but only in a training setting. I asked him to explain the proper use of the carotid control hold. He said ideally the subject would be in a seated position. He said you place your arm over the subjects



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shoulder and use your arm to create a 'V' with your elbow. He said you use your forearm and bicep to apply pressure to both sides of the subject's neck. He said the object is to cut off blood flow to the subject's brain to cause unconsciousness temporarily. This is done to affect the arrest of the subject.

I asked Officer Burdick if he had ever witnesses anyone apply the carotid control hold in any other real life encounters. He advised he has not witnesses anyone else apply this hold before.

I asked Officer Burdick to describe to me in detail how Officer McIrvin applied the carotid control hold to JOSE VILORIO. He advised JOSE VILORIO was seated and leaning to the left. Officer McIrvin was able to position himself behind JOSE VILORIO and he got into a mounted position. He placed his arm around JOSE VILORIO's neck. When he began to apply the carotid control hold, he began to lift JOSE VILORIO's upper body partially up off of the seat. I asked him what JOSE VILORIO's reaction was to the use of the carotid control hold. Officer Burdick advised he still had control of his right arm, but lost control of the arm when Officer McIrvin began to apply the hold. He said he reached out to attempt to control JOSE VILORIO's left arm at that time. He said JOSE VILORIO then used his right arm to try to prevent Officer McIrvin from applying the control hold. He said JOSE VILORIO was not saying anything at that time. He added that he could feel JOSE VILORIO continue to resist his attempted control of his left arm. Officer Burdick was unsure what action JOSE VILORIO took with his right arm when he reached up to where Officer McIrvin was attempting to apply the control hold.

Officer Burdick described that when he was attempting to control JOSE VILORIO's right arm, he was using his with arm and attempting to place a rear wrist lock on him to gain control of him. He said Officer McIrvin began to apply the carotid control hold, which forced Officer Burdick to remove his arm as it was between Officer McIrvin and JOSE VILORIO.

Officer Burdick said he and Officer McIrvin have been partners for about two weeks. He said they were not beat partners previously, they worked on opposite sides of town until they recently became partners.

I asked Officer Burdick if he felt a crime had been committed after he spoke with the reporting parties. He said described that JOSE VILORIO was waving around a machete, which Officer Burdick believe constituted the crime of 'brandishing a weapon'. He said he was also aware that she had called the police, made the same statement regarding the machete. He said she had exited the residence after the incident and she appeared afraid to remain inside the residence while waiting for officers to respond. Officer Burdick felt he had enough information to detain JOSE VILORIO when he entered the residence.

I asked Officer Burdick if he and Officer McIrvin discussed any sort of game plan in regards to their response to the call. He said there was no discussion in regards to their game plan. He said the nature of the call, a subject brandishing a weapon, and their lack of knowledge of the layout of the residence, did not really give them the ability to plan their response. He said these types of calls are fluid and can change quickly. He said he and Officer McIrvin are trained in responding to these types of incidents, but said they did not specifically plan their actions for this call.



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Detective Burich asked Officer Burdick what was going through his mind when he responded to the call and approached the residence. Officer Burdick said that if the suspect was armed with a machete and if he advanced towards officers, that lethal force may potentially have to be used to stop the threat. He also thought that if the suspect complied with their commands and dropped any weapons he possessed that the suspect would be taken into custody with a lesser force option. Officer Burdick said he and Officer McIrvin did not talk about who would be responsible for lethal force coverage while contacting the suspect.

I asked Officer Burdick if he had any thoughts in regards to JOSE VILORIO being under the influence of any intoxicants or drugs. He said he did not have enough time to evaluate either way. He added that since JOSE VILORIO was speaking Spanish, it would have been difficult to determine this as well.

I asked Officer Burdick if he has had any prior contacts with JOSE VILORIO. He said he did not believe he has ever had any prior contacts with him. He said this was the first time he has responded to this particular residence as well.

I asked Officer Burdick about the portion of the incident where the reporting parties opened the front door and directed him where to go. He said that when he turned away, he believed this gave her a viewpoint where she could see JOSE VILORIO and she pointed him out. Officer Burdick said was outside the residence when this occurred. I asked him if it was possible that the entered the house to provide her a view of JOSE VILORIO's room. He said this was possible, but he was unsure. He confirmed that directly at JOSE VILORIO and said he was the suspect.

I asked Officer Burdick to describe the physical portion of this incident again. He said Officer McIrvin told JOSE VILORIO to stand up and he moved closer to him and tried to take hold of his arm. Officer Burdick realized JOSE VILORIO was resisting arrest at that point. He recalled Officer McIrvin telling JOSE VILORIO to come to him, but he refused. He recalled JOSE VILORIO attempting to pull away and reach back. At that point, Officer McIrvin continued to attempt to control JOSE VILORIO with his right arm. JOSE VILORIO sat back down onto the couch. It was at this point that Officer McIrvin began to punch JOSE VILORIO. Officer Burdick said it did not appear that Officer McIrvin was ever able to gain any sort of control over JOSE VILORIO, prior to the use of the carotid control hold. Officer Burdick said again that based on Officer McIrvin's response and his use of force, it appeared he must have seen something that concerned him. Officer Burdick said he moved closer and that was when he saw the machete underneath JOSE VILORIO.

Detective Burich asked Officer Burdick to describe the position of the machete when he first saw it. He said the handle was to the left with the blade to the right. He said the sharp part of the blade was towards the center of the room. JOSE VILORIO was sitting on a portion of the blade, with the handle towards JOSE VILORIO's right. Officer Burdick said he was aware that the machete was a deadly weapon. He felt JOSE VILORIO was attempting to retrieve the machete when he reached back and sat back down on the couch. He said he felt this was why Officer McIrvin began to punch JOSE VILORIO, to prevent him from being able to retrieve the machete. Officer Burdick said his mindset was to remove the machete from the situation. He said it was while

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he was holding JOSE VILORIO's right arm that he was able to grab the machete and move it away from JOSE VILORIO's reach.

I asked Officer Burdick when it was that he last received training in CPR. He said he was last certified in July of 2016. He said he was trained once before coming to the Police Department and twice while at the department. He said he has never used CPR in a real life situation before this incident.

I asked Officer Burdick about the table that he moved out of the room. He said he tipped the table over and then carried it into the living room. I asked him if there was anything on the table. He did not recall what was on the table, but recalled that JOSE VILORIO had been writing on something when they first entered the residence. I asked him if he had any idea how JOSE VILORIO's bible had ended up inside the main residence, he did not see or notice any bibles and did not know how it would have ended up inside the residence.

On 10-3-16, at 1030 hours, Detective Burich and I entered the Investigations Interview room along with Officer Timothy McIrvin #1043, in order to obtain his statement in regards to this incident. I utilized my digital recorder to record the interview with Officer McIrvin. Officer McIrvin was aware that the interview was being recorded. The recording was later downloaded into DIMS. The following is a summary of the interview; refer to the recording for further details.

I began by thanking Officer McIrvin for agreeing to be interviewed. He advised he agreed to conduct this voluntary interview. He declined to have any legal representation or a Union representative with him during this interview. I further explained to Officer McIrvin that he was free to end the interview at any time, to which he said he understood.

Officer McIrvin said he was hired with Bakersfield Police Department on 7-10-06. He does not have any prior law enforcement experience. He is currently assigned to shift one, Thursday through Sunday 2100 to 0700 hours. He was assigned as 1V4. He was operating his patrol vehicle, #5719. His partner was Officer Burdick. Officer McIrvin advised he was not injured and did not require any medical attention. I asked him if he had any scrapes or marks on him at all. He said he has some bruising to his right hand. He showed me his hand and I noted it was red and appeared to have some swelling. Officer McIrvin said someone from the Crime Lab had taken pictures of him before this interview. Pictures were taken of his right hand as well.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he had consumed any intoxicants today, he replied that he had not. He said he does not take any prescription medications. I noted that he did not display any symptoms of being under the influence of any controlled substances.

I explained to Officer McIrvin that I needed to obtain a description of his uniform and the items on his duty belt. I asked him to stand to allow me a better view of these items. I noted he was wearing a class 'B' short sleeve Bakersfield Police Department uniform, Spiewak brand. Officer McIrvin advised he was right handed, I noted his duty firearm was on his right side. I could see he had department patches on each outer arm. I saw he had a badge on his left chest, badge #903. He advised this was a loaner badge. I saw he had a name plate on his right chest with the name 'T. McIrvin' on it, along with an American flag. I saw that his police radio microphone came up his back and over his right shoulder, and it was clipped to the front of his uniform shirt. I then noted the following items on Officer McIrvin's duty belt. Starting to the left of his belt buckle was an open top double magazine pouch, with two magazines inside; to the left was a baton ring with a 29" wooden baton; police issue radio and holder; a flashlight; a key holder; nothing across his back; right side was his department issued Glock 17, gen IV, serial #XTC529, with an attached light; pepper spray holder with can of pepper spray inside; front right of belt was a double handcuff case with two pair handcuffs inside. On his left pants pocket was a folding pocket knife,



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Benchmade brand. On his right pants pocket was a small flashlight. He did not have a hobble device and did not have any backup firearms. He was wearing black duty boots, unknown brand.

I explained to Officer McIrvin that I was going to allow him to provide me with a detailed statement in regards to this incident. I explained I would not ask him any questions during his account of the events.

Officer McIrvin explained that he was inside the trailer park at 499 Pacheco Road when a call came out regarding a '417' (brandishing) with a machete. He said the suspect was described as a HM wearing a blue shirt. He said they responded to the call, driving northbound on S. H Street to westbound Lacey Street, to the 1800 block. He parked their vehicle on the north side of the roadway. The reporting parties were on the south side of the street, adjacent to the patrol vehicle.

Officer McIrvin said he made contact with the reporting party briefly (later identified as She told him that the suspect (later identified as JOSE VILORIO) was still inside and was armed with a machete. She told him there were two other people inside the residence, possibly inside their bedrooms. Officer McIrvin asked for a description of the suspect and she said he was wearing a blue shirt.

Officer McIrvin asked what actions JOSE VILORIO took with the machete, she said he was waiving it around. Officer McIrvin asked how to gain entry into the house and asked where JOSE VILORIO was ocated within the residence. She pointed to the east side entrance of the residence and described that the suspect should be in that area.

Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick approached the door on the east side of the residence. He said the door was partially opened when he walked up to the door. He said there was an ironing board behind the door. He said he announced "Bakersfield Police Department. Make yourself known!" Officer McIrvin said he was able to look through the crack in the door before entering the residence. He saw a subject seated inside the room. He appeared to be at a desk and was writing something. He said this subject did not acknowledge officers presence or commands. He added that the subject did not appear to fit the suspects' description at that point. Officer McIrvin said he and Officer Burdick decided to enter the residence to attempt to locate the suspect, and to ensure the safety of the two additional people who were inside the residence.

Officer McIrvin said they entered the residence and he made contact with JOSE VILORIO in that first room. He advised this ended up being the suspect from this incident, but he did not initially realize this. Officer McIrvin said he spoke to JOSE VILORIO and he seemed calm. He asked him if he was involved and JOSE VILORIO responded "no". JOSE VILORIO told Officer McIrvin that he was writing a report. He noted that he could see that JOSE VILORIO was writing something.

Officer McIrvin said he and Officer Burdick then entered the main portion of the residence. The	ey saw a subject

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Officer McIrvin said he and Officer Burdick went back inside the east bedroom and contacted JOSE VILORIO. He said he began talking to JOSE VILARIO. He said he asked JOSE VILORIO to get up and come to him. He said he could see a machete sitting on the couch behind JOSE VILORIO. He said he wanted to call him away from the machete, but he did not want to draw any attention to the machete, to keep him from having any thoughts about arming himself with the machete. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO refused to come out and started yelling at officers. He noted the yelling was in broken English and it was hard to understand what JOSE VILORIO was saying. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO was seated on a couch. He said there was a small table in front of him. he described the table as being 3-4' long and 18 - 24 " wide. He said the table was being used as a desk to write on.

Officer McIrvin said he walked around the right side or west side of the table to contact JOSE VILORIO. Officer Burdick walked around the left or east side of the table. Officer McIrvin said that when he approached JOSE VILORIO, he stood up and it seemed he was 'shying away' from him. Officer McIrvin reached out with his right hand and took hold of JOSE VILORIO's left arm. He said he was just trying to guide JOSE VILORIO away (from the machete). As soon as he did this, JOSE VILORIO began pulling away from Officer McIrvin and back towards the couch, where the machete was still sitting. JOSE VILORIO then began reaching back towards the machete, at which time Officer McIrvin believed JOSE VILORIO was trying to arm himself with the machete. Officer McIrvin said at this point, he tried to hold onto JOSE VILORIO's left arm, and he began to strike JOSE VILORIO with his closed fist. Officer McIrvin said he chose to use his fist instead of his baton, he felt that if he et go of his hold on JOSE VILORIO's arm, he would give him the opportunity to arm himself with the 'knife'. Officer McIrvin feared this would have led to an officer involved shooting or potentially injuries to himself or his partner. Officer McIrvin said he chose to maintain the best control he could over JOSE VILORIO. He added that he was yelling for JOSE VILORIO to stop resisting and to give up his hands, but he continued to refuse to comply.

Officer McIrvin recalled that Officer Burdick responded to the left side of JOSE VILORIO. He was unsure as to what actions Officer Burdick was taking, but he recalled hearing Officer Burdick yell "machete!" during the incident. He said he yelled back to Officer Burdick, telling him to grab the machete. He said at some point Officer Burdick grabbed the machete, but he did not know what he did with the machete. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO continued to push towards him. He said he still had a hold on JOSE VILORIO's arm, but he continued to struggle and push towards Officer McIrvin. Officer McIrvin said he struck JOSE VILORIO a couple more times in his face. He said JOSE VILORIO began pushing Officer McIrvin towards the west corner of the room. He was unsure why he was being pushed to this area and he was concerned there could have been additional weapons in the area where JOSE VILORIO seemed to be pushing him towards. Officer McIrvin said he believes he punched JOSE VILORIO again during this time. Officer McIrvin estimated he punched JOSE VILORIO a total of 10 to 12 times. Officer McIrvin said he realized his strikes were not effective.

Officer McIrvin said he attempted to apply an arm bar to JOSE VILORIO. He said he could see that Officer Burdick had a 'bar hammerlock' on JOSE VILORIO's right arm. Officer McIrvin said he was in front of JOSE VILORIO and was trying to control his left arm, but he was unable to gain control of him. JOSE VILORIO continued to push Officer McIrvin and he was overpowering him, pushing him backwards. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO's hands went down by the couch, and Officer McIrvin could no longer see his hands. Officer

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McIrvin decided he needed to end the altercation quickly for JOSE VILORIO's safety and for Officer McIrvin's and Officer Burdick's safety.

Officer McIrvin said he got onto JOSE VILORIO's back. JOSE VILORIO was lying partially on the couch, but had his knees/legs on the ground. Officer McIrvin said he got into position to apply the carotid control hold on JOSE VILORIO. Officer McIrvin said he placed his left arm under JOSE VILORIO's chin. He said the first time he placed his arm under his chin, he realized he did not have the proper positioning. He said he did not apply the carotid control hold at that time. Officer McIrvin said he was able to adjust his positioning in order to place his left arm in the proper position. He said he placed his right arm behind JOSE VILORIO's neck and grabbed a hold of his own uniform. He then grabbed his left arm with his right hand. He placed his left hand, from under JOSE VILORIO's chin, onto his own right arm. He then applied the carotid control hold. He said it took about 15 to 20 seconds before JOSE VILORIO stopped fighting. JOSE VILORIO was still fighting back. JOSE VILORIO was still pushing Officer McIrvin back towards the corner of the room.

Officer McIrvin said he could not see what Officer Burdick was doing while he was applying the carotid control hold. Officer McIrvin said that as soon as he felt JOSE VILORIO's body go limp, he released his hold on him. He told Officer Burdick to handcuff JOSE VILORIO. Officer Burdick suggested they handcuff JOSE VILORIO to the front, since it would be quicker. They then handcuffed JOSE VILORIO to the front of his body. Officer McIrvin said he immediately pulled JOSE VILORIO away from the corner of the room. He placed JOSE VILORIO onto the right side of his body, in a 'recovery position'.

Officer McIrvin said he checked for a pulse on JOSE VILORIO immediately after placing him on the ground. JOSE VILORIO was breathing when he checked him. Officer McIrvin waited about five seconds, expecting JOSE VILORIO would wake up. When he did not wake up, Officer McIrvin called for medical assistance for an unconscious subject. Officer McIrvin then moved JOSE VILORIO onto his back. Officer Burdick and Officer McIrvin continued checking to see if JOSE VILORIO was breathing. He said Officer Burdick believed JOSE VILORIO was breathing. Officer McIrvin was not certain if JOSE VILORIO was breathing at that time. He lifted up JOSE VILORIO's shirt to better view his chest. Officer McIrvin said it did not appear that JOSE VILORIO was breathing at that time. He then checked for a pulse and did not find a pulse. Officer McIrvin then asked Officer Burdick to begin chest compression on JOSE VILORIO, to attempt to resuscitate him.

Officer McIrvin said he broadcast over the radio an update, that the subject was not breathing and did not have a pulse and that CPR was in progress. Officer McIrvin advised that when he first requested medical aide and a sergeant, he requested that medical aide respond 'code 3', due to JOSE VILORIO's condition.

Officer Burdick continued CPR, chest compressions only, for several minutes. Officer McIrvin went outside to contact the next responding officer. He told the officer to remain outside in order to tell the ambulance and the fire personnel where to respond to, within the residence.

Officer McIrvin said he went back inside the bedroom and saw that Officer Burdick was still performing chest compressions on JOSE VILORIO. He told Officer Burdick to tell him if he became tired, that he would relieve him. Officer Burdick provided chest compressions for several more minutes, at which time Officer McIrvin took



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over and began providing chest compressions on him. Officer McIrvin said he continued the chest compressions until fire and ambulance personnel arrived on scene. He continued the chest compressions while medical personnel began attaching machines to JOSE VILORIO. He continued with the chest compressions until one of the fire personnel told him to stop and then took over.

Officer McIrvin said he advised another officer to begin taking pictures of the area, to document the scene and what was occurring. Officer McIrvin advised a sergeant was on scene at this time. He was asked to wait outside of the room. He then rode back to the Police Station along with another officer, Officer McWilliams. Officer McWilliams continued to stay with him up until he entered the room for this interview.

I explained to Officer McIrvin I forgot to ask a couple of the preliminary questions prior to taking his statement. I noted he was wearing body armor. I asked him if he was wears glasses or contacts and he replied he wears contacts, adding that he is currently wearing them. I asked him if he was wearing sunglasses during the incident, he answered he was not wearing any at the time.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he was on another call while inside the complex at 499 Pacheco Rd. He said they had been on a call involving a vehicle blocking a driveway. He advised they had finished that call when they responded to this call. I asked him if the information he obtained in regards to this call was received over the police radio or through the computer. He advised he heard radio traffic in regards to the call. He said that since he was the driver of the patrol vehicle, that Officer Burdick read the computer and read aloud the suspect description. He did not recall if any updates were given over the computer.

Officer McIrvin said he only recalled seeing to the front of the residence when he arrived, he did not recall seeing anyone else out in the neighborhood.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he could recall the lighting in the area. He recalled the area was lowly lit, but said there were street lights on. He said there was enough light in the area where he could see without the use of a flashlight. He said the lighting outside the residence was also enough that he did not need to use a flashlight to see. I asked him about the interior of the residence. I asked him about the lighting inside the first room he entered, which was the room where the use of force occurred. He advised that the house was well lit, that he never needed his flashlight.

I asked Officer McIrvin where JOSE VILORIO had been sitting when he first came into the residence. He said he was sitting on a couch which was located on the south wall, or to his left as he entered the residence.

Officer McIrvin said the side door which led to JOSE VILORIO's bedroom was open about 12 inches when he walked up to the door. Officer McIrvin said the door was open enough that he could look through the crack in the door and see JOSE VILORIO sitting inside the room. He was able to observe him before pushing the door open and before entering this room. He said JOSE VILORIO was in this position and visible while he seemed to ignore officers as they announced their presence. I asked Officer McIrvin if there was a response from JOSE VILORIO after he pushed the door the rest of the way open. Officer McIrvin said there was still no

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. Officer McIrvin said the front door was to his right at this time,

response from JOSE VILORIO. He said that when he walked into the room, he finally got a response from JOSE VILORIO. JOSE VILORIO said something to the effect of he was in his room and he was writing a report.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he could see what JOSE VILORIO was writing on. He said it appeared that he was writing on the back of an envelope. Officer McIrvin also said JOSE VILORIO was speaking English at this time. Officer McIrvin said he does not speak Spanish.

I asked Officer McIrvin why he left this room to enter the main portion of the house. He said JOSE VILORIO appeared calm and had said that he was not involved in the incident. He did not appear to match the description that had given to officers when they first arrived.

Officer McIrvin said that although he walked into the main house, he was able to maintain visual eye contact of JOSE VILORIO. I asked if there was any movement from JOSE VILORIO, he stated that he remained seated and continued writing the entire time.

I asked Officer McIrvin what his actions were after he entered the main residence. He said he and Officer Burdick stated "Bakersfield Police Department" several times. He said it was at this time that a subject exited

letective Burich clarified with Officer McIrvin details regarding the envelope that JOSE VILORIO had been
rriting on. He described the envelope as being white, that he had the envelope vertical away from him and was writing on it.
Officer McIrvin advised it was who opened the front door. He said she entered the residence
and she pointed to JOSE VILORIO and said he was the suspect in regards to the machete incident. Officer
McIrvin said no one other than JOSE VILORIO was in the area where
here were any objects or walls between and where JOSE VILORIO was located. Officer
McIrvin said there were sliding closet doors with mirrors. He said the doors had been pushed open and allowed a
view into JOSE VILORIO's bedroom. Detective Burich asked Officer McIrvin if
further description while pointing at JOSE VILORIO. Officer McIrvin recalled telling her that JOSE VILORIO
was not wearing the same color of shirt that she had described to him. She told him JOSE VILORIO had changed
clothes. Officer McIrvin recalled that JOSE VILORIO was now wearing a gray long sleeve shirt.

I asked Officer McIrvin about his initial entry into the residence. He said he had his firearm out of his holster when he entered the residence. He said he did this because the suspect was supposed to be armed with a machete. Officer McIrvin said he had his firearm out up until the point where pointed at JOSE VILORIO and said he was the suspect. Officer McIrvin said he could clearly see JOSE VILORIO's hands and saw he was not holding any weapons. He said he holstered his firearm prior to walking back into the bedroom to contact JOSE VILORIO. Officer McIrvin was not certain when Officer Burdick holstered his firearm.

Officer McIrvin said he entered JOSE VILORIO's bedroom first. He said Officer Burdick was right behind him. He said he walked about a foot or two north of the table which was in front of JOSE VILORIO and stopped.



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He said he could see a machete on the couch, behind JOSE VILORIO. I asked Officer McIrvin to describe the machete. He said the machete had a black handle, a 14" - 18" blade. He said the blade was to the west, with the handle to the east. Officer McIrvin was closer to the west side of the machete, closer to the blade side. Officer McIrvin described the machete as being towards the back of the couch, while JOSE VILORIO was seated on the edge of the seat. If JOSE VILORIO leaned or moved back, he would have been sitting on top of the machete.

Officer McIrvin advised that when the physical portion of this incident started, he yelled "machete!" in order to inform Officer Burdick of the presence of the machete.

Officer McIrvin said the physical confrontation started after JOSE VILORIO stood up, but refused to walk towards officers, as he was directed to do. Officer McIrvin said he walked to JOSE VILORIO's left side and placed one hand on his left arm. He said it was at this time that JOSE VILORIO began to reach back, towards the machete. Officer McIrvin recalled that Officer Burdick also yelled "machete!" at about the same time that he yelled it. Officer McIrvin said it was shortly after the struggle began that he told Officer Burdick to retrieve the machete.

Officer McIrvin said he began punching JOSE VILORIO as he was turning to reach towards the machete. He said the punches were to prevent him from obtaining the machete. Officer McIrvin described that JOSE VILORIO turned in a clockwise direction and reached for the machete with his right hand.

asked Officer McIrvin what his actions were after Officer Burdick had moved the machete from its' position on the couch. He said he still had a hold of JOSE VILORIO's left hand, attempting to gain control of him. He said JOSE VILORIO was pushing towards him, pushing him (Officer McIrvin) backwards. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO was overpowering him. Officer McIrvin said he felt his only option was to continue striking JOSE VILORIO in his face, to attempt to control him.

I asked Officer McIrvin what his height and weight were. He said he is 5'9" and 210 pounds. He said he estimated JOSE VILORIO was 5'8" or 5'9" and 230-240 pounds.

Officer McIrvin said that as the altercation was ongoing, he kept telling JOSE VILORIO to give him his hands and to stop resisting. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO did not respond to commands, he continued to resist and fight with officers. I asked him if JOSE VILORIO had a reaction to the machete being moved from the couch area. Officer McIrvin said that after that occurred, JOSE VILORIO turned and began to focus his attention towards Officer McIrvin and began pushing him backwards.

I asked Officer McIrvin to describe what he meant in regards to his earlier statement that JOSE VILORIO was attempting to punch or hit him. He said he maintained his grasp on JOSE VILORIO's left arm during the struggle. He said there were several times were JOSE VILORIO attempted to punch him with his left arm, he felt that if he did not have a grasp of his left arm, that JOSE VILORIO would have struck him. I asked Officer McIrvin what prevented JOSE VILORIO from using his right arm/hand to strike him. He said Officer Burdick had come back after moving the machete and he took a hold on his right arm.



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I asked Officer McIrvin if there were any other types of force he could have applied in this situation. He answered that there was no other force options that would have worked in this scenario. I asked him to explain why he could not have utilized each force option available to him. I began by asking him why he could not have utilized his baton. He explained that in order to utilize his baton, he would have to release his hold on JOSE VILORIO's left arm. He felt this would have given him the opportunity to arm himself with any nearby weapons, including the machete. He added that the room they were in was a small room and there was a good chance he would have inadvertently struck Officer Burdick with the baton, or Officer Burdick could have inadvertently struck him with his baton if it was used.

Officer McIrvin explained he did not utilize pepper spray because he does not react well with it. He reminded me he wears contacts and said his contacts could have been contaminated by the use of pepper spray, making it difficult to see. He said although the pepper spray may have made it more difficult for JOSE VILORIO to continue to fight, it would have also made it more difficult for he and Officer Burdick to continue as well.

Officer McIrvin advised that the use of a firearm was not an option at this point during the struggle. He said the use of deadly force was not an option.

Officer McIrvin advised he does not carry a taser.

asked Officer McIrvin if he knew the location of the machete after Officer Burdick removed it. He did not Amow where the machete was moved to. I asked him where the machete was located the next time he remembers seeing it. Officer McIrvin said he knew the machete was moved, but said Officer Burdick returned to the struggle very quickly, leading Officer McIrvin to believe the machete was still nearby. He said the next time he saw the machete, it was sitting on a table, still inside the room. He said it was about six feet away from where the struggle occurred inside the room.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he could provide me with a description of the room where this occurred. He said the room was about 10' wide by 12' long. He said the south wall had a couch, or possibly a seat from a vehicle. Along the west wall, there was another couch or bench vehicle seat. He said there was an ironing board, and a fan in the room. He said there were objects on the floor in the room making it difficult to walk around the room easily. He said this stuff was already there before the struggle began inside the room.

Officer McIrvin said that Officer Burdick was a little farther away from JOSE VILORIO than he was when he first observed the machete. I asked if he felt Officer Burdick would have had a view of the machete at that time. He said he believes Officer Burdick would have been able to see the machete.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he has received training in the use of the carotid control hold. He told me he has been trained in the use of the hold. He said his training in the use of the carotid control hold started during the police academy. He said he not only received training in the use of the carotid control hold and the proper placement of it, but he was also trained in the after care. He was trained to check for breathing, to look for a pulse, and how to place the person into a recovery position. He was trained to call for medical aide and to notify a supervisor of the use of the control hold. Officer McIrvin said that since his initial training in the use of the carotid control



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hold, he has received updated training during Advanced Officer (AO) school training. He believes he received this refresher training twice since his academy. He said the refresher training includes all of the same steps listed above. He said he believed the last training he received was about two years ago.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he has ever applied the carotid control hold in the field before. He advised he has applied it twice before. I asked him what happened during those two incidents. He said both times the control hold had the desired effect, causing the subject to lose consciousness, and allowing officers to place handcuffs onto the subjects involved. I asked him what the persons from those incidents reaction was once they regained consciousness. He said that as soon as the person woke up, they continued to fight with officers. He said the subject was able to recover after the use of the carotid control hold.

I asked Officer McIrvin what JOSE VILORIO's body position was when he applied the carotid control hold. He said he was lying with his head to the west, on the couch, with his knees and legs on the ground. I asked him what his body position was when he applied the carotid control hold. He said he had his chest on JOSE VILORIO's back. He said his feet were still on the ground, supporting his own body weight. He said his chest was at the same level as JOSE VILORIO's neck, allowing him to reach his left arm around his neck, to place his left elbow under his chin.

I asked Officer McIrvin what Officer Burdick was doing when he began to apply the carotid control hold. He said he did not know what his actions were.

I asked Officer McIrvin what his mindset was in regards to whether he had information for a detention or an arrest of JOSE VILORIO. He explained that based on what told him in regards to brandishing a weapon, he felt he had enough for a detention. He added that she was afraid enough to exit the residence while she waited for officers to respond. Officer McIrvin added that had told him that JOSE VILORIO was still armed. She also told him there were two additional subjects inside the residence. This could have led to them becoming victims or hostages.

I asked Officer McIrvin how long he had been partners with Officer Burdick, he responded they have been partners for two weeks. He said they have not been beat partners in the past either. I asked if he and Officer Burdick discussed any sort of game plan in regards to this incident, he advised they did not discuss a game plan before the incident.

I asked Officer McIrvin if JOSE VILORIO appeared to be under the influence of any intoxicants or drugs, he advised JOSE VILORIO did not appear to be under the influence of anything.

Officer McIrvin advised he has not had any prior contacts with JOSE VILORIO. He said he has not responded to any prior calls at the residence.

I asked Officer McIrvin to again explain why he made the decision to go 'hands on' with JOSE VILORIO. He told me that when he first touched him, he was not using any force, he was attempting to guide him away from the machete. He did so to attempt to move him away from the deadly weapon.



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Officer McIrvin said he last received training in CPR a couple of months ago. I asked him if he has received any additional medical training outside of his training as a police officer. He explained that prior to becoming a police officer, he was a firefighter for the Forest Service. He said he was a certified EMT during his time there. He said he has not renewed his EMT certification after it expired.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he knew what happened to the table that was in the middle of this situation. He said he did not recall who, but recalled an officer moving the table to the back of the room. He said he did not recall what, if anything, was on top of this table. I asked him if he recalling seeing a bible in the room that somehow left this room and ended up inside the main residence. Officer McIrvin advised he did not move any objects and was unaware what objects were moved. He added that he was performing CPR when objects were being moved.

Officer Burich asked several follow up questions. He asked that after JOSE VILORIO was handcuffed and placed in a recovery position, what actions Officer McIrvin took. Officer McIrvin said JOSE VILORIO had been handcuffed in his front, due to his size. He said they placed him on his right side, with his feet and knees bent in a 'fetal' position. He said he checked for breathing and a pulse. He said initially JOSE VILORIO was breathing and had a pulse. Officer McIrvin said he was able to request medical aide, code 3, and he requested a patrol sergeant. He said it was a couple seconds later that it did not appear he was breathing. He said this was about 10 to 15 seconds total time. Officer McIrvin said he checked for a pulse on JOSE VILORIO by placing his fingers on the light side of JOSE VILORIO's neck, checking at the carotid artery. He said he also checked for a pulse on his wrist, since he had just applied the carotid control hold, he felt that may have not been the best place to check for a pulse.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he knew how long it took for medical aide to arrive, he was unsure, but said it was several minutes. He said he believed ambulance personnel arrived on scene first. He said Officer Skidmore was the first officer to arrive on scene to assist them.

I took a short break from the interview at that time.

When I returned to the interview room, I asked Officer McIrvin a few clarifying questions. I asked him to describe in plain terms the hold that Officer Burdick had on JOSE VILORIO's right arm. He explained that Officer Burdick used his arm to place it around JOSE VILORIO's arm and push it upward. This is done to attempt to control a subject and to gain compliance from them. It is also to prevent a subject from obtaining a weapon.

I asked Officer McIrvin again about his right hand. He told me his hand is slightly swollen and has visible bruising. He said his hand is sore. He added that his back is a little sore, but it is not hurting very bad.

I asked Officer McIrvin if any other type of force was used, other than what we had discussed. He said he attempted to strike JOSE VILORIO with his knee, but he was unsuccessful, striking the couch instead. He said he was attempting to target JOSE VILORIO in his face/head area. He said he did not see any striking or other use of orce done by Officer Burdick.



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I asked Officer McIrvin if he could again describe his application of the carotid control hold. He said he used his left arm, with his chest to the subject's back. He placed his elbow under the subject's chin to ensure the proper placement of the hold. He brought his left arm, and grabbed the back of his right elbow. He placed his right arm across and behind JOSE VILORIO's head. He used his right hand to grab the sleeve on his left arm. He did this in order to apply the pressure of the carotid control hold. I asked him where the pressure for the hold was applied. He explained the pressure was applied on each side of JOSE VILORIO's neck, on each of his carotid arteries. I asked Officer McIrvin if any intentional pressure was applied to the front of JOSE VILORIO's neck, he said "no". Officer McIrvin said that when he first attempted to obtain the proper positioning for the hold, he could feel JOSE VILORIO's throat. He did not apply any pressure at this time, he then repositioned his hold to obtain the proper positioning.

I asked Officer McIrvin if he told the first responding sergeant that he had applied the carotid control hold. He said he did tell the sergeant who responded. He said Sergeant Galland was the first responding sergeant.

I asked Officer McIrvin how much time passed from the point he entered the bedroom the second time, until the time he applied the carotid control hold. He estimated two or three minutes passed during this time. It was during these two to three minutes that he was giving commands to JOSE VILORIO and during this time that the physical confrontation occurred which led to him applying the carotid control hold.

The interview was ended at this time.

On 10-3-16, at 1300 hours, Detective Burich and I responded to San Joaquin Hospital and entered the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) to check on the status of JOSE VILORIO. I made contact with his nurse and learned there was nothing new to report. That he was still in critical condition. The nurse asked if family members were allowed to come to visit JOSE VILORIO. I advised the nurse that it was okay for the family to enter the hospital room, per the hospital's visiting policies.

On 10-4-16, at 0730 hours, I responded to San Joaquin Hospital to check on the status of JOSE VILORIO. I learned he was still in critical condition.

On 10-5-16, at 1007 hours, I made phone contact with a nurse from San Joaquin. She advised JOSE VILORIO was deceased. She advised his time of death was at 1002 hours. She informed me she notified the Coroner's office of his death.

I advised Detective Davenport that JOSE VILORIO had passed. He responded to San Joaquin Hospital and met with a Coroner Investigator. Refer to his follow-up report for further details.

## STATE of CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF KERN ATTACHED and INCORPORATED STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Affiant, Detective Andrew Burich, declares under penalty of perjury that the following facts are true and that there is probable cause to believe, and Affiant does believe, that the designated articles, property, and persons are now in the described locations, the vehicles and the persons.

My name is Detective Andrew Burich. I have been a sworn peace officer for the City of Bakersfield for the past ten years, and received the information in this affidavit in this capacity. I am currently a Detective assigned to the Investigations Division, a position I have held for approximately 22 months. My current assignment within the Investigations Division is the Robbery/Homicide detail.

During my years in law enforcement, I have personally investigated and assisted in numerous assault related investigations. I have had reason to become acquainted with the various methods used by suspects during the commission of their offenses. During these investigations, I have spoken to the suspects, who were either involved or participated, and have obtained a large amount of information on the preparation and execution of such crimes. On almost a daily basis I communicate with other experts in the field regarding current trends and elements related to these crimes.

I state the following facts will establish grounds for the issuance of a search warrant and will further establish probable cause for believing that the said grounds exist:

On 10-03-16 at approximately 0001 hours Officer T. McIrvin and Officer Z. Burdick responded to 1821 Lacey Street regarding a male subject, later identified as JOSE VILORIO 12-27-52, brandishing a machete during an argument over stolen property. Upon arrival the victim,

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confronted VILORIO in his bedroom (southeast) due to her cellular telephones, EBT card, and approximately \$150 cash missing from her property while she was visiting with VILORIO's roommates inside the residence. VILORIO became angry and armed himself with a machete. VILORIO attempted to strike times with the machete, using slashing movements, missing her neck area by one to two inches, and threatened to "Cut her head off." witnessed the attack. cellular telephone (described as: Motorola Droid cellular telephone IMEI # 990005437504153) to call his missing cellular telephone said at this time he could hear his cellular telephone ringing in VILORIO'S bedroom. also utilized cellular telephone to contact the Bakersfield Police Department regarding the offense. ed from the residence for their safety. Detective Sporer seized cellular telephone from person and maintained it his said they heard what sounded like VILORIO throwing items out of the residence while they advised VILORIO appeared intoxicated or under the influence of some type of were waiting for police. drug. Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick entered the residence and confronted VILORIO in his bedroom (southeast), and attempted to take him into custody. VILORIO violently resisted. During the struggle VILORIO lost consciousness and stopped breathing. Medical aid was rendered by the officers at the scene which was taken over by emergency medical personnel. VILORIO was transported to the hospital for treatment. were also inside the residence and have access to VILORIO's bedroom.

A subsequent search warrant was authorized for the listed residence. Upon execution of the warrant, officers located the following cellular telephones in VILORIO'S bedroom. The cellular telephones were seized and booked into the Bakersfield Police Department property bearing this case number and the listed property numbers:

- 1 Property number 346212-007: Samsung cellphone in a black case
- 2 Property number 346212-008: Cellular telephone with pink charger pack
- 3 Property number 346212-009: Samsung cellphone in red case
- 4 Property number 346212-021: Budget Mobile cellphone

By searching the listed cellular phones I believe officers could locate additional items of evidence related to the assault with a deadly weapon as well as confirm the identities of the owners of the cellular telephones.

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I know that subjects use their cellular phones on a daily basis. They will often times communicate with individuals via Short Message Service (SMS)/ Multi-Media Service (MMS)/texts messages/telephone calls and emails. This would include missed phone calls where a voicemail is left by an individual. By accessing/searching this data stored within the cellular phone I believe it would assist in the investigation in knowing what telephone numbers/email addresses the listed subjects were communicating with prior to and after the assault with a deadly weapon. I know that subjects will often times store telephone numbers/email addresses in their cellular phone under an individual's name/nickname/moniker. By accessing/searching the stored contact list I believe will assist in the investigation by providing the name name/nickname/moniker that the subjects associated each of the telephone number/email address with.

I know subjects will often times use their cellular phones to take and store digital photographs/media files. I believe by access the stored digital photographs/media files I believe will assist in identifying the listed subject's possible locations prior too/during/after the assault with a deadly weapon. I know that subjects will often times use their cellular phones internal memory to store data in digital notes/memo files/calendar. These files can often times be in a written format as well as digital voice format. I know subjects will use these files to store a variety of data, such as moneys owed to an individual, reminder of a meeting, personal note to remind the individual of an upcoming event, ECT. By accessing this data will help assist in the investigation by allowing officers to see if the listed subjects had any upcoming stored events or personal notes pertaining to the assault with a deadly weapon.

I know that subjects will often times use their cellular phone to access the internet and or utilize online applications (i.e. Facebook, Snapchat, Instragram, ect.) to commutate with individuals. I believe by accessing these stored files will again assist in the investigation by identifying the listed subjects user name/passwords/account information as well as the user names of the subject(s) he was communicating with prior to the assault with a deadly weapon. I know that will often times store a geo-location and/or Global Positioning System (GPS) locations will often times be created and stored within the cellular phone when certain files are created/accessed. I believe this will assist in the investigation by again providing the listed

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subjects location prior too/during and after the assault with a deadly weapon.

I know that subjects will often times delete data stored within the cellular phone (call logs, text messages, web browser history, and ECT.). I know that subjects will often times delete this data, to avoid detection by law enforcement, spouse, boyfriend/girlfriend, ECT. I know this deleted data will often times be stored within the cellular phone and can often times be recovered. I believe that allowing officers to recover and view this data will again aid in the investigation for the same reasons described above.

It is my belief that by inspecting the listed cellular telephones, officers will be able to recover additional evidence regarding the assault with a deadly weapon; including but not limited to communications regarding the offense, as well as information that will lead to the identity of possible additional suspects or witnesses.

Your affiant is also requesting permission, and upon granting of the permission, to have the Bakersfield Police Department and/or the Kem County District Attorney's Office image the above listed cellular phones and that it be the order of the court that the imaged data and contents of the cellular phones be considered the originals so the phones may be returned to the owners.

Based upon the aforementioned information, facts and circumstances, I have reasonable cause to believe that grounds for the issuance of a search warrant, as set forth in Section 1524 of the Penal Code, exist.

That based upon the above facts, I pray that a search warrant be issued for the seizure of said property, or any part thereof, and that the same be brought before this magistrate, or to any other court in which the offense in respect to which the property or things taken is triable, or retained subject to the order of this court pursuant to Section 1536 of the Penal Code.

I was task with handling the scene and related search warrants. The following is a description of the scene as it was when I arrived:

I noticed there was crime scene tape stretched across the roadway between 1811 and 1812 Lacey Street blocking westbound traffic. There was also crime scene tape stretched across the roadway between 1900 and 1901 Lacey Street blocking eastbound traffic. Crime scene tape was also blocking the driveway to 1821 Lacey Street. The front yard was bordered by chain link fencing. The driveway did not have a gate. I entered the driveway of 1821 Lacey Street and noticed the following vehicles parked side by side in the driveway facing south:

1999 Chevrolet Astro Van, Blue, CA#4HCC693

1996 Ford Explorer, White, CA#4KPK484

2010 BMW 4-door, Blue/gray, CA#7NPF784



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2003 Nissan Frontier Pickup, Yellow, CA#7C15941

The residence was made up of off-white stucco with brown trim. The gold colored numbers "1821" were affixed to the fascia above the north facing front door. The attached garage is offset from the west end of the residence with the garage door facing east. There are 4 large north facing front windows. I entered the residence through the north facing front door which led directly into the living room. There was a brown coffee table in the middle of the room with various food items and clutter on top. There was a couch with a brown and tan cover against the south wall of the living room. There was a white Lazyboy style chair against the north wall of the living room. There was a television on a stand in the northeast corner of the living room with a wood end table/lamp to the right of it. There was a baby stroller in the middle of the floor in front of the television. There was a dark colored leather couch against the east wall to the right of the end table. There was a wooden bar stool to the right of the couch.

There was a hallway leading westbound from the west wall of the living room. As you walk down the hallway the first door on the left was a bathroom. The first door on the right was a linen closet. The last two doors on the right were bedrooms. The second door on the left was a hot water heater closet. After the hot water heat closet was a linen cabinet and storage drawers. The last door on the left was a bedroom.

South of the living room was an L shaped wall that separated the kitchen from the living room. The kitchen was clean and the counters were basically bare aside from a few kitchen related items.

There was a through way to the east of the kitchen area that allowed access from the living room to VILORIO's bedroom. There was a rowing style workout machine in the middle of the floor in this area. There was also a coffee table turned upside down in this area. There was a Christmas tree in the southeast corner of this area, a few feet to the left of the opening leading into VILORIO's bedroom. Slightly to the right and in front of the opening to VILORIO's bedroom was an ironing board turned over on it's side. Along the west wall of this area (the outside of the east wall of the kitchen, were various piles of clutter.

As I entered VILORIO's bedroom I noticed it appeared to be an add-on to the residence. The roof sloped drastically high to low from north to south. The room was small. The length from north to south was longer than the width from east to west. The width could be covered in approximately 2-3 steps. There was a wooden closet door leaning against the west wall in the northwest corner of the bedroom. There was what appeared to be a middle row seat from a mini van sitting on the floor on the west side of the room facing inward. On top of the seat was a large machete style knife. The knife was lying lengthwise across the seat with the handle to the north and the blade to the south. There was what appeared to be a half-moon shaped blood stain near the tip of the blade. There was a white sheet hanging on the wall behind the seat covering the opening to a closet. A bed was in the southwest corner of the bedroom. The bedding appeared pulled down slightly to the north and there was a brown heavy blanket folded up on the foot of the bed (north end). There was a pillow without a pillow case on top of the brown blanket. There was a small wood stand at the foot of the bed with a dolphin themed statue on top. There was a second mini-van seat against the south wall of the bedroom facing inward. There were several large blood stains on the right side of the seat bottom and seat back as well as blood droplets



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on the left side of the seat bottom. There were blood droplets on the carpet to the front and left side of the seat. Continuing counter-clockwise through the room I observed an orange cardboard box with the top open on top of a counter made of one file drawer and a storage cabinet with a wood shelf on top. Inside the box were several exposed kitchen knives. The knives were only a couple of feet to the left of the seat on the south wall. There was also a desktop computer monitor on top of the shelf and tower style computer underneath. There was also radio equipment on top of the shelf. To the left side of the shelf was a small portable cabinet that contained various food items. There was a small white refrigerator to the left of the shelf approximately in the center of the east wall of the bedroom. Within the refrigerator was various food items. I noticed the refrigerator was not cold and several of the items inside were rotten. There were also numerous live cockroaches inside the refrigerator. There was a trash can, vacuum, and crock pot to the left of the refrigerator. There was a door leading outside to the left of those items on the north end of the east wall.

While examining the room I observed a large amount of clutter on the floor including trash, medical aid supply packaging, and several prescription bottles in VILORIO's name. I observed a pair of black handled scissors near the threshold of the door on the east wall. These scissors were not consistent with the style used by medical aid personnel. There was a green handled screwdriver on the north side of the doorway as well. There was another pair of scissors on the floor behind a blue plastic storage lid leaning against the wall. These scissors were also not consistent to those used by medical aid personnel. There was a large Husky brand screwdriver in a sheath on the floor at the foot of the bed. There was a black flashlight on the floor near the computer, later determined to have "stun gun" type capabilities, meaning it can provide an electric shock, possibly temporarily incapacitating whomever it is used against.

I exited the east door of the bedroom which led out to a covered patio. There were several furniture items and barbeque's. All of the items were covered with dirt/dust and spiderwebs. There was a small grass yard south of the patio that led around the back of the residence and to the west side.

On 10-7-16, at 0610 hours, Detective Davenport and I interviewed Sergeant Galland in regards to his involvement and observations related to this incident. This interview was recording with my digital recorder, the recording was later downloaded into DIMS. The following is a summary of the interview, refer to the recording for additional details.

Sergeant Galland was the first sergeant to arrive on scene of this incident.

I asked Sergeant Galland to explain to me what he recalled hearing and seeing in regards to this incident. He provided the following statement, uninterrupted by me.

Sergeant Galland advised he was on another call and was in the area of the Valley Plaza. He said he heard 1V4 ask for a supervisor and an ambulance code 3, at 1820 Lacey St. He said the voice sounded strained. He was unsure if the voice was Officer McIrvin or Officer Burdick. He was aware that all of the other supervisors were inavailable. He then began driving to the call. He did not recall which other patrol units responded to the call. He arrived on scene a few minutes later.

When Sergeant Galland arrived on scene, he saw Officer Hensley and Officer Skidmore just as they arrived and began to approach the residence. He said the room where the altercation occurred was on the east side of the residence, towards the rear. He approached that location and when he entered the room, he saw Officer Burdick applying chest compressions to the subject, later identified as JOSE VILORIO. Officer McIrvin was standing to JOSE VILORIO's right side. Sergeant Galland said he told Officer Hensley to obtain crime scene tape to cordon off the area and to start a crime scene log.

Sergeant Galland advised 'EMS' was not yet on scene when he first arrived. He said he told Officer Skidmore to obtain a camera and begin photographing the scene before 'EMS' personnel arrived on scene. Sergeant Galland advised that Officer Burdick and Officer McIrvin switched positions at least once, possibly twice.

Sergeant Galland advised Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick appeared tired, adding that Officer McIrvin appeared more tired than Officer Burdick. He said that they continued providing CPR until relieved by medical personnel. Once they were relieved, he walked outside with them and asked them what force was used against JOSE VILORIO. He said Officer McIrvin advised that closed fist punches and the carotid control restraint was used. Officer McIrvin advised that JOSE VILORIO had lost consciousness and he never regained consciousness. The officers realized JOSE VILORIO was not breathing, and they began to administer CPR.

Sergeant Galland advised he did not question the officers further in regards to the incident. He advised he treated this as a critical incident, obtaining only a public safety statement from the involved officers. He did so to ensure

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any evidence would be collected, to ensure there were no outstanding suspects. He also check to ensure that both officers were not injured and they did not require medical attention.

Sergeant Galland called for two additional patrol units. He stayed with Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick until the two officers arrived. Those officers were assigned to stay with Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick and they were instructed to keep the involved officers separated from each other. Senior Officer Galvan and Officer McWilliams were the two units who responded. They each drove one of the involved officers back to the Police Department and they remained with the officers until the officers were interviewed by detectives.

I then began asking Sergeant Galland some clarifying questions. I asked Sergeant Galland what was the purpose of obtaining a public safety statement. He said this was done to ensure there were no additional suspects, to determine if anyone needed medical attention. He was aware that JOSE VILORIO needed medical attention, which had already been called. Sergeant Galland advised this was also done to determine what force was used to help with the determination as to what evidence may need to be preserved, such as a taser cartridge, if a taser had been used.

I asked Sergeant Galland why he didn't obtain a more detailed statement from the involved officers in this situation. He advised he knew that detectives would be responding in a case such as this. He further advised he did not want to violate any potential rights the officers may have in regards to this situation.

Asked Sergeant Galland if he heard the initial call that the officers were dispatched to, he advised he did not hear the radio traffic. He advised that as he was arriving to the scene, he looked at the computer and saw the incident was a 'brandishing' call. He added that while he was on scene, and while listening to the victim, he learned this was actually an assault with a deadly weapon, not just a brandishing call. Sergeant Galland advised the victim, later identified as advised she told Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick this same information when they first responded to the scene.

I asked Sergeant Galland where the victim was located when he first arrived. He advised they were standing within the front yard of the residence, in the northwest area of the yard.

Sergeant Galland advised again that when he first arrived on scene, he saw Officer Burdick providing CPR to JOSE VILORIO. He advised they were in the south portion of the room, with back, with his head to the southwest. Officer Burdick was on JOSE VILORIO's left side, administering chest compressions, and Officer McIrvin was on his right side. Sergeant Galland advised both officers appeared exhausted and appeared to have been involved in a severe struggle.

I asked Sergeant Galland if he has been trained in the use of CPR, he advised he has been trained in CPR and he has used CPR in a real life situation. I asked him if the CPR he saw being performed on JOSE VILORIO was consistent with the training he has received, he advised it was consistent with his training and experience.

Sergeant Galland said JOSE VILORIO was handcuffed, to the front, with his hands up and over his head, when he saw him.

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Sergeant Galland advised Officer McIrvin was breathing hard and seemed to have a hard time talking. He further stated that when Officer McIrvin spoke more than a few words, he began coughing. He said that Officer McIrvin coughed several times and his voice sounded hoarse. Sergeant Galland said Officer Burdick was out of breath when Sergeant Galland first arrived. He said Officer Burdick seemed to recover quickly.

Sergeant Galland advised that when he initially entered the residence he entered through the east door, directly into the room where the struggle occurred. He said that as soon as he entered this room, the first thing he noticed was a machete sitting on a table just a few feet away.

Sergeant Galland described the room as being rectangular. He said the room was small, possibly 10' by 12' or 10' by 14'. He said the ceiling was low. He said this room looked like an addition to the residence. The door that led to the main residence appeared to be a sliding closet style door. He also recalled that there was a broken mirror on one of the doors. He recalled that there was a third row seat from a vehicle that was located on the far end of the room that had blood on it.

Sergeant Galland did not provide any further details.

Sergeant Toler explained he was on an unrelated call for service when he heard radio traffic involving Officer McIrvin asking for a supervisor and for medical aide, code-3 to respond to his call. Sergeant Toler advised he cleared the call he was on and responded to the request on Lacey Street. He said he arrived on scene about five minutes later. When he arrived on scene, Sergeant Galland was already on scene. He recalled that Officer Hensley, Officer Burdick and Officer McIrvin were on scene.

Sergeant Toler said he first made contact with Officer Hensley who had a crime scene log. He signed in and then entered the scene. He advised that both fire and ambulance personnel were already on scene and were administering CPR to the suspect, JOSE VILORIO. Sergeant Toler advised he made contact with Officer McIrvin, outside, at which time he could see that Officer McIrvin was breathing heavily. He asked Officer McIrvin if he was okay. Officer McIrvin responded that he was just out of breath and he commented on how strong JOSE VILORIO was.

Sergeant Toler responded inside the room briefly, and saw medical aide personnel administering CPR. He then walked back outside to help secure the scene.

I asked Sergeant Toler where Officer McIrvin was located when he first saw him, he advised he was in the driveway to the residence, near the corner of the house. Sergeant Toler could not recall where Officer Burdick was located when he first saw him at the scene, other than outside the residence.

I asked Sergeant Toler who was the scene supervisor in this incident. He explained that Sergeant Galland handled a majority of the supervisor duties. Sergeant Toler helped secure the scene and ensure that Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick were driven away from the scene by other officers.

Sergeant Toler said he spoke with Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick briefly. He inquired which officer had applied the carotid control hold. He said Officer McIrvin had told him he was the person who applied the control hold. Sergeant Toler said Sergeant Galland had informed him the carotid control hold had been used, but he was

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unsure as to which officer applied the hold. Sergeant Toler said he learned from Sergeant Galland what other force had been used, he did not obtain any direct statements from the involved officers.

Sergeant Toler said he entered the residence to view the scene. He said he entered through the east side door, directly into the room where the struggle occurred. I asked Sergeant Toler if he knew what medical intervention was being performed by medical personnel. He recalled they were administering chest compression and they had an oxygen mask on him. He said medical personnel were placing 'IV's' on him as well. Sergeant Toler said he believed there were officers in the room while the medical intervention was occurring, but he could not recall which officers were present.

Sergeant Toler described the size of this room to be about 10' - 12' wide and about 15' - 18' long. He said there were two third row SUV seats, a bed and possibly a table. He also recalled a table in the adjoining room which was turned over. He said someone said it was medical personnel who moved this table, but he did not know who specifically had moved this table.

I asked Sergeant Toler if he recalled seeing any weapons at the scene. He recalled seeing a large machete. He said the machete was sitting on one of the third row seats, to the right side of the room (west side). Sergeant Toler said he did not see anyone move the machete from this position while he was at the scene.

On 10-10-16 at approximately 0900 hours I responded to the Kern County Coroner's Office to attend the autopsy of VILORIO. Also attending the autopsy was Lab Tech Achtmann and Detective J. Moore. Dr. Y. Wang performed the autopsy. Dr. Wang's autopsy assistants were L. Shaibi and M. Wilcox. Upon entering the autopsy room I observed a black zipper body bag wrapped in a white sheet on the autopsy table. There was a blue plastic lock affixed to the zipper #27854. There was also a paper tag attached to the zipper with the following written on one side:

CO2174-16 Vilorio, Jose 10-05-16

The blue plastic lock #27854 was removed at 0900 hours. I noticed the body inside the bag was that of VILORIO, as he looked when I observed him being sealed inside on 10-05-16. VILORIO was nude other than partially covered with a hospital gown. VILORIO still had the intubation equipment in his mouth. He had IV's attached to both arms. There were approximately 5 EKG pads affixed to his upper torso. VILORIO had two green Velcro wraps around his lower legs. VILORIO's height was 69.5" and his weight was 286 pounds.

After the medical equipment/supplies were removed from his body, Dr. Wang examined VILORIO for external injuries. VILORIO had light redness/bruising to the right side of his forehead. VILORIO had bruising around his right eye similar to a "black eye." He also had bruising to the inside corner of his right eye near where the nose meets the eye. Dr. Wang said VILORIO had petechial hemorrhaging inside both right and left eyelids as well as in the whites of both eyes. VILORIO had bruising inside both his upper and lower lips.

Moving to his torso, VILORIO had a minor abrasion to his upper left ribcage approximately 1" in length. VILORIO also had scratch across the right side of his mid-back approximately 8" in length. VILORIO had an abrasion on his left forearm near his elbow approximately 3" in length. There was also a small circular red mark on this lower abdomen. VILORIO had linear bruising around his right wrist consistent with application of handcuffs. VILORIO had a small circular bruise to the right side of his abdomen approximately 1.5" in diameter. VILORIO had light colored bruising to the front part of his neck. There also was a minor abrasion to the back of VILORIO's left calf.

Dr. Wang observed bruising to the underside of VILORIO's scalp, consistent with blunt trauma but did not locate any skull fractures. Dr. Wang advised there was cerebral edema (excess fluid/swelling of the brain) which he said could have been caused by trauma or the carotid restraint. Dr. Wang said he did not locate any hemotomas within the brain. Dr. Wang advised the brain would be examined by a neuro-pathologist to confirm

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whether or not there was damage to the brain, pre-existing conditions, or other circumstances that may have caused/contributed to his death.

Dr. Wang located "bilateral acute lamina papyracea" fractures near both eyes. Dr. Wang described these as fractures involving the orbital bones. Dr. Wang advised these would be consistent with blunt trauma to the face/eye area.

Dr. Wang examined the inside of VILORIO's neck area and located muscular edema (bruising) to the muscles on the front of his neck. Dr. Wang said this would be common when the carotid restraint is applied. Dr. Wang advised the hyoid bone in VILORIO's neck was not damaged. Dr. Wang also advised the larynx was not damaged. Dr. Wang advised he did not locate any other injuries to VILORIO's neck besides the bruising to the muscular tissue.

Upon examining the chest cavity, Dr. Wang located approximately three broken ribs near the sternum on both sides and well as the sternum being fractured. Dr. Wang advised these types of fractures can be caused by CPR lifesaving practices. Dr. Wang advised he would not be able to determine if the fractures were caused by CPR or trauma. VILORIO did not have any external signs of trauma in these areas.

Dr. Wang advised VILORIO and an extremely enlarged heart, nearly twice the size of a normal human heart of momeone his age and size. Dr. Wang also advised there was significant arterial blockage. Dr. Wang also advised VILORIO had an enlarged liver.

Dr. Wang advised VILORIO was seen in the emergency room at Mercy Hospital for chest pains on 09-28-16. His blood pressure while at Mercy Hospital was 228/129. A diagnosis listed on VILORIO's medical record for that day was "A significant risk factor for acute coronary syndrome", commonly referred to as a heart attack. Dr. Wang advised VILORIO has previously been diagnosed with heart disease, hypertension, and diabetes. Dr. Wang did not go into detail about these diagnosis. Dr. Wang described VILORIO as being "Extremely vulnerable" due to his poor health. I asked Dr. Wang if he would be vulnerable to over exertion due to his poor heath and he answer "Oh yes." Dr. Wang advised he would reserve his final determination of cause/manner of death pending the results of toxicology and the neuro-pathologist's report.

I reviewed the police reports from Visalia PD.

10-09597 - Occurred 6-21-10. This report was for a spousal battery where JOSE VILORIO was listed as the suspect. The victim from this report was JOSE VILORIO's wife, who was three months pregnant with their child at the time. She claimed he placed his hands around her neck and pushed her repeatedly. The victim said this was an ongoing problem and said she no longer wishes to remain in a relationship with JOSE VILORIO. The victim in this case later became uncooperative.

12-12322 - 8-23-12. This report involves JOSE VILORIO as a victim of a car theft.

12-17835 - 12-14-12. JOSE VILORIO was the victim of a spousal abuse in this case.

13-01286 - 1-30-13. Domestic violence report where JOSE VILORIO was the suspect. The victim states she moved out and obtained a domestic violence restraining order after an incident that occurred in December of 2012. No specific details regarding the abuse were observed within this report.



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13-01502 - 2-4-13: Violation of domestic violence restraining order report. JOSE VILORIO is listed as the suspect.

13-09098 - 7-25-13. Criminal threats report where JOSE VILORIO is listed as suspect. This was a late reported incident where the victim, JOSE VILORIO's wife, claimed he showed her a rifle and told her if he learned she was dating someone else, that he would kill her and the children. JOSE VILORIO did not point the rifle at her during this incident.

#### Farmersville PD

13-0952 - 7-25-2013. I noted this report was for a violation of a domestic violence restraining order. When officers contacted JOSE VILORIO inside an apartment and in violation of his restraining order, they decided to arrest him and asked him to submit to them. JOSE VILORIO refused to comply with officers commands and he resisted arrest by striking officers. When officers attempted to use their taser to subdue him, he grabbed a hold of the taser and struggled with officers over the taser. One of the officers eventually utilized his taser in the dart mode. When the taser was deployed, it had no effect on JOSE VILORIO. JOSE VILORIO was able to remove the taser darts from his chest and he continued to struggle. Officers were eventually able to take JOSE VILORIO into custody. I noted that the officers later conducted a brief search of JOSE VILORIO's vehicle. They located and seized a machete from inside the vehicle. This incident resulted in JOSE VILORIO being arrested for the following charges;

PC 69 - Resisting arrest (2 counts)
PC 273.6 - Violation of court order (6 counts)
PC 273(a)(b) - Child endangerment

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#### FARMERSVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Narrative Report 13-0952

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NARRATIVE:

On Thursday, July 25, 2013, Officer Locke completed a SCAR follow up at CONFIDENTIAL residence in the 200 Blk of N. Steven. This SCAR report indicated that CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) had reported that she saw a rifle at Mr. Jose Vilorio's residence during a visit to his home one day. She said a few days later Mr. Vilorio told her if he ever saw her with another man, he would end her life as well as the children's lives. Refer to Visalia Police Department Case# 13-09098 for further information regarding this incident. Refer to FPD Case# 13-0941 for Officer Locke's report documenting the contact.

On Friday, July 26, 2013 at 1316 hours, I was dispatched to a confidential address in the 200 Blk of N. Steven, Farmersville, CA (Tulare County). This was the same address that Officer Locke had responded to the day prior.

Upon arrival, I responded to the apartment. As I walked up to the apartment, the door was already unlocked and opened. I contacted a male sitting on the couch, located along the east wall. The male was later determined to be Jose Vilorio. Mr. Vilorio had a young child, later determined to be CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) sitting on a coffee table in front of him, putting on a pair of shoes. By looking at Mr. Vilorio, it was apparent he was upset as he was sweating and having trouble putting the shoe on the child's foot.

I began to speak with Mr. Vilorio in English and asked what he was doing at the apartment. Mr. Vilorio said I should ask him what's going on instead. When he said this, his voice was raised and he appeared to be upset and agitated as he was still fumbling and trying to get the shoe on the child's foot. I asked dispatch to check and see if a restraining order was indeed on file and they later advised there was a DVRO on file with him being the restricted person.

Mr. Vilorio continued to sit there and fumble with the shoe and began to say he had her (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.)) permission to be there and that he was a citizen. After Officer Locke arrived on scene and dispatch had confirmed the DVRO, I had decided that Mr. Vilorio would be taken into custody for 273.6 PC, violation of the domestic violence restraining order.

I ordered Mr. Vilorio to stand up and place his hands behind his back. As I did this, Officer Locke attempted to remove CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) from the grasp of Mr. Vilorio. Mr. Vilorio responded by grabbing CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.), placing his arms around him in a bear hug type of grasp, and pulling him (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.)) tight towards his body. At this point I feared that Mr. Vilorio would use CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) as a shield to keep the police away from him. I did not know if Mr. Vilorio had any weapons for hid not know if Mr. Vilorios right arm, however he was sweaty and hairy and I could not grasp on to him. He also pulled away from my grasp (Citie Coke reached for Mr. Vilorios other arm and I was later told CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.)'s mother, CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) pulled him away from the scene.

Mr. Vilorio was upset, yelling and saying we were not going to do this to him. He was saying this in both English and Spanish. In a loud and clear voice-I-told-Mr.-Vilorio-to-place-his-hands-behind.

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his back. He refused to comply with verbal commands. As Officer Locke and I struggled to get a grasp on Mr. Vilorio he continued to actively push us away and not cooperate. I next took out my Taser, Model X26 (S/N X00-188247) removed the attached cartridge and attempted to perform a drive stun on Mr. Vilorio. He immediately responded by grabbing my Taser and attempting to remove it from my grasp. I held on to my Taser with both hands and pulled the trigger in an attempt to deploy it. The Taser did not respond and I did not gain any compliance from Mr. Vilorio. It appeared as if the Taser had malfunctioned as I did not see anything on the display. I was able to grab my Taser from Mr. Vilorio and place it back into my holster. Officer Locke was continuing to struggle with getting a grasp on Mr. Vilorio and he decided to deploy his Taser in an attempt to subdue him.

When Officer Locke deployed his Taser, Mr. Vilorio grabbed Officer Locke's Taser as well and began to struggle with Officer Locke over control of the Taser. Officer Locke verbalized to me that Mr. Vilorio had his Taser and was trying to take it from him. I immediately delivered an open hand strike to Mr. Vilorio's forehead area. At this time he reacted to my blow to the head area and released his grasp of the Taser. Both Officer Locke and I stepped back and again began to attempt to use physical force to get Mr. Vilorio to go into custody. Officer Locke struck Mr. Vilorio with his hand and I delivered a kick to the midsection of Mr. Vilorio. These strikes had no effect on him as he continued to hold his ground and refused to comply. After a few seconds of continuing to struggle with him, I grabbed Officer Locke's Taser, removed it from his holster, and placed my Taser cartridge (S/N H07-887598) into the Taser. I stood back approximately three feet and warned Officer Locke I was going to deploy it. Officer Locke cleared away from Mr. Vilorio and I was able to get a clear shot onto the abdomen/ chest area of Mr. Vilorio.

I pulled the trigger of the Taser and immediately heard the popping sound of the blast doors opening and saw the probes being projected towards Mr. Vilorio's midsection. As soon as the probes hit him, he took both of his hands, moved them up towards the area where the probes had struck, and began to remove them. It appeared the Taser did not have any effect again. This raised some concerns as we were running out of options.

I saw Officer Locke remove his collapsible baton; however I did NOT see him use it on Mr. Vilorio. I did see Officer Locke deliver another punch to Mr. Vilorio; however I did not see where it landed. I attempted to make a connection with the Taser using the drive stun method; however, Mr. Vilorio again resisted and began to fight back by flailing his arms towards me. Officer Locke was able to gain slight control of Mr. Vilorio and was able to take him to the floor. I still had a hold of the Taser and was attempting to deploy it by pulling the trigger and applying it to Mr. Vilorio using the drive stun method. Mr. Vilorio was still actively resisting Officer Locke and trying to grab his arms/ hands. I delivered two or three more kicks to the midsection, which still had not one was still actively resisting both of our attempts to take him into custody.

I was able to finally make a connection with the Taser to Mr. Vilorio's upper back/ shoulder area at which time he submitted and complied with verbal commands to place his hands behind his back. Officer Locke and I did NOT deliver any further strikes/ blows and used only the minimal amount of physical force necessary with our hands to place Mr. Vilorio into custody and place two sets of handcuffs on him.

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Mr. Vilorio was bleeding from his mouth/ head area and a Code 3 ambulance was immediately requested. Mr. Vilorio was assisted up to his feet and was asked to sit down on the couch. Mr. Vilorio did not want to comply with verbal commands to sit down, so I pushed him with only minimal force back towards the seat of the couch. As Mr. Vilorio began to sink onto the cushions of the low resting couch, he lost his balance and fell back, striking his head on a mantel piece located above him on the south wall. This was unintentional on my part as I did not notice the mantel piece there, otherwise I would have chosen a different place to seat him.

While waiting for ambulance personnel to arrive, Chief Krstic arrived on scene. Mr. Vilorio asked if he could speak to Chief Krstic and began talking to him in Spanish. I recorded most of the conversation using my digital recorder.

Mr. Vilorio was telling Chief Krstic that CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) has five children. He said four of them are from a drug trafficker named Genaro Garcia. He said the fifth child is his and is two years old (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.)). I then translated what Mr. Vilorio had said to Chief Krstic. At this point Mr. Vilorio turned to (W) Jesus Romero and asked him if he had seen him in the apartment complex before. (W) Romero acknowledged that he had. Mr. Vilorio said he has never had any problems when he has come to the apartment on prior occasions. He said today, he learned that Genaro Garcia, the father of the kids, was in California and CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) no longer wanted Mr. Vilorio to come here anymore. Mr. Vilorio acknowledged he has a restraining order against him; however CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) has given him permission to come over. He said today he came to see his son (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.)) and was desperate to see him. At this point (1332 hours) I stopped the tape as Fire and Medical personnel were on scene and I left to meet them and direct them to the apartment. It should be noted when I would translate what Mr. Vilorio had said and told Chief Krstic in English, Mr. Vilorio would affirm that what I was saying was correct.

I next checked myself and Officer Locke for any obvious signs of injury. I noticed on my right hand that I had suffered a small abrasion to my right index finger middle knuckle, which consisted of the loss of a small amount of skin. There was a small amount of bleeding and an open wound. The second injury I noticed was a small abrasion to my right middle finger where the top layer of skin was removed, but not deep enough to cause any bleeding or leave an open wound. The third injury was to the base of my right thumb just below the lower knuckle. A small piece of skin was removed and a small scab/ open wound were created. Other than general screness to the right foream, I did not notice or feel any other injuries.

Officer Locke had blood on his right hand and two small cuts. One of the cuts was to his right index finger on the middle knuckle. The other was on his right middle finger on the middle knuckle. The cuts were horizontal with the knuckle and caused minor skin loss and scabbing.

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I next obtained photographs of Officer Locke's injury, one photo of the injury to my left hand, and photographs of the apartment/ scene where this incident occurred. The scene consisted of the living room area of apartment and did not flow over into any other parts of the apartment.

After Mr. Vilorio had been treated by medical personnel, Officer Locke transported him to the Kaweah Delta Hospital for medical clearance prior to booking him into the Tulare County main jail.

I next conducted interviews of the witnesses and victims.

#### **JESUS ROMERO INTERVIEW**

At 1345 hours, I conducted a recorded interview with (W) Jesus Romero. (W) Romero is the maintenance person on the premises and was present when contact with Mr. Vilorio was made.

(W) Romero said when he arrived at the apartment, I (Sgt. Olmos) was in the living room along with a "guy" (Mr. Vilorio) and the baby (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.)). (W) Romero said as he walked in, he saw me standing next to the closet. He said he saw Officer Locke walk in and heard both Officer Locke and I ask Mr. Vilorio to stand up. (W) Romero said he heard Mr. Vilorio say, "No. Ask her what the order's for" referring to a restraining order that Mr. Vilorio stated was against him. (W) Romero said Mr. Vilorio grabbed CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) and pulled him in towards him (Vilorio's). (W) Romero said the lady (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.)) walked in and took CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) out of the apartment. (W) Romero said all of the other children ran up towards the apartment, but he kept them out of the apartment and told them to leave. (W) Romero said he closed the door and that's when Mr. Vilorio began to fight.

(W) Romero said he saw the officers trying to grab the arms of Mr. Vilorio, but Mr. Vilorio acted as if he wanted to fight back. (W) Romero said Mr. Vilorio was "putting his weight down" going against what the officers were trying to do. (W) Romero said the struggle went on for a few minutes and afterwards, heard me (Sgt. Olmos) say something about the Taser. He said afterwards, he saw Officer Locke take his Taser out however it did not work. He said he saw Mr. Vilorio grab Officer Locke's Taser as he tried to apply it. (W) Romero said after that, the officers had to use force. He said Officer Locke's elbow slipped at one point and struck Mr. Vilorio on the lip. He said Mr. Vilorio was exchanging punches with the officers.

(W) Romero said he saw me (Sgt. Olmos) try to grab Mr. Vilorio and take him down to the ground while Mr. Vilorio was yelling and acting crazy. (W) Romero said Mr. Vilorio was not cooperating and/ or moving despite our attempt to move him: (W) Romero said he saw me (Sgt.) Tolmos) grab Officer Locke's Taser and insert a cartridge into it as mine did not work. (W) Romero said he saw me deploy the Taser and Mr. Vilorio went down the said Mr. Vilorio did not stop fighting to mand saw Mr. Vilorio pull the prongs out. He said he next saw me take the Taser and apply it directly to Mr. Vilorio. He said eventually the officers were able to take the Taser and apply it directly

(W) Romero said he did see an officer strike Mr. Vilorio in the stomach with a knee, but not any other place. He said other than the elbow that slipped; hobody else struck Mr. Vilorio in the face. He said the officers tried to grab Mr. Vilorio's arms and place them behind his back. (W) Romero said

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once Mr. Vilorio gave up, the officers placed him into handcuffs and no other physical punches were applied.

(W) Romero said after Mr. Vilorio was handcuffed, the officers picked him (Vilorio) up and set him down on the sofa. I asked if Mr. Vilorio hit his head when he was sat down onto the couch. (W) Romero said Mr. Vilorio did hit his head and explained it was an older style, low sitting couch which sinks when you sit on it. He said it was not done on purpose and appeared to be accidental. He could not provide any further information.

### **CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) INTERVIEW**

At 1357 hours I conducted a recorded interview with CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.). This interview was conducted in SPANISH. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) identified the male who was at the apartment as Jose Vilorio and the child who was present with her as CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.).

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) said she was in a relationship with Mr. Vilorio and has a child from him. She said she had left their relationship and sought refuge at a woman's shelter. She said from there, they assisted her in obtaining a domestic violence restraining order against Mr. Vilorio. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) said that Mr. Vilorio had been contacting her, telling her he was going to change and to try and reconcile their relationship. She said he already knew where she lived but did not explain how he knew. She said he had come to her apartment approximately 10 times prior to this and there were not any problems. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) said she met Mr. Vilorio today because he claimed his car had been stolen and crashed. She said she told him that he had crashed it and he did not have insurance. She said she told Mr. Vilorio that this was it and she did not want anything else to do with him from here on out. She told him to stay away from the apartment and not to come around anymore.

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) said today, Mr. Vilorio had tried to call her repeatedly on the phone, but she did not answer. She said about 5 or 10 minutes later, Mr. Vilorio showed up at her apartment, opened the unlocked door, and walked inside the apartment. She said when he entered into the apartment he told her she and her kids were going to go back to Mexico. She said Mr. Vilorio also told her she is going to see who he is. She said she interpreted that as him meaning he was going to use her illegal alien status to contact a government agency and have her deported. She said she then called the police and told him to leave. She said he did not leave. She said she was waiting for him to take out a gun because she knows he has a rifle, referring to the report made with Visalia PD.

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) said she saw when the police arrived and saw Mr. Viloriositing on the couch with CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.). She said he did not want to give CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) to the officers. She said she saw Mr. Vilorio grab the child with force. She said she saw an officer take out their Taser and begin to use it on Mr. Vilorio She said she left the apartment after that.

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CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) said she fears that Mr. Vilorio is going to return and kill her. She said Mr. Vilorio did NOT make any threats today, but still fears him. She could not provide any further information.

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (AND. G.) INTERVIEW

At 1413 hours, I conducted a taped interview with CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (And. G.). CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (And. G.) said she was in a bedroom playing on the computer when her step dad (Mr. Vilorio) came into the apartment without knocking and walked down the hall, to her bedroom. She said Mr. Vilorio grabbed CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) and took him back to the living room. She said she and her other siblings walked to the living room and asked Mr. Vilorio where their mother (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.)) was. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (And. G.) said Mr. Vilorio told her CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) was outside. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (And. G.) said she did not see when the officers confronted Mr. Vilorio, but heard some screaming, heard the word "Taser" and then heard Mr. Vilorio yell "ouch." CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (And. G.) said she was scared that Mr. Vilorio was going to beat the police officers up and then go and hurt them. She said one time when she was visiting him; she saw a rifle at Mr. Vilorio's house in the kitchen. She said the rifle was not pointed at her, but she was scared of Mr. Vilorio nevertheless. I pointed out to her that I had a gun and asked her if she was scared of me and she said. "No." CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (And. G.) could not provide any further information.

**CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (ANT. G.) INTERVIEW** 

At 1418 hours, I conducted an interview with CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.). CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said he was in his bedroom with his siblings when Mr. Vilono walked into the apartment, walked to the back bedroom, and picked up CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) and took him to the living room. He said they entered into the living room and asked Mr. Vilorio where their mother was. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said Mr. Vilorio pointed towards the outside of the apartment. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said he and his siblings walked outside and that's when his mother (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.)) gave the phone to his older brother (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.)) who spoke to the police. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said Mr. Vilorio has come to the apartment a couple of times in the past. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said he did not hear Mr. Vilorio knock or ring the door bell.

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said Mr. Vilorio told CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) to go back into the apartment so they could fix the problem. He said CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) told Mr. Vilorio no and that the police had already been called. He said Mr. Vilorio responded, "Fine."-We will see what happens." CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant) Gi) said I showed up shortly afterwards and tried to talk to Mr. Vilorio. He said Mr. Vilorio refused to talk to me. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said he did not see anything else. He said (W) Romero told him to wait outside CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said he could hear Mr. Vilorio screaming and the officers telling him to put his hands behind his back. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said it did not sound like Mr. Vilorio was complying. He said the screaming became louder and could hear-Mr.-Vilorio saying not to touch him, that he was a citizen, and that the police could not do that. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said the officers were trying to calm Mr. Vilorio down and arrest him...He.said.he.was.on.the.staircase... listening to this unfold. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ant. G.) said he heard someone say Taser and saw

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the yellow tip of the Taser. He said he saw Mr. Vilorio go down, but was still not complying. He could not provide any further information.

#### **CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G.) INTERVIEW**

At 1424 hours, I conducted a taped interview with CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G). CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said he and his siblings were in his room on the computer. He said CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) was also in the room. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said Mr. Vilorio showed up at their bedroom door and took CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) with him to the living room. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said he and his siblings asked Mr. Vilorio to leave, but he refused. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said they went outside to find his mother and Mr. Vilorio was telling CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (F.V.) to come with him, CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said the police were called and when I arrived on scene, he and his other siblings began to walk up the stairs with me towards their apartment. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said I entered into the apartment and tried to talk to Mr. Vilorio. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said Mr. Vilorio started screaming at me and said Mr. Vilorio is always like that. He described Mr. Vilorio as an aggressive guy. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said Mr. Vilorio was holding CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) and appeared as if he did not want to let CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.) go. He said once Officer Locke arrived, we tried to arrest Mr. Vilorio: however he began to resist arrest. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said the police were asking Mr. Vilorio to put his hands behind his back and Mr. Vilorio responded by yelling back at the police officers, "No No No. Get your hands off me."

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said when he went outside he could not see anything else that happened inside the apartment, but that he could hear what was going on inside the apartment. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said Mr. Vilorio was resisting because he could Mr. Vilorio yelling and could hear the sound of a Taser going off. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said he heard officers telling Mr. Vilorio to place his hands behind his back. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said he believes MR. Vilorio did not comply because he heard the sound of a Taser. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said he could hear movement (scrambling) coming from inside the apartment. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said he could hear the officers saying, "Put your hands behind your back. Quit resisting."

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said his mother then took the other siblings with her to the apartment offices. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) said the only thing he actually saw was in the beginning of the confrontation between the officers and Mr. Vilorio. He said the officers were standing next to Mr. Vilorio who was seated on the couch. He said he saw the officers try to grab Mr. Vilorio's hands and Mr. Vilorio began to resist.

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) commented that Mr. Vilorio is crazy. He said Mr. Vilorio is manipulative as well. He said Mr. Vilorio's personality is also kind of crazy to him and said when Mr. Vilorio was yelling that he was a citizen and you can't do this to me, made CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (G.G) think Mr. Vilorio was crazy and loud. He could not provide any further information.

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CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (ALE.G.) INTERVIEW

At 1432 hours, I conducted a recorded interview with CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.). CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said he was in his room playing on his iPad computer. He said while he was on his computer, he saw Mr. Vilorio enter into the room and grab CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (C.V.). CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said he saw Mr. Vilorio on the couch talking to the baby and asked where his mother was. Mr. Vilorio pointed towards the outside of the apartment and he (CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.)) walked outside where his mother passed him her cellular phone and he provided the police dispatcher with the information. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said as they (siblings) were walking down the stairs, he asked them to come back into the apartment. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said I arrived within a minute or two and he and his siblings followed me up the stairs. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said he could hear me talking with Mr. Vilorio. He said they went back downstairs and saw Officer Locke arrive. He said after Officer Locke went into the apartment, they began to walk up the stairs, but were denied entry into the apartment by the maintenance man (Jesus Romero).

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said he was able to see Mr. Vilorio getting tased. He said the officers were on top of him and Mr. Vilorio was actively resisting and fighting. He said he then went downstairs where he could hear the officers yelling at Mr. Vilorio to place his hands behind his back and telling him to stop. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said he could tell there was something going on and could tell Mr. Vilorio was resisting arrest. He said he did not actually see the Taser, but could hear it.

CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said he at first heard Mr. Vilorio say not to touch him and raising his voice when I was talking to him (Mr. Vilorio). He said he heard when Mr. Vilorio yelled at me to ask him (Vilorio) why he (Vilorio) was here (inside apartment). CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said at that point he went downstairs and did not see anything else. CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM (Ale. G.) said Mr. Vilorio is always getting angry, but today was the worst he has ever seen him. He could not provide any further information.

I returned to the Police Department and located a copy of the DVRO. It is filed under case# VFL249932 and was filed on January 10, 2013 and in effect until January 10, 2016. #### **NARRATIVE:**

7-26-13 / 1312 hours;

I was working uniformed patrol in my marked Farmersville Police unit. Units were dispatched to a confidential address in the City of Farmersville for a possible trespassing. Dispatched further advised it was a possible violation of a domestic violence restraining order in progress.

I arrived on scene and met with confidential victim; ALE.G who was on the west side of the building. I asked ALE.G if the subject inside of the residence was his stepdad and he said "Yes." I then met with FPD Sgt. Olmos who was inside the residence. I observed an older male subject sitting on the couch who was identified as Jose Vilorio. I observed Vilorio to have a small, male toddler on the coffee table and was placing shoes on him. It should be noted I recognized the toddler to be Vilorio's son from a prior contact on 7-25-13 while I was conducting a SCAR follow-up where Vilorio was allegedly making threats to kill confidential victim FV and her children. Refer to FPD case number 13-0941 and the City of Visalia's Police Department case number 13-09098 for further.

I attempted to retrieve CV, who was still sitting on the table while Vilorio was tying one of CV's shoes. Vilorio quickly grabbed CV and started to pull him closer to him. At this point I grabbed Vilorio's left arm in an attempt to free CV. While struggling with Vilorio, CV was released and removed from the area.

Sgt. Olmos and I ordered Vilorio to the ground multiple times however he did not comply. I attempted to grab Vilorio and take him from the couch to the ground however Vilorio resisted and I was unsuccessful. I heard Sgt. Olmos state his taser was not working so I retrieved my department issued taser (X26P serial number ZZX1300VC), removed the probe cartridge and drive stunned Vilorios on his left side / back area which had a minimal effect. Vilorio's continued to struggle and resist.

I attempted to drive stun Vilorio's again and he grabbed onto my taser. I ordered Vilorio's to let go of my taser and he did not. I began to strike Vilorio's with a closed fist, on his right side of his body while holding onto my taser with my left hand. Vilorio's released his grip on my taser allowing me to re-holster my taser.

I continued to strike Vilorio's with a close fist to the right side of his torso, approximately four to five times, which had no effect. I struck Vilorio on the right side of his face once, which had no effect as well. I grabbed Vilorios by his left arm and was able to wrestle him to the ground where Sgt. Olmos and I continued to struggle with taking Vilorios into custody.

While struggling with Vilorio on the floor, I struck him with a closed-figt, on the right side of his face check and mouth area and ordered him to place his hands behind his back. While Vilorio continued to struggle reas able to place him into handcuffs. Sgt. Olmos requested medical to respond code three due to Vilorio bleeding from his mouth.

After Vilorio was assessed by the medical personnel I transported Vilorio to Kaweah Delta District Hospital (KDDH) where he received six sutures to his upper lip.

While at KDDH Vilorio spontaneously stated, multiple times "Its ok my friend, the next time will be my time." I asked Vilorio what he meant by his statement and he just repeated it. It should be noted Vilorio's only complaint of paint at KDDH was to his shoulders from being handcuffed.

Once Vilorio was cleared from KDDH I transported him to the Tulare County Main Jail to interview and book him.

Prior to booking I took digital photographs of Vilorio and of his injuries which were later logged into the Farmersville Police Departments digital evidence. With the assistance of TCSO Deputy Flores, Vilorio was read his rights pursuant to Miranda to which he invoked. Vilorio was booked without further incident.

As a result of Vilorio resisting arrest I received two lacerations to two of my fingers on my right hand. Sgt. Olmos photographed my injuries which were later logged into the Farmersville Police Departments digital evidence.


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#### LACERATION, LIP & MOUTH

A faceration is a cut through the skin. When the cut is on the outside of the lip, it may be closed with stitches, tape closure ("Steri-Strip") or sometimes Dermabond skin glue. Cuts inside the mouth may be sutured or left open, depending on the size. When stitches are used in the mouth, they are usually the kind that dissolve.



#### HOME CARE:

- HOWIE GAME:

  1. Eat soft foods to reduce pain when chewing.

  2. If the cut is <u>inside</u> your mouth, clean the wound by rinsing your mouth after each meal and at beddime with a mixture of equal parts water and hydrogen peroxide (do not swallow!). Or, you can use a cotton swab (Q-tip) to apply hydrogen peroxide directly onto the cut.

  3. Mouth wounds can be painful when eating. You may use a local numbing solution such as Anbesol (comes in Baby, Regular and Maximum strength) for pain relief. If this is not available, you may use any numbing solution for teething babies. You may apply this directly to the same with a contention with your finger. to the sores with a cotton-tip swab or with your finger.
- A. If the cut is on the <u>outside</u> of the lip and subres were used, you may shower as usual after the first 24 hours, but do not put your head under water until the subures are removed. After removing the bandage, wash the area with soap and water. Use a wet cotton swab (Q-tip) to loosen and remove any blood or crust that forms. After cleaning, apply a thin layer of Polysporin or Bacitracin outment. This will keep the wound clean and make it easier to remove the stitches. You may apply a Band-Aid or leave the wound open.

  5. If steri-strips were used, keep the area clean and dry. If it becomes wet, blot it dry with a
- towel. They will usually fell off after about 5 days.
- 6. If dermabond skin glue was used, do not scratch, rub or pick at the adhesive film. Do not place tape directly over the film. Do not apply liquid, ointment or creams to the wound while the film is inplace. Do not clean the wound with peroxide and do not apply ointment. Avoid activities that cause heavy sweating until the film has fallen off. Protect the wound from prolonged exposure to smallight or tanning lamps. You may shower as usual but do not soak the wound in water (no swimping). the wound in water (no swimming).
- 7. If you were given an antibiotic to prevent infection, take it until it is all gone.
- 8. You may use acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil) to control pain, unless 7 - 15 THE REAL PROPERTY. another pain medicine was prescribed. [NOTE: If you have chronic liver or kidney disease of ever had a stornach ulcer or GI bleeding, talk with your doctor belong hing these medicines. LICE DEPT.

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#### FOLLOW UP:

Cuts in and around the mouth heal in about five days. However, even with proper treatment, a wound infection sometimes occurs. Therefore, check the wound daily for the warning signs listed below. Stitches should not be left in the face for more than five days; otherwise, permanent stitch marks may form. Unless told otherwise, you may remove steri-strips yourself after five days, if they have not already fallen off. If dermabond skin glue was used, the film will fall off by itself in \$-10 days. by itself in 5-10 days.

- Increasing pain in the wound Fever over 100.0°F (37.8°C) oral, or over 101.0°F (38.3°C) rectal

On Monday, October 3, 2016, at approximately 0130 hours, I (Police Laboratory Technician Achtmann #L10) received a telephone call from Sergeant Coronado, who informed me I needed to respond to 1821 Lacey Street, to process the scene of an in custody death.

While I was en route to the Bakersfield Police Department east station, I received a telephone call from Lieutenant Heredia, who stated I would need to stay at the station to photograph and process involved officers, prior to responding to the scene.

I arrived at the Bakersfield Police Department at 0205 hours and made contact with Officer McIrvin in the Investigations lounge. I completed overall photographs of Officer McIrvin; I also completed mid-range and close up photographs, with scale, of the red colored stains on both of his arms and pant legs. I collected a swab of the red stains from each arm and each leg using a set of sterile cotton tipped applicators (four total). I also collected a swab from Officer McIrvin's left arm using a set of sterile cotton tipped applicators. The swabs were later booked into the Bakersfield Police Department's property room under evidence tag: #346209. After I processed Officer McIrvin, I completed overall photographs of Officer Burdick.

I cleared the station at 0238 hours and responded to the scene. I arrived at the scene at 0245 hours and made contact with Sergeant Coronado, Detective Davenport, Detective Burich and Detective Sporer. Detective Moore, Detective Kennemer and Sergeant Kroeker were also present. Due to the processing of the involved officers, I missed the initial briefing. Detective Davenport informed me that roommates live inside of the residence and there were allegations that one of the roommates, JOSE CESAR VILORIO, was responsible for stealing phone(s) and currency from a female who was visiting the residence. Due to the allegations, a peace disturbance ensued and later escalated to VILORIO brandishing a machete at the visitors and his roommates. At that point, the Bakersfield Police Department was called. Once officers arrived, the suspect resisted arrest, which resulted with him going into cardiac arrest.

I then asked Sergeant Coronado if photographs needed to be completed of VILORIO, who was at San Joaquin Hospital. Sergeant Coronado stated said photographs needed to be completed, so I cleared the scene at 0315 hours and responded to San Joaquin Hospital. I arrived at San Joaquin Hospital at 0326 hours. I completed overall photographs of VILORIO and close up photographs of injuries I observed on his face and right forearm and hand. All photographs of the injuries were completed with scale. After photographs were completed, I received a telephone call from Sergeant Coronado asking that I stay at the hospital and seize the blood draw from VILORIO; however, I would need Detective Davenport to respond with the warrant. Detective Davenport responded to San Joaquin Hospital with the blood draw kit, which was performed by Registered Nurse R. Hurtado at approximately 0530 hours. I seized the blood draw and kept it in my possession until it was booked

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into the Bakersfield Police Department's property room under evidence tag: #346210. I cleared the hospital at 0537 hours and responded back to the scene.

I arrived at the scene at 0548 hours. I completed initial photographs of the exterior and the interior of the entire residence. After photographs, I completed an initial video recording of the entire residence. It should be noted the north bedroom was locked at the time of scene processing. The resident with the key was at the Bakersfield Police Department for interviews. Therefore, the bedroom was not photographed or included in the video recordings. A walk through of the scene was completed and all obvious items of evidence were identified. These items were confined to the southeast converted bedroom (where the officers contacted VILORIO) and the adjacent dining room. The items of evidence included a screwdriver with a green handle, scissors with a black handle, a machete and swabs of a red stains on the car seats along the west and south walls. 

A physical extraction is the preferred method because it is a bit for bit copy of the memory from the device; with a physical extraction, it is possible to recover deleted content. A logical extraction will normally copy content from the device which can be viewed by a user; normally a logical extraction will not recover deleted content. Once an image is acquired, it can be viewed using the UFED software and a report can be constructed containing the contents from the device. It shall be noted that the Cellebrite UFED does not support every extraction type on every device.














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
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
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#### **Exam Findings**

Using the Cellebrite forensic software, I compiled a UFED review package of the contents obtained during the aforementioned extractions. The UFED review package was copied to a USB flash drive, which was provided to Detective Burich for further analysis.

The Motorola Droid Turbo 2 cellphone was returned to Detective Sporer on Tuesday 10/04/2016.

I returned the Samsung Galaxy On 5 cellphone (PR346212-7) and Alcatel A464BG cellphone (PR346212-8) to the Bakersfield Police Department property room on Thursday 10/06/2016.



INVESTIGATING OFFICER: SERGEANT J. MOORE #802

**SCENE DESCRIPTION:** 1821 Lacey Street is a single family residence. The use of force occurred in a bedroom located on the south east portion of the home.

For further refer to Detective Davenport's supplemental report accomplished under the criminal investigation, report #2016-232141(Pages 85 through 87). Also refer to the photographs taken and the crime scene diagram completed by Crime Lab Technician C. Achtmann #L10.

#### SUMMARY:

Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick responded to a report of a subject brandishing a machete and making threats at 1821 Lacey Street. During the arrest Officer McIrvin punched the suspect numerous times in the face and applied a carotid control hold. The suspect later died. An autopsy was performed by Dr. Y. Wang and he believed the death was a homicide. The case was reviewed by Dr. F. Sheridan and he determined the death to be from a heart attack.

# **DETAILS / STATEMENTS:**

# STATEMENT OF INVOLVED OFFICER TIMOTHY MCIRVIN, # 1043

Officer McIrvin said on October 02, 2016, he was working a two man unit with Officer Burdick.

He said he heard the call of a subject brandishing a machete at 1821 Lacey Street and he drove his vehicle to that location and contacted the reporting party, Cizabain Ruiz, Cizabai

Officer McIrvin was told by the suspect was wearing a blue shirt and was still in the house with other people and was still armed with the machete.

Officer McIrvin said he and Officer Burdick entered the back converted bedroom and came into contact with Jose Vilorio; however, he was not wearing the same clothes as described and his demeanor made the officers believe he was not involved. Officer McIrvin said as they were searching the residence for the suspect, they were directed back to Vilorio by and told he was the suspect.

Officer McIrvin said upon re-contact with Vilorio, he observed a machete behind Vilorio on the bench he was sitting on. Officer McIrvin said Vilorio was uncooperative and while taking him into custody he struck him in the face numerous times to stop him from acquiring the machete and gain control of him. Officer McIrvin said he punched Vilorio 10 to 12 times in the face area but was not able to stop Vilorio or gain control of him. Officer McIrvin said he applied the carotid hold on Vilorio for about 15 to 20 seconds rendering him unconscious. Officer McIrvin said Vilorio was handcuffed and placed in a "recovery position."

Officer McIrvin said Vilorio was breathing and had a pulse just after the carotid hold was released but after about five seconds Vilorio stopped breathing and had no pulse. Officer McIrvin said he immediately called for emergency medical aid and a supervisor. Officer McIrvin said he and Officer Burdick continually administered CPR to Vilorio until it was taken over by medical responders.

# STATEMENT OF INVOLVED OFFICER ZACHARY BURDICK, # 1223

Officer Burdick said he was working a two man unit with Officer T. McIrvin on the night of the incident. He said he was the passenger and Officer McIrvin was driving. He said they received a priority call reporting a subject was brandishing a machete at 1821 Lacey Street. He said they were told the suspect with the machete was still in the house with three other people inside.

Officer Burdick said they responded to the scene and were informed by the reporting party that Jose Vilorio was the suspect and they were directed to him. Officer Burdick said that as Officer McIrvin went to contact Vilorio and attempted to gain control of his left arm, Vilorio attempted to pull away and sat back down on a vehicle bench seat. Vilorio began to grab for an item that was behind him on the seat with his right hand. Officer Burdick said during this time Officer McIrvin punched Vilorio eight to ten twelve times in the face to gain control of him.

Officer Burdick said he grabbed a machete that was under Vilorio as Officer McIrvin was applying the carotid hold to Vilorio. Officer Burdick said he moved the machete to the table to the front of Vilorio and just out of his reach. Officer Burdick said Officer McIrvin applied the carotid hold for about 10 to 15 seconds rendering Vilorio unconscious. Officer Burdick said he handcuffed to Vilorio to the front of his body.

Officer Burdick said he saw Vilorio was not breathing and requested emergency medical aid over the police radio. Officer Burdick said he performed CPR until medical aid arrived.

# STATEMENT OF WITNESS OFFICER SERGEANT M. GALLAND, # 1027

Sergeant Galland said he was working as a supervisor the night of the incident. He said he was in the area of the Valley Plaza Mall on an unrelated call when he heard either Officer McIrvin or Officer Burdick request a supervisor and medical aid to respond to 1821 Lacey Street. Sergeant Galland said upon his arrival, he saw Officer Burdick administering CPR compressions to Vilorio and directed officers to photograph and secure the scene.

Sergeant Galland said he noted Officer McIrvin appeared to be fatigued as Officer McIrvin and Officer Burdick took turns with the CPR compressions.

# STATEMENT OF WITNESS OFFICER SERGEANT W. TOLER, # 924

Sergeant Toler said he was on an unrelated call when he heard the radio traffic involving

Officer McIrvin requesting emergency medical aid. He said he responded to the scene and
other officers and Sergeant Galland had already arrived. Sergeant Toler said medical

personnel were on scene and were giving Vilorio medical aid. Sergeant Toler said he briefly spoke to Officer McIrvin and noted he seemed fatigued and out of breath. Officer McIrvin mentioned how strong Vilorio was to Sergeant Toler.

# STATEMENTS OF WITNESSES:

There were four witnesses that observed the behavior of Jose Vilorio prior to officers responding to the residence. None of the witnesses advised they witnessed any of the force that was used by officers during this incident. The two original witnesses were also victims of the brandishing of the machete and the threats Vilorio made. Two witnesses are house mates of Vilorio that reported he was acting in a confrontational and aggressive manner to them prior to the incident. Refer to BPD GO# 16-232141 for further details regarding witness statements.

# **AUTOPSY REPORT:**

On October 10, 2016 Dr. Y. Wang of the Kern County Coroner's Officer conducted an autopsy of Jose Vilorio. Dr. Wang wrote in his report that he believed Vilorio's death to be a homicide. He also noted Vilorio was in poor health. In consultation with the Kern County District Attorney's' Office another expert was contacted. Dr. F. Sheridan was retained and reviewed the case. On May 30, 2017 he determined Vilorio died from heart related issues and it was a natural death.

# **INVESTIGATION:**

On October 3, 2016 at approximately 0200 hours, I was off-duty when I was contacted by Sergeant Kroeker. He requested I respond to 1821 Lacey Street to conduct an administration investigation into an In Custody Death, investigated under BPD GO# 16-232141. Upon arrival, I made contact with Sergeant Kroeker and attended a briefing of the incident. Detective Davenport documented the scene under the criminal investigation report #2016-232141. The scene was photographed by Bakersfield Police Department Crime Scene Technician C. Achtmann #L10. For further refer to her supplemental reports. I attached a CD with the digital photographs. I also monitored witness interviews while at 1821 Lacey Street and I monitored, via CCTV, the interviews of Officer Timothy McIrvin and Officer Zachary Burdick. Both Officers gave voluntary interviews without attorneys or union representatives.

On October 7, 2016 I monitored, via CCTV, the interviews of Sergeant M. Galland and Sergeant W. Toler.

On October 19, 2016 I obtained a copy of the Master Audio Log which included the 9-1-1 calls and BPD radio traffic. I later reviewed the General Offense Report accomplished by Officer Michael Malley # 1046 and the related supplemental reports including the reports by Lead Detective Ken Sporer.

On May 30, 2017 Dr. F. Sheridan completed his report determining Vilorio died from heart related issues and it was a natural death.

On May 22, 2017 I conducted a presentation surrounding the In Custody Death Investigation to the Bakersfield Police Department Review Board, who found that the actions and use of force by the officers in this case were within State and Federal Law and Department Policy.

On June 14, 2017 I conducted an open internet search for media articles involving mention of this In Custody Death Investigation. I attached all articles as well as the Bakersfield Police Department News Releases.





On October 2, 2016, at about 11:50 p.m., Bakersfield Police officers responded to a residence in the 1800 block of Lacey Street for a report of a subject brandishing a machete and making threats to kill.

Upon arrival officers were told that the suspect had stolen several items and when the victims tried to get the property back the suspect brandished a machete and threatened to kill them. When the officers attempted to detain the suspect, he resisted and force was used to take him into custody. Once the suspect was taken into custody the officers noticed that he was not breathing and they were not able to locate a pulse. The officers immediately began CPR and continued providing it until they were relieved by Hall Ambulance personnel. The suspect was transported to a local hospital where he remains in critical condition.

The suspect was arrested for terrorist threats, assault with a deadly weapon, and resisting an officer. A machete was recovered.

The incident is being investigated as a Critical Incident as per policy. Two officers involved in the arrest were placed on administrative leave pending a review by the Critical Incident Review Board.



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Coroner releases cause of death for man arrested by Bakersfield police

BAKERSFIELD, Calif. (KBAK/KBFX) — The Kern County coroner's office on Tuesday reported a 63-year-old man died of blunt force trauma and neck compression after an encounter last October with Bakersfield police.

Police said Jose Vilorio resisted arrest, and they had to use force to restrain him.

The coroner's report also said the manner of death is a homicide.

"Homicide is just a definition of what it is for one person to take another person's life," police Sgt. Ryan Kroeker told Eyewitness News. "It doesn't necessarily imply any kind of wrongdoing."

He said there are also different layers of homicide, such as justifiable or not justifiable, and the department's critical incident board will review what happened, and determine if the officers' actions were appropriate.

Two officers had responded to the house Vilorio rented on the 1800 block of Lacey Street, living there with three other men.

eker said the department got a call from a woman who said she was in distress.

The coroner's office said Vilorio's death was caused by "blunt force trauma with neck compression." Kroeker said the officers used a 'otid control hold."

"And, basically a carotid is a type of control hold that is used by law enforcement officers in situations where it's appropriate," Kroeker said.

"They squeeze the side of the neck. It's not a choke, it's not a strangulation, it's a control hold, and it's designed to basically render the subject unconscious very quickly."

He said the officers immediately checked on Vilorio's condition, started CPR, and called for medical aid.

Once in custody, Vilorio was found not breathing and was taken to a hospital, where he later died.

The man's family questioned the police account (http://bakersfieldnow.com/news/local/family-of-man-who-died-in-hospital-after-being-arrested-wants-answers) of the events. They retained attorney Daniel Rodriguez to investigate Vilorio's death.

On Tuesday, a spokesman at Rodriguez' office said they had filed a government claim against the city in December, which was rejected in January. They now plan to file a lawsuit, and were set to do that even before the coroner's report was issued.

Asked about the threat the officers faced, Kroeker said the machete was in the room during the confrontation with Vilorio, but he couldn't vide any more details on that.

He also said neither officer was injured, and both are now on "modified duty," doing work at the police department, but not on patrol.

Vilorio's family told Eyewitness News last October that just before the incident with police, he had just been in the hospital for a stroke. They think he had been too sick to pose a threat to the officers.

Kroeker said the coroner's report was one of the last things the department critical incident board needed for their review, and they could come out with their report in the next few weeks.

He said the Kern County District Attorney's office will also review the incident.

Police say Vilorio did not follow the officers' orders, and resisted arrest. Kroeker called the death a "tragedy," but said even a 63-year-old can be dangerous, especially with a machete.

"He did not do what the officers told him to do, and ultimately force had to be used," Kroeker said. "I would just urge citizens to comply with officers when they're asked."



# Family of man who died in hospital after being arrested wants answers

BAKERSFIELD, Calif. (KBAK/KBFX) — The family of a Bakersfield man who died in the hospital after being arrested has many questions no answers.

"He was a man of God, and he was a very devoted dad," said Sarai Lorenzana, daughter of Jose Viloria.

Viloria rented a room at a house on the 1800 block of Lacey Street along with three other men who had their own separate room. According to police, on Sunday night one of the men reported Viloria had stolen several items, and when the owners tried to retrieve their property, Viloria threatened them with a machete (http://bakersfieldnow.com/news/local/bpd-man-wielding-machete-arrested-forassault).

Police claim Viloria resisted arrest, and they had to use force to restrain him. Once in custody, Viloria was not breathing and was taken to a local hospital.

The 63-year-old man died on Wednesday. Another daughter questions police version of events, saying she had just visited her father two days before.

e had found out that he had a stroke and he was in the hospital," said Viveny Aceves. "He was very, very sick."

The family has retained Bakersfield attorney Daniel Rodriguez to investigate Viloria's death.

"It doesn't add up, it doesn't make any sense," said Rodriguez. "He'd just suffered a stroke, he'd just gotten back from the hospital. Does that sound like a man who could put up any kind of resistance?"

A man who would not give his name who also lives at the house with Viloria said he was not there Sunday night when the incident happened. He said Viloria had a quick temper and often had verbal disputes with others who lived there.

A photograph taken of Viloria in the hospital after his arrest shows him with his eyes shut and swelling all around his face. The cause of death remains unknown.

"I couldn't recognize my dad when I went into the (hospital) room where he was," said Lorenzana.

Rodriguez said Viloria had no criminal record and was a retired landscaper. He moved to Bakersfield about a year ago to be close to family members and attended Seventh-day Adventist Church.

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

# custody death may be result of carotid artery hold

A 63-year-old Bakersfield man arrested by city police officers in October died soon after his arrest as a result of injuries he suffered during a struggle with the officers, the Kern County coroner's office said Tuesday.

A post-mortem examination and additional testing showed Jose Cesar Vilorio died as a result of "blunt force trauma with neck compression." The manner of death was determined to be homicide, a term that simply means the killing of one person by another, justified or not.

A Bakersfield Police Department spokesman confirmed Tuesday that a carotid restraint control hold — a neck hold that, when applied properly, causes an abrupt, but proponents say, safe reduction of blood to the cerebral cortex leading to unconsciousness — was used by one of the officers.

The incident unfolded at about 1 a.m. on Oct. 3 after BPD officers Zachary Burdick and Timothy McIrvin responded to the 1800 block of Lacey Street to reports that Vilorio was brandishing a machete and making threats. Witnesses told officers that Vilorio had robbed several people and threatened to kill them as they attempted to reclaim their property.

Vilorio resisted arrest, according to the BPD, and force was used to take him into custody. Vilorio stopped breathing following the altercation and officers were unable to find a pulse. They performed CPR on the unconscious Vilorio until an ambulance arrived.

He died at about 4 p.m. the following day.

The carotid artery hold and choke holds in general have a checkered history.

an Diego, controversy erupted during the 1990s when at least four people died, including a 16-year-old boy, after San Diego police used the carotid arrery hold to restrain them, according to a 2000 story in the San Diego Union-Tribune.

And, between 1975 and 1982, 16 men died after the application of choke holds by officers with the Los Angeles Police Department. According to the LAPD's reports, bar-arm holds were placed on five of the men, which cuts off the air passage.

Nine of the deaths occurred after officers used the carotid artery hold, and in two of the cases, there was some uncertainty about which hold was used.

"The carotid hold — it's a terrible idea, physically and medically," Los Angeles civil rights attorney Michael R. Mitchell told The Californian in 2006. Mitchell sought an injunction against the city of Los Angeles to bar the use of the control holds in the 1970s and 1980s.

Mitchell argued the case when it went before the U.S. Supreme Court in 1983. One count alleged that police officers "regularly and routinely" applied choke holds in situations where they are not threatened by the use of deadly force, and that numerous persons had been injured or killed as a result of the application of the carotid hold and other choke holds.

While the court did not side with Mitchell, the LAPD saw fit to raise the threshold for use, allowing the carotid hold only when there is an immediate threat of serious bodily injury or death.

The policy of the Bakersfield Police Department is not as strict.

However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the carotid control hold by BPD's sworn officers requires that the officer successfully completed department-approved training in the use and application of the hold. According to the the department's written policy, the hold may only be used when circumstances perceived by the officer indicate that such application reasonably appears necessary to control a violent or physically resisting subject, or advidual, who by words or action, has demonstrated an intention to be violent and appears to have the potential to harm officers, himself or others.

Proponents say the carotid hold, when correctly applied, chokes off the arteries that supply the brain with blood, resulting in a short period of unconsciousness but no permanent damage.

But even proponents of the hold acknowledge that a violent struggle by the subject makes the correct application of the hold more difficult.

In medical testimony in the Supreme Court case, pathologist A. Griswold asserted that the carotid control hold "is extremely dangerous in a manner that is at least as equally unpredictable as the bar arm control."

two officers in Vilorio's case, Burdick and McIrvin, were originally placed on paid administrative leave — routine in such cases — following the chober incident, pending an internal investigation. But the investigation could not be completed without the coroner's report, said BPD Sgt. Ryan Kroeker.

Currently Burdick and McIrvin are working on modified duty, Kroeker said. They are working from inside the building, not on the streets, until the internal investigation is complete.



A 63-year-old machete-wielding man accused of making terrorist threats and was injured last week as police took him into custody died in the hospital the day after his arrest, coroner officials announced Monday.

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On October 5, 2016 at 1000 hours, a call was received from Registered Nurse Lindsey Panick at San Joaquin Community Hospital Intensive Care Unit advising of the death of Jose Cesar Vilorio, a 63 year old Hispanic male. Previous information provided to the Kern County Sheriff's Office Coroner Section, by Detective Kenneth Sporer from the Bakersfield Police Department was the decedent was involved in an altercation with two police officers on October 3, 2016.

fied Supervising Deputy Coroner Annette Olague of the death and responded to the hospital, arriving at 1030 hours, on October 5, 2016. I met with Detective Rex Davenport, RN Panick and Police Laboratory Technician Candace Achtmann, in Room # 2101 of the ICU.

RN Panick stated the decedent arrived to the hospital via Hall Ambulance Service on October 3, 3016 at 0058 hours. He was admitted to the Intensive Care Unit on October 3, 2016 at 0600 hours. RN Panick said the decedent was placed on a ventilator due to his poor prognosis. Family was advised and were at bedside.

On October 4, 2016 at 0001 hours, the decedent was given a first brain pronouncement by Dr. Rolando Young. On October 4, 2016 at 1602 hours, the decedent was given a second brain pronouncement by Dr. Pejam Soheili. His admitting diagnosis was anoxic brain injury and a subarachnoid hemorrhage. The decedent did not have any surgeries.

Upon entering the room, I viewed the decedent lying supine on a gurney clad in a hospital gown. Multiple medical devices were intact including intravenous lines and an endotracheal tube. The decedent was warm to the touch and his hands appeared swollen. I observed bruising to the decedent's face and his right eye appeared swollen. Upon lifting the hospital gown up, I observed a contusion to his left and right side of his torso. Several small lacerations were noted to his right wrist, consistent with what appeared to be handcuff markings. Upon rolling him over, it was noted the decedent had fecal matter between his buttocks. The decedent was photographed by PLT Achtmann. For further information, refer to BPD case #BK16-232141.

The decedent was placed in a body bag and the blue lock tab # 27854, was sealed on October 5, 2016 at 1110 hours, and was witnessed by Det. Davenport.

The decedent was transported to the Coroner's Office for a forensic examination. Admission blood samples were obtained from San Joaquin Community Hospital Laboratory and placed with the decedent's body in the morgue.

mation provided by Det. Davenport was the following: On October 2, 2016 at 2351 hours, a 911 call was received from pants of a residence, located at 1821 Lacey Street, indicating the decedent possibly stole cellphones and money from his roommates. While officers were en route to the call, the call was changed to a priority call [PC 245 Assault with a Deadly Weapon] and information provided was the decedent was attempting to slash one of the guests at the residence [Elizabeth Ruiz], with a machete.

The occupants at the residence were as follows: Elizabeth Ruiz and her daughter, Misty Perez (22 months old) were both guests at the residence, Carlos Lopez, Manuel Ordoz, and Alexander Rodriguez, were all roommates and shared the residence with the decedent.

According to the occupants, the decedent was attempting to swing the machete at them and the lexited the residence to the front yard, called 911 and awaited law enforcement's arrival. Officer Zachary Burdick and Officer Timothy McIrvin arrived to the residence on October 3, 2016 at 0001 hours. They were advised the man with the machete was inside the residence. Officers entered the residence along the east side into a back bedroom. Officers encountered a male subject sitting in the bedroom on a "third row seat of a van" that was being used as a couch against the south wall. There were two of the "third row seats" in the bedroom, a few feet apart. Officers asked the male subject where the "suspect with the knife" was and he pointed towards the living room. Officers walked through the residence and did not locate anyone, at which time they opened the front door and the occupants explained the male subject in the bedroom was the suspect.

Officers entered the bedroom again and observed the decedent sitting in the same spot on top of a large machete. The blade of the machete was approximately 30 inches long, which BPD later seized. They ordered him to stand up, at which time he did, but he refused to walk away from the "couch." Officer McIrvin guided the decedent to walk away from the couch by placing his hand on the decedent's elbow. At that time, the decedent reached down towards the couch and attempted to grab the machete. Officer McIrvin quickly grabbed the decedent's arm and they began to wrestle towards the ground. Officer McIrvin began to strike the decedent, approximately 10-15 times with his fist to the decedent's face. It had no effect on him. Officer Burdick kneed the decedent a couple times in his torso. All three wrestled around and at some point, the decedent ended up on his knees in front of the couch and his upper body leaning over the couch. Officer McIrvin had his chest against

ecedent's back (decedent in a kneeling position). Officer McIrvin placed his left arm around the decedent's neck in to place a carotid hold on him. Officer McIrvin attempted to apply pressure but noted his forearm was against the decedent's chin; therefore, he repositioned for a carotid hold and placed his right arm underneath the decedent's neck. With Officer McIrvin's right arm, he placed it against the decedent's left bicep area and grabbed the decedent's shirt to get a firm grip. Officer McIrvin then pushed the decedent's head forward against his forearm for approximately 10-15 seconds, when the decedent went unresponsive.

Officer McIrvin laid the decedent on his back and attempted to check for a pulse and was unable to locate one. During the altercation, officers were unable to put out a [PC 148 – Altercation with Officers] over the radio due to the struggle with the decedent escalating so quickly. On October 3, 2016 at 0011 hours, McIrvin put out via the radio, a request for medical aid use the decedent was not breathing and requested a supervisor to his location. Officer Burdick placed one set of

Officer Burdick began chest compressions and Officer McIrvin took over the compressions until Hall Ambulance Service personnel arrived and took over. On October 3, 2016 at 0015 hours, officers put out a call of "the decedent was still not breathing and did not have a pulse." He was then transported to the hospital.

No batons, hobbles, pepper spray, Tasers and or handguns were used during this incident.

According to Detective Davenport, paperwork was located in his bedroom of a restraining order on the decedent from an unknown female in Visalia, CA from December 2015 and January 2016. He also had a prior felony assault on a police officer.

I spoke to the decedent's daughter, Viveny Aceves, at the hospital. She indicated her dad did not have a primary care physician and would often go to any urgent care or hospital for treatment or refill of his medications. She said he was diagnosed with hypertension, diabetes mellitus and cardiac problems. She said he did not smoke cigarettes, he did not drink alcohol, he did not use illicit drugs and he did not have any mental health issues. She indicated her dad was not a violent man and they just wanted to know the truth of how and why he died. She said he was not married and had four adult children who were the legal next of kin. I explained their next steps for disposition and she understood.

I faxed a request for a history and physical and discharge summary for a recent visit the decedent had to Mercy Hospital.

According to family, he was seen at the end of September for complications of his heart disease.

After completing an investigation in conjunction with the Bakersfield Police Department, the death of Jose Cesar Vilorio was determined to be a homicide.

CIRCUMSTANCES: See investigator's report.

#### **EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:**

The body is received in a zippered body bag identified with a Kern County Coroner tag, C02174-16, Jose Vilorio, Investigator Mancera. The body is identified by toe tags and is that of an unembalmed, refrigerated adult Hispanic male who appears about the reported age of 63 years. The body weighs 286 pounds (with body bag and medical appliances), measures 70 inches, and is very well built and morbidly obese. Surgical scars are present on the right shoulder and lower abdomen. Tattoos are not present. Rigor mortis has been abolished. Livor mortis is fixed over the back and posterior legs.

The head is normocephalic and is covered by short brown/gray curly hair. Examination of the eyes reveals irides that appear to be brown in color. The oronasal passages are unobstructed. There is a moustache. Beard is absent (unshaven). The neck is unremarkable. There is no chest deformity. The abdomen is obese. The genitalia are those of an adult male. The external genitalia and anus are unremarkable. The extremities are unremarkable.

#### **EVIDENCE OF TRAUMATIC INJURY:**

#### Blunt force trauma:

Head: There are contusions around the right eye and right cheek. There is a contusion of the left upper eyelid. There is a mild contusion to the nose. There is a contusion to the inner upper lip. Internally, there is a diffuse subcutaneous and subgaleal hemorrhage in the right frontal, temporal and occipital scalp. There is no skull fracture. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage; see neuropathology report for brain findings.

Torso: There is diffuse ecchymosis at the left side of the chest. There are small contusions at the abdomen. There is a 7½ inch x 1/2 inch linear abrasion at the right back. Internally, there is soft tissue hemorrhage at the left side of the chest.

Arms: There are small abrasions on the back of the right forearm and around the right wrist. There are small abrasions on the back of the left forearm.

Legs: There is no injury to the legs.

#### Neck compression:

There is a history of "carotid hold." There are numerous petechiae in the left upper and lower conjunctivae. There are no external injuries to the neck. Internally, there is a  $2 \times 3 \times 2$  cm hemorrhage in the left sternohyoid muscle. There is a small soft tissue hemorrhage anterior to the thyroid gland. There is no fracture of hyoid bone or thyroid cartilage.

#### **EVIDENCE OF THERAPEUTIC INTERVENTION:**

There is an endotracheal and an orogastric tube which are fixed with tape around the face and neck. There is a Foley catheter in the bladder. There are multiple vascular catheters on the right side of the neck and both arms. Internally, there are multiple rib fractures, left 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, right 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> and sternal fracture at the level of the 2<sup>nd</sup> rib.



**CLOTHING:** 

No clothing accompanied the body.

INITIAL INCISION:

The body cavities are entered through the standard coronal incision and the standard Y-shaped incision.

NECK:

The neck organs are layer-wise dissected and removed en bloc with the tongue. No lesions are present. Both hyoid bone and larynx are intact and without fractures. The tongue when sectioned shows no trauma.

#### CHEST/ABDOMINAL CAVITY:

Both pleural cavities contain a small amount of brown fluid. The lungs are well expanded. Soft tissues of the thoracic and abdominal walls are well preserved. The subcutaneous fat of the abdominal wall measures 6 cm. The breasts show no abnormalities. The organs of the abdominal cavity have a normal arrangement. There are chronic adhesions involving the omentum.

#### SYSTEMIC AND ORGAN REVIEW

#### MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:

No abnormalities of the bony framework or muscles are present.

#### CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The aorta is fairly elastic and of even caliber throughout with vessels distributed normally from it. There is moderate atherosclerosis. There is no aneurysm.

Within the pericardial sac, there is a small amount of serous fluid. The heart weighs 780 grams. There is biventricular hypertrophy. The right ventricle measures 0.6 cm thicken and the left ventricle 2.0 cm thick. The chambers are normally developed and without mural thrombosis. The valves are unremarkable. The myocardium is unremarkable. There are no defects of the septum. The great vessels enter and leave in a normal fashion. The coronary ostia are widely patent. There is a normal pattern of coronary artery distribution. There is moderate coronary atherosclerosis. The blood within the heart and large blood vessels is partly clotted.

#### **RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:**

A small of secretions/exudates are present in the low bronchial and upper respiratory passages. The mucosa is unremarkable. The left lung weighs 750 grams and the right lung 1200 grams. The parenchyma is congested and edematous. The pulmonary vasculature is without thromboembolism.

#### **GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:**

The esophagus is intact throughout. The stomach is empty. The mucosa is unremarkable.



The small intestine and colon are unremarkable. The appendix is absent. The pancreas is unremarkable.

#### **HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM:**

The liver weighs 2350 grams and is red-brown. The capsule is intact and thin and the parenchyma firm. The cut surface is smooth. There is a normal lobular arrangement. The gallbladder contains about 20 cc of bile and no calculi. The periportal lymph nodes are not enlarged.

#### **URINARY SYSTEM:**

The left kidney weighs 240 grams and the right kidney 200 grams. The kidneys are normally situated and the capsules strip easily revealing a surface that is smooth. The corticomedullary demarcation is preserved. The pyramids are not remarkable. The urinary bladder is unremarkable. It contains no urine.

#### **GENITAL SYSTEM:**

The prostate is without enlargement or nodularity. Both testes are in the scrotum and are unremarkable without trauma.

#### **HEMOLYPHATIC SYSTEM:**

The spleen weighs 160 grams. The capsule is intact and thin. The parenchyma is firm. The bone marrow of the ribs is unremarkable.

#### **ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:**

The thyroid, adrenals and pituitary gland are all unremarkable. The parathyroid glands are not identified. The thymus is unremarkable.

#### SPECIAL SENSES:

The eyes are not dissected. The middle and inner ears are not dissected.

#### HEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

There is right subcutaneous and subgaleal hemorrhaging of the scalp as previously described. The external periosteum and dura mater are stripped showing no fractures of the calvarium or base of the skull. There are no tears of the dura mater. There is no epidural or subdural hemorrhage.

The brain weighs 1490 grams. It is fixed in formalin for a neuropathology consultation; see separate report.

#### SPINAL CORD:

The spinal cord is not dissected.

#### **HISTOLOGIC SECTIONS:**

Representative sections from various organs are preserved in 10% formalin. Sections heart, lungs, liver, kidney and brain are submitted for microscopic examination.



#### MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION:

Heart: Moderate coronary atherosclerosis. Enlarged hyperchromatic nuclei. Scattered myocardial fibrosis.

Lungs: Severe congestion with numerous red blood cells and macrophages in the alveolar spaces.

Liver: Severe fatty change.

Kidney: A few sclerotic glomeruli. Intimal thickening of small and medium-sized arteries. Autolytic changes of renal tubules.

#### TOXICOLOGY:

Blood, bile, and vitreous fluid have been collected. An expanded toxicology screen is requested on the hospital admission blood specimens.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY:

Photographs are taken prior to and during the course of the autopsy.

#### RADIOLOGY:

14 hospital x-rays are reviewed.

#### **DIAGRAMS USED:**

Diagram forms were used during the performance of the autopsy. The diagrams are not intended to be facsimiles.

#### **OPINION:**

On October 3, 2016, at 0001 hours, officers responded to a 911 call. Two officers arrived and confronted the decedent. A physical altercation started the when decedent attempted to grab a machete. During the incident, the decedent was struck 10-15 times in the face with a fist and struck several times to the torso with a knee. The officer placed a carotid hold with his arm for about 10-15 seconds when the decedent went unresponsive. At about 0011 hours, a radio request for medical aid was made because the decedent was not breathing. Resuscitation was initiated with chest compressions until ambulance personnel arrived. At 0015 hours, the decedent was transported to the hospital. No batons, hobbles, pepper spray, Taser or handgun were used during the incident. There was no video recording of the incident.

He was admitted the hospital at about 0058 hours and the intensive care unit 0600 hours. Head CT showed extensive cerebral edema with a small amount of subarachnoid hemorrhage with possible infratentorial herniation. A large right frontal scalp hematoma and right periorbital hematoma were seen. Bilateral acute lamina papyracea fractures were seen. Soft tissue swelling and contusion were seen at the left mandible. CT of the cervical vertebrae was unremarkable. He was in a comatose state during the entire hospital stay. On October 4, 2016, at 0001 hours, he was given the first brain pronouncement. At 1602 hours, he was given a second brain pronouncement. The admitting diagnosis was anoxic brain injury and subarachnoid hemorrhage.

Autopsy showed blunt force trauma to the head/face with orbital bony fractures. The neck showed focal soft tissue hemorrhages and the eye showed petechiae. These findings were consistent with the history of "carotid hold." Neuropathology exam showed hypoxic/ischemic encephalopathy and early sinus thrombosis as result of cardiopulmonary arrest and comatose state. Significant natural diseases included hypertensive and arteriosclerotic cardiovascular disease, diabetes, and obesity. Toxicology studies were unremarkable.

In consideration of the autopsy findings and circumstances surrounding his death, the manner of death is classified as homicide.

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



The abnormalities noted in the ICA and MCA sections are somewhat suspicious for an acute organizing process superimposed on severe chronic atherosclerosis. We also describe changes characteristic of sagittal sinus thrombosis. The overall changes are compatible with acute restriction of cerebral venous drainage and possible additional carotid artery compression with resulting hypoxic-ischemic encephalopathy. Clinical correlation is recommended.

CLINICAL HISTORY: Extracting from the provided materials, we note that on 10/2/16 a call was placed to 911 by the decedent's housemates, claiming that he may have stolen their money and cell phones, and was attempting to slash one of them with a machete. When law enforcement arrived a struggle ensued, wherein one of the officers placed the decedent in a 'carotid hold' for about 15 seconds, Daniel Arber, MD - Medical Director

subsequent to which he never regained consciousness. He was transferred to a hospital for emergent medical intervention and diagnosed with anoxic brain injury and subarachnoid hemorrhage. He was pronounced dead on 10/4/16 at 1602 hours.

MICROSCOPIC NEUROPATHOLOGY: (P. Samghabadi, M.D., H. Vogel, MD)

We performed microscopic examination of H and E stained sections as outlined below. Neurons with varying degrees of nuclear pyknosis, cytoplasmic eosinophilia and loss of nuclear detail and basophilia are noted throughout all the sections examined. Intraparenchymal vessels demonstrates marked thickening of vascular walls with perivascular hemosiderin deposition and variably appear abnormally rounded and pipe-like. Pronounced vascular congestion is noted with fresh hemorrhage into the perivascular and parenchymal spaces, best seen on sections of block A.

On the medulla section (J) arterial vessels available for evaluation show severe atheromatous changes with chronic inflammation and fibrointimal expansion. Focally we find acute inflammation within this intimal expansion, which in some areas appears associated with fibrin.

On the section of the left frontal lobe (A) we find similar changes in the tributaries of the middle cerebral artery, including fibrocalcific and fibroatheromatous pathology; a definite acute process is not noted here.

The serially sectioned left internal carotid artery (B) is also affected by severe atherosclerotic disease and on some slices gives the vague impression of an organizing process suggestive of acute thrombosis.

The superior sagittal sinus shows severe congestion with some intimation of organization consistent with acute thrombosis.

GROSS NEUROPATHOLOGY: (P. Samghabadi, M.D., H. Vogel, MD)

Received through the courtesy of Dr. Yulai Wang of the Kern County Sheriff-Coroner's office and labeled with the patient name Vilorio, Jose Cesar is formalin fixed brain and dura.

A large piece of dura of the cerebral convexities is submitted. Its surfaces demonstrate no definite hemorrhage. The super sagittal sinus appears thrombosed. The postfixation weight of the brain is 1410 grams. The leptomeninges over the convexities and the base of the brain show variable discoloration. The circle of Willis shows variable atherosclerosis most prominently affecting the left internal carotid artery (see photo). The gyri and sulci show some flattening and effacement, respectively. There is no focal atrophy. The cranial nerves are normal. The uncinate processes show no definite asymmetry (the left inferior temporal lobe is disrupted, see photo). The inferior brain stem shows possible necrosis but this may be secondary to brain removal (see photo). The cerebellum is unremarkable. The cerebellar tonsils are normal.

Sequential coronal sections of the cerebrum display variable grey-blue discoloration of the cortical ribbon and basal ganglia, with some foci of frank necrosis (see photos). Focal or diffuse lesions of the parasagittal white matter are not seen. The corpus callosum is without hemorrhage or other gross abnormality. The lateral ventricles are slit like.

Sequential transverse sections of the brain stem perpendicular to its long axis display variable blue-grey discoloration involving multiple white matter tracts including the pontocerebellar fibers and the corticospinal tracts (see photos) as well as what appear to be dusky, hemorrhagic vasculature. The medulla displays hemorrhagic inferior olives. Sagittal sections of the vermis and parasagittal sections of the cerebellum show no definite abnormality.

Representative sections are submitted as follows: A) left MCA with brain, B) left internal carotid, serially sectioned, C) right frontal, D) right anterior corpus callosum, E) left posterior corpus callosum, F) right hippocampus, G) right occipital, H) brain stem, sagittal section, I1) mid brain, I2) pons, J) medulla, K) right cerebellum, L) superior sagittal sinus.

### Re: Death of fose Cesar Vilorio

I have reviewed the materials submitted to me concerning the death of Jose Cosar Vilorio, a 63 year-old male (hereinafter referred to as "the subject"). The materials submitted included: -

The Kern County Sheriff investigation report

A report of the autopsy performed on the body of the subject by forensic pathologist, Yulai Wang M.D.

Autopsy photographs and a toxicology report

A neuropathology report

The subject's medical records, including records from the final admission and also from a prior visit to the Emergency Room in September 2016 for complaints of chest pain.

SUMMARY: On 10/2/2016 officers of Bakersfield Police Department were dispatched to a residence following a call from residents reporting that the subject had possibly stolen some personal belongings from them. Shortly after the Initial call, it was reported that the subject was attempting to slash one of the residents with a machete.

When the officers made contact with the subject he was sitting on a couch. He was co-operative at first but when the officers attempted to walk him away from the couch, he resisted and reportedly attempted to reach for the machete. A struggle ensued and the subject was punched a number of times. One of the officers then attempted to apply a lateral vascular neck restraint. The officer ensured that the restraint was applied in the proper manner but within seconds of the restraint being applied, the subject went unconscious and had no pulse. The officers called for medical aid and initiated resuscitative measures while awaiting the paramedic response.

The subject was eventually resuscitated in the Emergency Room but a subsequent CT scan of the head showed brain edema with subarachnoid hemorrhage as well as a fracture of part of the ethmoid bone. A later EEG showed no brain activity and a technetium flow study showed no cerebral perfusion. The subject was extubated and was pronounced dead at 1002 hours on 10/5/2016.

There was no use of pepper spray or of a Taser during the struggle.

Medical records from a visit by the subject to the Emergency Room visit in September 2016 list complaints of chest pain and a cardiac evaluation revealed an enlarged heart and accelerated hypertension. The subject also had a history of diabetes mellitus.

An autopsy was conducted at the Kern County Sheriff-Coroner office by Dr. Yulai Wang M.D.

The autopsy findings included -

Blunt force trauma: Contusions of torso, face and scalp

Evidence of neck compression: Focal soft tissue hemorrhage in the neck, ocular petechiae

Hypertensive and atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease with cardiomegaly (the heart weight was 780 grams) with moderate coronary atherosclerosis.

Morbid obesity (body weight: 286 pounds)

Microscopic examination was performed.

A neuropathology report listed diagnoses of cerebral edema with hypoxic encephalopathy and an early thrombosis of the sagittal sinus.

NOTE: The subarachnoid hemorrhage noted in the CT scan report was not seen at autopsy and was probably just vascular congestion of the cerebral blood vessels. A toxicology report (done on hospital blood) was negative.

The Cause of Death was listed as: Blunt Force Trauma with Neck Compression Contributing causes listed were: Hypertensive Arteriosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease, Diabetes and Obesity.

OPINION: In the opinion of the undersigned the cause of death would have been more appropriately given as: "Hypoxic encephalopathy following cardiac arrest during altercation with law enforcement with use of neck compression – due to Atherosclerotic – hypertensive cardiovascular disease.

The subject's morbid obesity was a contributing factor.

Although death occurred during restraint, it was essentially a natural death.

Although there was some soft tissue hemorrhage in the neck, this per se does not imply that the death was caused by neck compression. The report of petechiae in the eyes in this case is probably not correct as there was extensive bruising in and around the eyes from the officers punching the subject. There were no fractures of the hyoid bone or the cartilages of the larynx in the neck.

The fact that the subject had the cardiac arrest just after the neck restrain was applied is most likely (to a reasonable degree of medical certainty) simply due to the fact that he suffered a heart attack from the stress caused by his agitated state and the struggle itself. His heart was extremely enlarged and he also had coronary artery disease, putting him was at a continuous high risk of sudden death at any time, with or without this extra stress.



HISTORY AND HOSPITAL COURSE: This is a 63-year-old Hispanic male with history of obesity, hypertension, diabetes mellitus, diabetic neuropathy, and stroke, who was involved in an altercation with Bakersfield police while he was being arrested. Patient developed cardiac arrest. He was coded for about 2-1/2 hours. He was transferred to San Joaquin emergency department where a CT of the head revealed extensive brain edema with subarachnoid hemorrhage with possible infratentorial herniation. Hence, Dr. Young from neurology was consulted. Patient was also hypotensive on arrivial, and required double vasopressor therapy. An EEG was performed, which revealed no cortical activity. Yesterday afternoon, the patient underwent a technetium flow study of the brain. Findings were compatible with brain death. Patient was terminally extubated this morning and was pronunced dead at 10:02 am on 10/5/2016.

GENERAL: At this time revealed the patient is intubated. He is not breathing. He is comatose. Not on sedation.

VITAL SIGNS: When he first came in were already very low. He is running about 66/35. Even now the blood pressure is

HEAD, EYES, EARS, NOSE, MOUTH AND THROAT: Showed some swelling of the eyes, some swelling of the face. I

could not open the right eye for some reason. No intracranial or intraorbital bruits.

HEART: Was somewhat tachycardic. LUNGS: Breath sounds were poor.

ABDOMEN: Distended, but no organomegaly.

EXTREMITIES: No movement in the extremities. No edema.

NEUROLOGIC: Patient is deeply comatose. No response to verbal, no response to pain. He is not breathing. Cranial nerve examination is limited. No grimace on the face. Right eye is difficult to open. We tried to open it and it is impossible. The left eye was easily opened. Pupils are dilated about 5 mm, nonreactive. On the right eye briefly looked like there is a swollen conjunctiva. Motor examination, no movement. Sensory testing, coordination not possible. No reflexes. No Babinski.

The patient had a CT scan of the brain, which showed diffuse edema. A dense appearance of the tentorium and the basal cisterns. A small amount of subarachnoid hemorrhage. Small ventricles. A large right periorbital preseptal soft tissue contusion seen. No fractures. CT of the facial bones showed soft tissue swelling and contusion on the left mandibular body region. Deviated mid nasal septum towards the right, diffuse mucosal thickening. Tiny amount of soft tissues in the left maxillary sinus, ocular globes were described to be unremarkable. Mastoids are clear.

Impression was that there is extensive edema with subarachnoid hemorrhage. Possibility of infratentorial hemiation, large right frontal scalp hematoma and periorbital hematoma. Bilateral acute lamina papyracea fractures, a small amount of left facial contusion as well.

CLINICAL IMPRESSION: This patient is deeply comatose at this time. Examination indicates the possibility of cerebral cortical brain death. Patient has fixed dilated pupil on the left. I could not check the right side. He is not breathing, no gag reflex, no reflexes.

HISTORY OF PRESENT ILLNESS: Obtained from the records because there was no family member. Obtained also from the nursing personnel and from Dr. Soheill, the intensivist. Reviewed also the note by the emergency room doctor. He is a 63-year-old male who apparently was in an altercation which is unknown during arrest at home. He was described to be combative when the police handcuffed him, and then, he was taken to the ground. The emergency room doctor got the history from the EMS. They do not know exactly what happened. The patient apparently was intubated prior to arrival with the police officer from the scene. The police officer from the scene apparently was providing CPR when the patient stopped breathing. The hospital personnel described that he has about a few arrests here and he was basically in cardiac arrest during the transport. He has endotracheal tube in place. He was also cared for by the respiratory therapist ventilating the patient through the endotracheal tube with good transport of air. He was given also epinephrine at that time.

The emergency room doctor described also no adequate information. There was a note about the onset being triggered by emotional stress. The patient apparently arrived in asystole while he was receiving CPR. The degree at maximal was described to be severe.

The history and physical was also reviewed from Dr. Win Naing. Immediately after the patient arrived to the emergency room, he was reported to be in altercation at home with Bakersfield Police. CPR apparently started at 12:15 a.m. and 911 was called. The patient was intubated and received epinephrine and CPR was continued until he was brought to the emergency room. Emergency management and necessary procedures were given. The patient really never regained consciousness.

Patient had a CT scan of the head and a CT of the cervical spine, which were unremarkable.

The other doctors' notes were also reviewed and they are basically the same history. I was called at about 9:30 on 10/3/2016 this morning by Dr. Soheili to assist neurologically.

Mr. Vilori is a 63-year-old Hispanic male with a past medical history of diabetes who was in an altercation at home and was apparently combative towards the police. He apparently stopped breathing and CPR was initiated by the police officers. The patient had an unknown down time, according to the records. EMS was called and the patient was intubated in the field and intraosseous line was started. The patient received 5 rounds of epinephrine along with CPR enroute to the emergency department. When he arrived to the emergency department, ACLS was continued. Right internal jugular central line was placed. He has undergone multiple rounds of CPR for over 2 hours and has received a total of 7 emps of sodium bicarbonate, 15 amps of epinephrine, with short periods of return of spontaneous circulation. Currently he is on an epinephrine drip at 35 mags and dopamine at 5 mcg. There is no family at the bedside and all attempts to contact the family have been unsuccessful.



3. Hypotension

-We will continue the patient on aggressive IV fluid resuscitation. The patient is currently on a dopamine and epinephrine drip. He may require other vasopressor agents if his hypotension persists.

4. Lactic acidosis



# **Use of Force**

#### 300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy recognizes that the use of force by law enforcement requires constant evaluation. Even at its lowest level, the use of force is a serious responsibility. The purpose of this policy is to provide officers of this department with guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, each officer is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial and reasonable manner.

### 300.1.1 PHILOSOPHY

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concern both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Officers are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied human encounters and when warranted, may use force in carrying out their duties.

Officers must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, the limitations of their authority. This is especially true with respect to officers overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of their duties.

The Department recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. It is also understood that vesting officers with the authority to use reasonable force and protect the public welfare requires a careful balancing of all human interests.

### 300.2 POLICY

It is the policy of this department that officers shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary, given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event, to effectively bring an incident under control. "Reasonableness" of the force used must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any interpretation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second decisions in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving about the amount of force that is necessary in a particular situation.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter in the field, it is recognized that each officer must be entrusted with well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident. While it is the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter to minimize injury to everyone involved, nothing in this policy requires an officer to actually sustain physical injury before applying reasonable force.

#### 300.2.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

Any peace officer that has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape, or to overcome resistance. A peace officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance of the person being arrested; nor shall such officer be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her

right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest or to prevent escape or to overcome resistance (Penal Code § 835a).

### 300.2.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

When determining whether or not to apply any level of force and evaluating whether an officer has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration. These factors include, but are not limited to:

- (a) The conduct of the individual being confronted (as reasonably perceived by the officer at the time).
- (b) Officer/subject factors (age, size, relative strength, skill level, injury/exhaustion and number of officers vs. subjects).
- (c) Influence of drugs/alcohol (mental capacity).
- (d) Proximity of weapons.
- (e) The degree to which the subject has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained.
- (f) Time and circumstances permitting, the availability of other options (what resources are reasonably available to the officer under the circumstances).
- (g) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
- (h) Training and experience of the officer.
- (i) Potential for injury to citizens, officers and suspects.
- (i) Risk of escape.
- (k) Other exigent circumstances.

It is recognized that officers are expected to make split-second decisions and that the amount of an officer's time available to evaluate and respond to changing circumstances may impact his/her decision.

While various degrees of force exist, each officer is expected to use only that degree of force reasonable under the circumstances to successfully accomplish the legitimate law enforcement purpose in accordance with this policy.

It is recognized however, that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the standard tools, weapons or methods provided by the Department. Officers may find it more effective or practical to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be objectively reasonable and utilized only to the degree reasonably necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

### 300,2,3 NON-DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

Any application of force that is not reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of death or very serious injury shall be considered non-deadly force. Each officer is provided with equipment, training and skills to assist in the apprehension and control of suspects as well as protection of officers and the public. Non-deadly force applications may include but are not limited to leg restraints, control devices and TASER described in Policy Manual §§ 306, 308 and 309 respectively.

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### 300.2.4 PAIN COMPLIANCE TECHNIQUES

Pain compliance techniques may be very effective in controlling a passive or actively resisting individual. Officers may only apply those pain compliance techniques for which the officer has received departmentally approved training and only when the officer reasonably believes that the use of such a technique appears necessary to further a legitimate law enforcement purpose. Officers utilizing any pain compliance technique should consider the totality of the circumstance including, but not limited to:

- (a) The potential for injury to the officer(s) or others if the technique is not used
- (b) The potential risk of serious injury to the individual being controlled
- (c) The degree to which the pain compliance technique may be controlled in application according to the level of resistance
- (d) The nature of the offense involved
- (e) The level of resistance of the individual(s) involved
- (f) The need for prompt resolution of the situation
- (g) If time permits (e.g., passive demonstrators), other reasonable alternatives

The application of any pain compliance technique shall be discontinued once the officer determines that compliance has been achieved.

### 300.2.5 CAROTID RESTRAINT

The proper application of the carotid restraint hold by a trained officer may be effective in restraining a violent individual. Only officers who have successfully completed department-approved training on the use of the carotid restraint hold and the department Use of Force Policy are authorized to use the technique. After initial training, officers shall complete training annually on the use of the carotid restraint hold.

The carotid restraint hold may only be used when the officer reasonably believes that the application of the hold appears necessary to prevent serious injury or death to an officer or other person(s).

After any application of any carotid restraint hold, the officer shall ensure the following steps occur:

- (a) Any individual who has had the carotid restraint hold applied, regardless of whether he/she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel.
- (b) The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the carotid restraint hold and whether the subject lost consciousness as a result.
- (c) Any officer applying the carotid restraint shall promptly notify a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such hold.
- (d) The use or attempted use of the carotid restraint shall be thoroughly documented by the officer in the incident report.
- (e) The use or attempted use of the carotid restraint shall be thoroughly documented by the officer in the related incident reports.

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#### 300.3 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

While the use of a firearm is expressly considered deadly force, other force might also be considered deadly force if the officer reasonably anticipates and intends that the force applied will create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury. Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances:

- (a) An officer may use deadly force to protect himself/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes would be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.
- (b) An officer may use deadly force to stop a fleeing suspect when the officer has probable cause to believe that the suspect has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent or future potential risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the suspect is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

### 300.4 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of physical force by a member of this department, whether on or off-duty, shall be documented promptly, completely, and accurately in an appropriate report depending on the nature of the incident. The use of particular weapons such as chemical agents may require the completion of additional report forms as specified in departmental policy and/or law.

When an officer uses a level of force higher than that associated with standard searching and handcuffing techniques, the officer will notify an on-duty supervisor as soon as possible and ensure that the incident is documented in a report. Force includes, but is not limited to, the use of self defense techniques, impact weapons, and deadly force. If several officers are involved in an incident and physical force is used, the investigating officer will be informed of the amount and type of force used by each officer. This information will be included in the investigating officer's report. In addition, an on-duty supervisor will be informed of the force used by each officer. It is the responsibility of each officer using force to ensure that the approving supervisor is advised of the use of force before the officer leaves the scene.

### 300.4.1 NOTIFICATION TO SUPERVISORS

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of physical force, under any of the following circumstances:

- (a) The application of force appears to have caused physical injury
- (b) The individual has expressed a complaint of pain
- (c) Any application of a control device
- (d) The individual has been rendered unconscious

### 300.4.2 MEDICAL ATTENTION FOR INJURIES SUSTAINED USING FORCE

The following guidelines are to be used when providing medical evaluation for suspects following an arrest.

Suspects will be evaluated at Kern Medical Center or by Kern County Jail medical staff prior to booking or release whenever:

Officers use physical force to arrest the suspect, or

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#### Use of Force

- Officers use Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) to arrest the suspect and the suspect appears to be recovering normally, or
- The suspect is injured or complains of injury, regardless of when the injury was received

Suspects will be transported to Kern Medical Center for evaluation whenever:

- OC was used to arrest the suspect and the suspect is exhibiting signs of distress or is not recovering normally, or
- The suspect is taken into custody following a vehicle collision, or
- · An impact weapon was used to effect the arrest, or
- A Taser was used to effect the arrest, or
- The suspect was bitten by a police K-9, or
- A carotid restraint was applied but the suspect was not rendered unconscious and is alert and responsive

Suspects will be transported to Kern Medical Center via ambulance for evaluation whenever:

- The suspect was rendered unconscious at any time during the arrest, or
- The suspect is unconscious for any other reason, or
- Deadly force was used to effect the arrest, or
- The suspect exhibits extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond physical characteristics, unusually high tolerance to pain or requires a protracted physical encounter with multiple officers to bring under control. These suspects may be at an increased risk of sudden death and should be examined by qualified medical personnel as soon as practicable.

In addition to the information above, officers and supervisors shall use reasonable care in determining the need for emergency medical assistance for arrested persons.

In all cases when emergency medical aid is summoned, officers shall fully advise medical personnel, including ambulance personnel, of all force used and any injuries the suspect is believed to have received. The on-scene supervisor shall ensure the transporting officer is aware of all force used in making the arrest.

All injuries, treatment, or refusal of treatment, will be documented in the appropriate report. If any arrested individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practical, should be witnessed by another officer and/or medical personnel. If an audio recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included, if possible.

### 300.5 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITY

Whenever possible, a supervisor shall respond to all incidents in which there has been a reported application of force. The supervisor is expected to:

- (a) Obtain the basic facts from the involved officer(s)
- (b) Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated
- (c) Separately interview the subject(s) upon whom force was applied

- (d) Ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visible injury or complaint of pain as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas
- (e) Identify any witnesses not already included in related reports
- (f) Review and approve all related reports
- (g) Accomplish a supervisor's Use of Force Detail page through the Versadex reporting system

In the event that the supervisor believes that the incident may give rise to potential civil litigation, he/she shall notify the Watch Commander. The Watch Commander shall notify the Internal Affairs Lieutenant within a reasonable period of time given the circumstances.

Should the supervisor determine that any application of force was not within policy, a separate internal administrative investigation shall be initiated.

In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit.

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# **Handcuff Policy**

#### 354.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This procedure provides guidelines for handling situations involving handcuffing during detentions and arrests. This policy is also applicable to Flexcuffs, which will be considered synonymous with handcuffs for purposes of this policy.

#### 354.2 HANDCUFFING POLICY

Although recommended for most arrest situations, handcuffing is a discretionary procedure and not an absolute rule of the Department. When deciding whether to handcuff an arrestee, officers should carefully balance officer safety concerns with factors including, but not limited to the following:

- The circumstances leading to the arrest.
- The attitude and behavior of the arrested person.
- The age, sex and health of the person.
- Whether the person has a hearing or speaking disability. In such cases consideration should be given, safety permitting, to handcuffing to the front in order to allow the person to sign or write notes.
- Whether the person has any other apparent disability.

It is not the intent of the Department to dissuade officers from handcuffing all persons they believe warrant that degree of restraint, nor is it the intent of this policy to create the atmosphere that in order to avoid risk, an officer should handcuff all persons regardless of the circumstances. In most situations handcuffs should be applied with the hands behind the person.

#### 354.2.1 IMPROPER USE OF HANDCUFFS

Handcuffing is never done to punish, to display authority, or as a show of force. Persons are handcuffed only to restrain their hands to ensure officer safety. When practical, handcuffs shall be double locked to prevent tightening which may cause undue discomfort or injury to the hands or wrists.

#### 354.2.2 JUVENILES

Juveniles 14-years of age or older may be handcuffed when the act committed is of a felonious nature or when their acts have amounted to crimes where the officer has a reasonable suspicion the suspect may have a desire to escape, injure themselves, injure the officer, or destroy property.

Juveniles under 14-years of age generally will not be handcuffed unless their acts have amounted to a dangerous felony or when they are of a state of mind which suggests a reasonable probability of their desire to escape, injure themselves, the officer, or to destroy property.

### 354.2.3 HANDCUFFING OF DETAINEES

Situations may arise where it may be reasonable to handcuff an individual who may, after subsequent investigation, be released prior to arrest. Such a situation is considered a

detention, rather than an actual arrest. Unless arrested, the use of handcuffs on detainees should continue for only as long as is reasonably necessary to assure the safety of officers and others. Officers should continuously weigh the safety interests at hand against the intrusion upon the detainee when deciding to remove handcuffs from a detainee.

#### 354.2.4 HANDCUFFING OF PREGNANT ARRESTEES

No arrestee who is in labor shall be handcuffed or restrained by the wrists, ankles or both unless it is reasonably necessary for the safety of the arrestee, officers or others (<u>Penal Code</u> § 6030).
