Your FOIA requests are not subject to administrative appeal at this time, since no specific material has been denied in response to the request. Section (a)(6)(C) of the FOIA provides that a requester shall be deemed to have exhausted his administrative remedies if an agency fails to respond within the applicable time limit specified in the paragraph, which is twenty days (with certain exceptions). The requester, therefore, would not be required to appeal administratively before instituting suit in federal court. This provision does not, however, provide a basis for an administrative appeal of a request that is still being processed. Moreover, the lack of a substantive response to date is not the same as a response indicating that no documents were found.
