Highlights

Innovative School Partnerships- Telehealth Pilot

- OPSB staff is working with Children's Hospital to provide pediatric services for students with mild conditions (e.g., pink eye) through video conferencing technology.
- Telehealth services can help students miss less class time, as a result of not having to leave school to see their pediatrician.
- Einstein Schools, Success Prep, Arise Academy and Homer Plessy have agreed to participate in the pilot for 2019-20.
- Children's Hospital is coordinating with these schools to be available at back-to-school events to share more information with parents.

Highlights

Building Capacity- Creating Trauma-Informed Schools

- This summer, OPSB staff, alongside school-based and systems-level leaders from several CMO's, participated in an eight-day training of trainer's course on creating trauma-sensitive schools.
- These individuals are preparing to deliver this professional development to their school sites this summer and throughout the school year, and next year, train an additional cohort of leaders on this content.
- The Trauma Informed Schools Collaborative is leading this project and supporting schools throughout their implementation.

2019 OPSB Summer Training Collaborative

- The departments of Exceptional Children's Services and Student Support & Attendance have partnered to offer Orleans Parish Schools the 2019 Summer Training Collaborative.
- The targeted audience for this training includes: Social Workers, Special Education Staff, Counselors, Attendance Staff, Dean of Students/Culture, Disciplinarians, Principals/School Leaders, Asst. Principals.
- The two-day collaborative consists of training sessions and keynotes that encourage dialogue about the unique challenges that our students face and how schools can best offer support and coordination to help all students succeed.

Highlights

2019 Attendance Awareness Campaign

- In partnership with Baptist Community Ministries (BCM), OPSB will be expanding its Attendance Awareness Campaign launch for the 2019-20 SY.
- BCM awarded OPSB \$65,129 to support the campaign, which will focus on increasing awareness of three targeted groups: students and parents, schools and the community at large.
- The campaign will be visible via RTA bus ads and billboards throughout the city.
- We will be partaking in various community events (back to school events, partnering with NORDC, and community groups) to spread the word about the importance of daily school attendance.

Academic Performance

Overview of Performance

- At the K8 level, the percent of students achieving Mastery or above on English Language Arts decreased by 1% while Math and Social Studies has remained the same compared to last school year.
- In High School, the percent of students achieving Mastery or above on the LEAP 2025 exams in English, Algebra, Geometry, and US History varied by subject.
- Overall, the system also saw a decline in the number of students scoring Basic or above on LEAP assessments as well.
- This is the fourth year of stagnant or declining test results.
- Over the past several years, the city's schools have performed well on the state Progress Index measure. That measure assesses how well schools are helping each student grow towards mastery. Those results will be released by the Louisiana Department of Education later this summer.

LEAP 2025 3-8 Assessments – % Scoring Basic+ and Mastery+, by Subject and Overall in ELA and Math

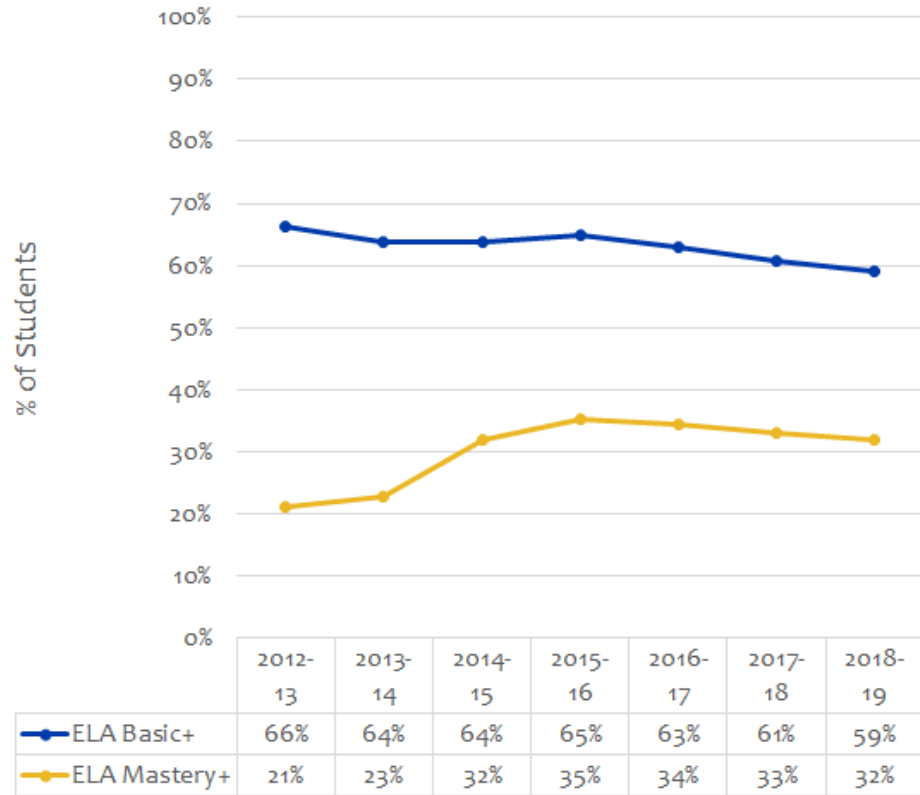

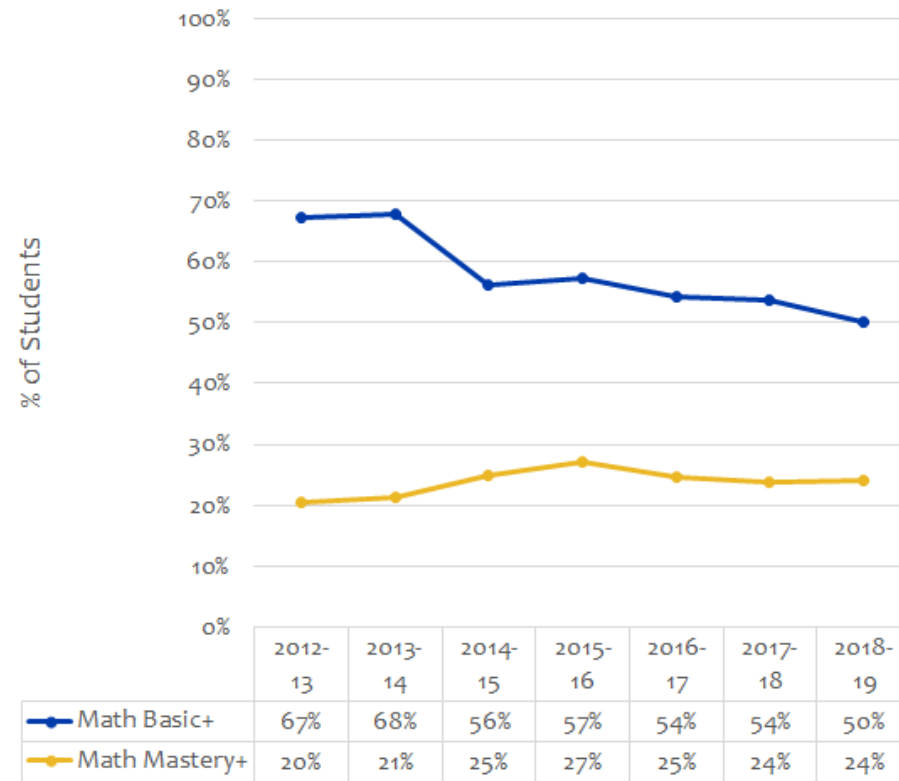

In an effort to communicate early to families and provide transparency in the renewal process the letter includes a general timeline of the process and a link to the Charter School Accountability Framework to better understand the renewal standards.
 - **Timeline:** This letter was translated in Spanish and Vietnamese and provided to schools to be sent home during the month of May 2019.
- 2020-2021 Renewal Cycle **(89% of Schools Have Completed)**
 - Renewal School Announcement from School Site
 - **Method:** Written Announcement from 20-21 Renewal School Site to their families
 - **Purpose:** This written announcement is to inform families attending schools that are up for renewal in 20-21 of the following:
 - The school will be up for renewal consideration in 2020-2021.
 - Define “renewal”
 - Current LDOE SPS Performance Score
 - Link to the Charter School Accountability Framework to better understand renewal standards
 - **Timeline:** This announcement was scheduled to be sent home during the month of May 2019.
