This is to acknowledge receipt of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request submitted on behalf of your client, Asian Americans Advancing Justice, dated and received in this Office on February 4, 2019, in which you requested specified records related to the implementation of the Department of Homeland Security's "Notice to Appear" guidance policy issued on June 28, 2018, numbered PM-602-0050.1.
