Dear Mr. Saeger:

On August 1, 2019, you filed a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request seeking the following:

A copy of any final document sent to a Senate committee and/or to the General Services Administration listing all Bureau of Land Management positions and/or titles that the Department of Interior is planning to relocate. To be clear, I only seek a copy of one document, and request only a copy of the whatever final document was produced closest to July 23, 2019, showing the details of the following transfers of positions and/or titles:

- Twenty-seven (27) positions relocating to Grand Junction, including the director, deputy director and their attendant staff.
- Two hundred twenty-two employees moving to BLM state offices.
- Eighty-five (85) employees relocating to Colorado; 54 positions will be divided between the state office and the National Operations Center in Lakewood and 4 additional positions go to the state office.
- Seventy-four (74) positions reallocated to state offices and rep01i to state directors.
- Sixty-one (61) employees remaining in Washington D.C. at the headquarters of the Department of Interior.

Your request was received in the Office of the Secretary FOIA office on August 1, 2019, and assigned control number **OS-2019-01134**. Please cite this number in any future communications with our office regarding your request.

We have classified you as a “commercial use” requester. As such, we may charge you for all search, review, and duplication costs for processing this request. See [43 C.F.R.](#)

**Fee Waiver:**

You have asked for a waiver of all FOIA processing fees. Please be advised that we are in the process of determining whether or not your entitlements are sufficient to enable us to process your request, or if we will need to issue a formal determination on your request for a fee waiver.

You have asked for copies of agency records. According to our regulations, you may choose the format of disclosure for such records. Unless you specify otherwise, the Office of the Secretary will provide copies of responsive records electronically via email or CD-ROM as scanned PDF images when the responsive records exceed 50 pages.

Because we will need to search for and collect requested records from field facilities or other establishments that are separate from the office processing the request, we are taking a 10-workday extension under [43 C.F.R. § 2.19](#). For the same reason, we are placing your request under the "Normal" processing track. See [43 C.F.R. § 2.15](#).
