Dear Mr. Eddington:

This is an initial response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of 15 May 2019 for "...any documents regarding the Uniting And Strengthening America By Fulfilling Rights And Ensuring Effective Discipline Over Monitoring (USA FREEDOM) Act Of 2015, P.L. 114-23 generated by NSA, including but not limited to any correspondence regarding 1) internal or external reports on the efficacy of programs carried out under P.L. 114-23, including any solicited or unsolicited feedback from technical personnel, intelligence analysts, or others involved in the collection, acquisition, analysis, or dissemination of information derived from any program carried out under the aforementioned authority; 2) any correspondence dealing with the termination or initiation of programs conducted under P.L. 114-23; and 3) the results of any internal or external audits, including classified audits, of programs conducted under P.L. 114-23." "The date range of this request is June 3, 2015 to the date of this request."

Your request has been assigned Case Number 106992. This letter indicates that we have begun to process your request. There will be no assessable fees for this request; therefore, we have not addressed your fee category or request for a waiver of fees.

Your request for expedited treatment has been denied because it does not meet the FOIA's criteria for expedited treatment.

A FOIA request may be expedited if the requester has made a statement certified by the requester to be true and correct to the best of his/her knowledge that a compelling need exists. Compelling need is defined as follows:

1. The failure to obtain the records on an expedited basis could reasonably be expected to pose an imminent threat to the life or physical safety of an individual.

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2. The information is urgently needed by an individual primarily engaged in disseminating information to inform the public about actual or alleged Federal Government activity. Urgent need means that the information has a particular value that will be lost if not disseminated quickly.

A request will also be handled expeditiously, upon receipt of a certified statement by the requester, if the substantial due process rights of the requester would be impaired by the failure to process the request immediately and the information sought is not otherwise available; there is a humanitarian need which will promote the welfare and interest of mankind; or other narrowly construed exceptional circumstances exist.

We have determined that your request does not meed the requirements stated above. We will process your request in our normal processing queue, and will provide a more substantive response to you as soon as we are able.

Since the denial of expedited treatment may be construed as a partial denial of your request, you are hereby advised of this Agency's appeal procedures. Any person denied access to information may file an appeal to the NSA FOIA/PA Appeal Authority. If you decide to appeal, you should do so in the manner outlined below. NSA will endeavor to respond within 20 working days of receiving your appeal, absent any unusual circumstances.

- It must be postmarked or delivered electronically no later than 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. Decisions not appealed within 90 days will not be addressed.

- Please describe with sufficient detail why you believe the denial of expedited treatment was unwarranted.
