The memo refers to approximately 1500 nursing homes that CMS calls "late adopters," described as "facilities that had not improved their antipsychotic medication utilization rates for long-stay nursing home residents since 2011Q4 and had high rates of usage."

> NPR is requesting a list of those facilities and their locations. We request you organize the records you release to distinguish the facilities that are in Group 1 and Group 2 as described in the above linked memo, as well as all other facilities CMS deems "late adopters."

The memo also states, "CMS is also looking for opportunities to engage with corporate chains that have significant numbers of nursing homes identified as late adopters."

NPR is requesting the names of those corporate chains.

In order to help you determine my status for the purpose of assessing fees, you should know that I am a representative of the news media affiliated with NPR and that this request is made as part of news gathering and not for commercial use.

I ask for a waiver of all fees for this request. Disclosure of the requested information to me is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations of the government related to the use of antipsychotic drugs in nursing homes, the CMS "National Partnership to Improve Dementia Care in Nursing Homes," and the impact on beneficiaries of the Medicare and/or Medicaid programs.
