This letter is to acknowledge the receipt of your perfected Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, originally submitted to the United States Secret Service (Secret Service) on September 20, 2019, for information pertaining to:

- 1. Email communications, agency memoranda, or other documents identifying threats of violence made or posed by any of the white supremacist groups or hate groups listed in the request, in connection with any event listed in the request/hosted by Donald J. Trump for President;
- 2. Email communications, agency memoranda, or other documents indicating that any member of any white supremacist group or hate group listed in the request has been barred from attending any event listed in the request/hosted by the Trump Campaign;
- 3. Email communications, agency memoranda, or other documents indicating that any member of any white supremacist group or hate group listed in the request has been vetted by the U.S. Secret Service for attendance at any event listed in the request/hosted by the Trump Campaign;
- 4. Email communications, agency memoranda, or other documents indicating or reflecting any advice or instructions given to Trump Campaign personnel concerning the incitement or encouragement of violence at Trump Campaign events;
- 5. Email communications, agency memoranda, or other documents indicating that the U.S. Secret Service (or any other agency of the federal government) has identified any white supremacist groups or hate groups listed in the request, generally or specifically, as posing an ongoing or future threat of violence, unrest, or unlawful activity at events listed in the request/hosted by the Trump Campaign;

- 6. Communications or other documents exchanged with state or local law enforcement agencies concerning explicit or implicit threats of violence made or posed by any white supremacist group or hate group listed in the request, in connection with any event listed in the request/hosted by the Trump Campaign; and
- 7. Email communications, agency memoranda, or other documents concerning the attendance of Enrique Tarrio, leader of a group called the Proud Boys, at President Trump's speech in Miami, Florida on February 18, 2019 (Date Range for Record Search: From 1/1/2016 To 8/16/2016).

In response to your FOIA request, the U.S. Secret Service FOIA Office has conducted a reasonable search for all potentially responsive documents. The U.S. Secret Service FOIA Office searched all program offices and computer systems that were likely to contain potentially responsive records. We are processing the responsive records identified in connection with that search.
