Methods and Reporting

- ▶ These are results from an automated phone survey to landline numbers from January 14th to 18th, 2020, conducted by Strategic Communications in 33 select Ontario Provincial Electoral Districts (list on next slide). The target quota was 300 in each riding.
 - Met quota in all but five ridings due to fewer listed landline phone numbers available in those ridings.
- ▶ The sample of 9,726 adult (18+) Ontario residents is statistically weighted to match the gender, age and region of each Provincial Electoral District as per most recent Census data.
- ▶ The overall margin of error for a sample of this size is +/-0.97%, 19 times out of 20.

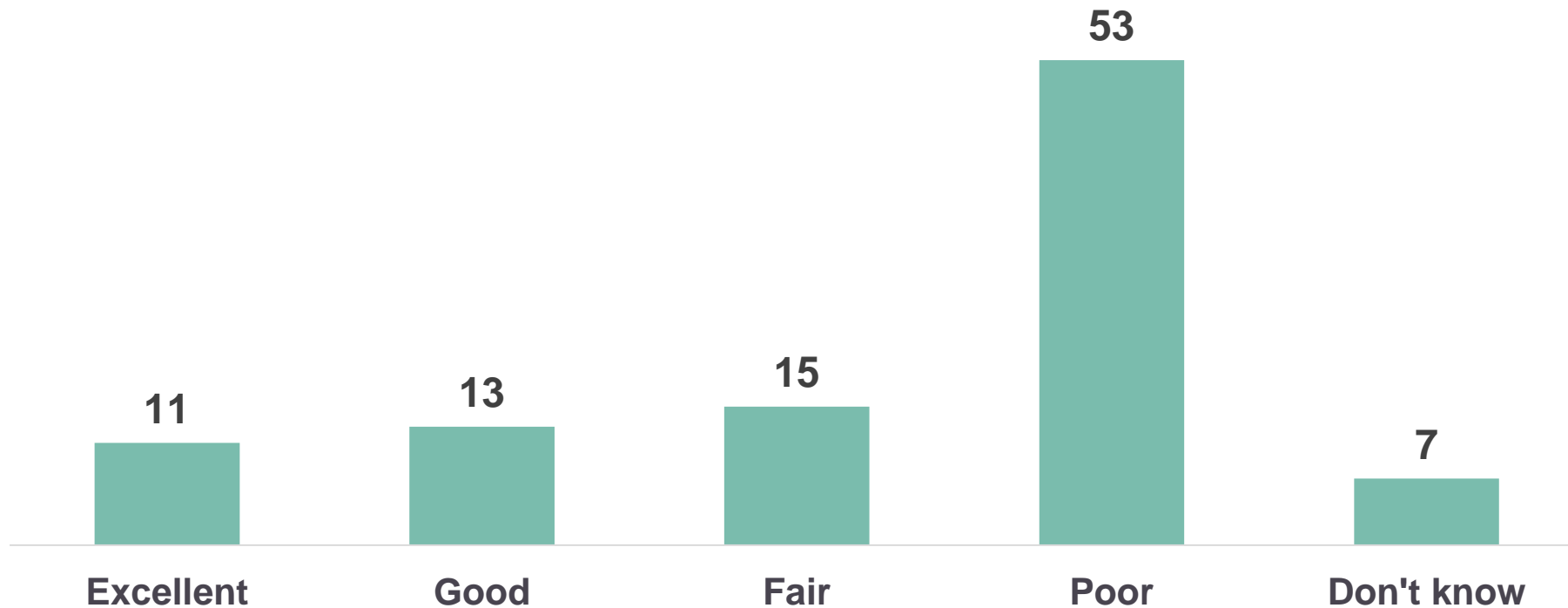

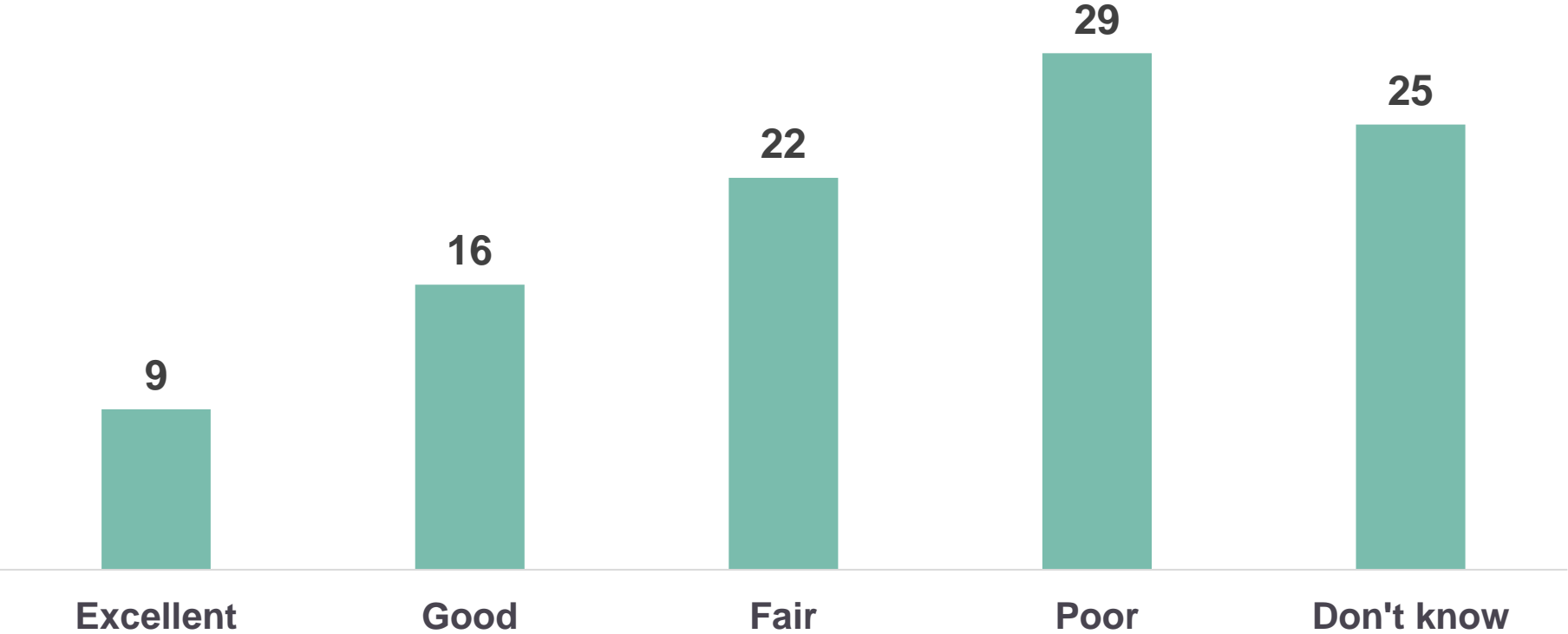
Thinking about the Doug Ford Progressive Conservative government, how would you rate the job they are doing?

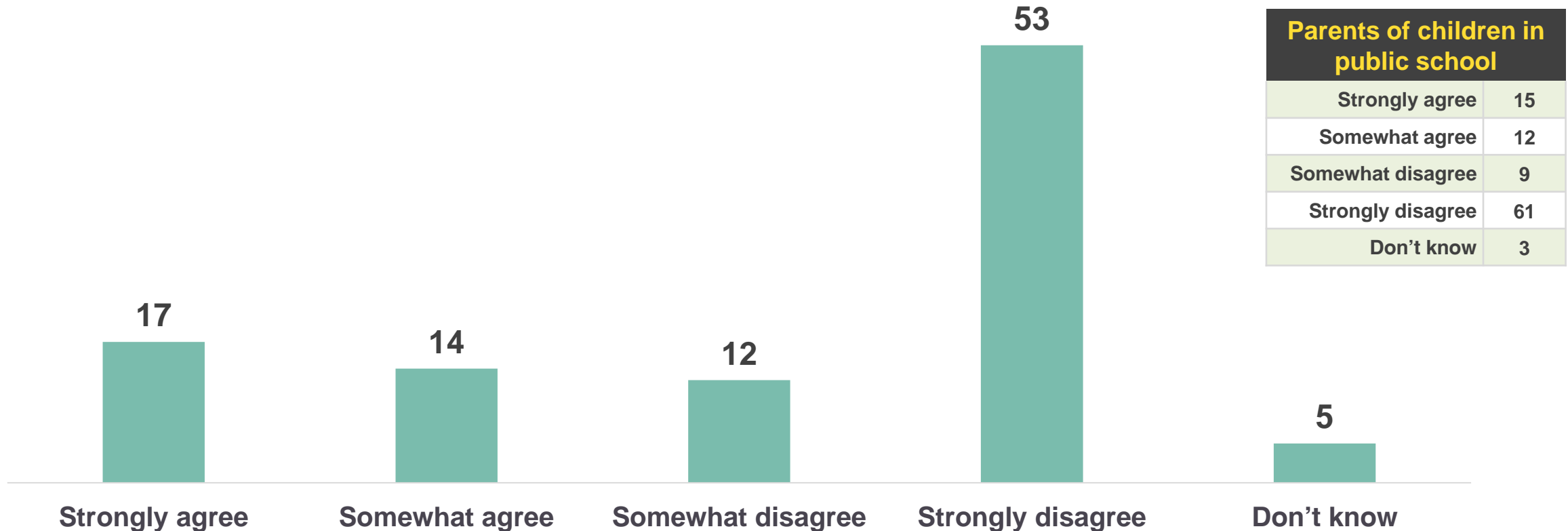
Thinking about your own local Member of Provincial Parliament, [insert name], how would you rate the job they are doing?

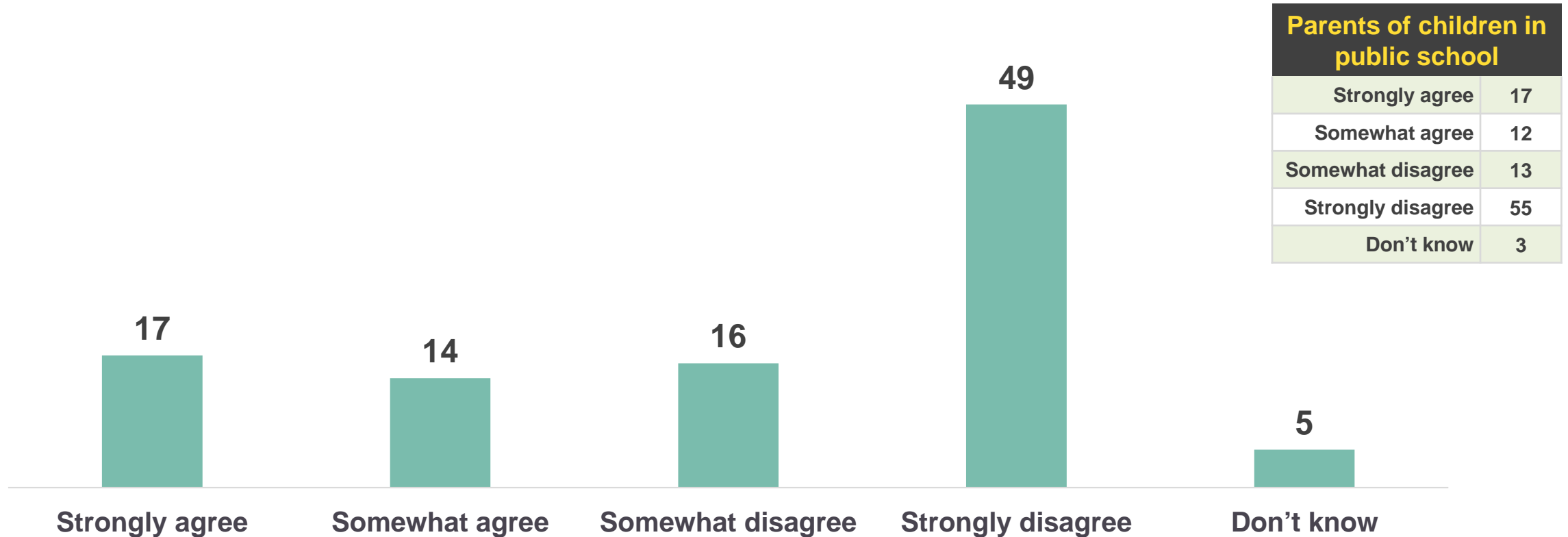

The Doug Ford government has proposed an increase to the average number of students in classrooms. Do you agree or disagree that classroom sizes should be increased?



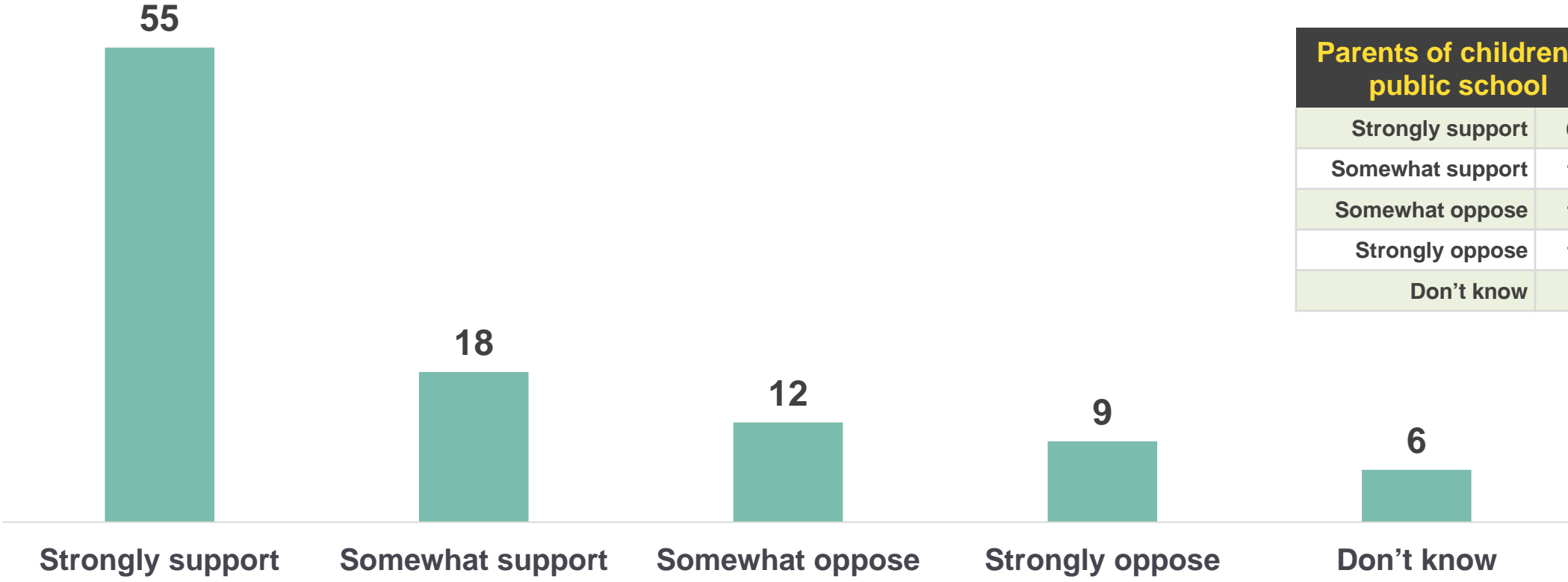

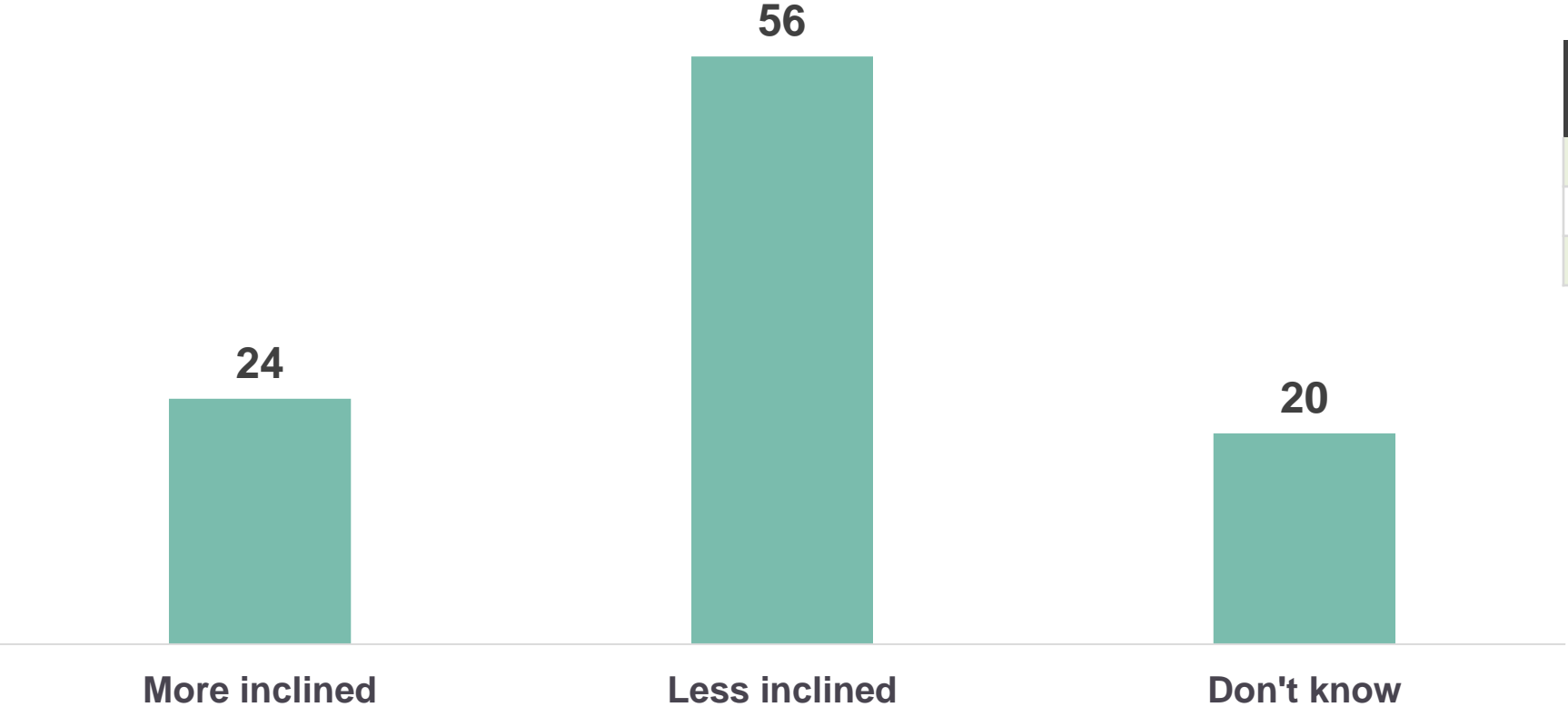
