Dear Ms. Chavis:

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)/Privacy Act request dated July 18, 2016, and received by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) on July 18, 2016, in which you requested records concerning a third party, David Anthony Runyon. Your request has been assigned number 2016-1152. Please refer to this number on any future correspondence.

At this time, the information you requested is related to ongoing litigation in federal court. Therefore, your request is denied pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(A) because it concerns an action currently pending before a court. Exemption (b)(7)(A) authorizes us to withhold investigatory records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings. Disclosing these documents could reasonably be expected to cause harm to these court proceedings; such as disrupting, impeding, delaying, or otherwise harming the enforcement proceedings.

For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(c). This response is limited to those records that are subject to the requirements of the FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all our requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.
