On October 21, 2019, the DFO asked American Oversight (AO) for supplemental email information associated with some of the individuals listed above in Column B in order to facilitate the agency's search efforts. On December 23, 2019, AO responded by providing additional email for specific persons listed in Column B. This first interim responds to AO's request as originally submitted (above).

This portion of your request has been processed under the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552.



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An initial search for responsive records was conducted by the DFO's telecommunications provider, the Client Experience Center (CEC). The CEC provides comprehensive, fee-for-service information technology (IT) associated operations, security, and technical support services to USDA end users. The CEC also implements and manages enterprise IT solutions for users Department-wide. The email accounts associated with the individuals listed under Column A were searched for ERS and NIFA relocation-related communications with individuals listed in Column B, from January 9, 2019 to November 21, 2019. The CEC search located seventy-two (72) pages of responsive records.

Following a review of the records, the DFO has determined that certain information contained therein should be withheld pursuant to U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6) (FOIA Exemption 6). Below is an explanation of the information that has been withheld.

FOIA Exemption 6

Exemption 6 generally is referred to as the "personal privacy" exemption. It provides that the disclosure requirements of FOIA do not apply to "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." Application of the exemption involves balancing the public's interest in disclosure against individuals' privacy interests.

The information withheld under Exemption 6 consists of an individual's personal information, mobile phone numbers, direct-dial phone numbers, email handles of third parties, and a passcode for a conference call. This information qualifies as "similar files" because it is information in which individuals have a privacy interest. Releasing individuals' private phone numbers and email addresses could subject them to unwarranted or unsolicited communications, or even harassment. Although the release of an individual's personal information would not likely result in unsolicited communications, this information is of a private nature and its release does not shed light on governmental operations. Regarding the conference call passcode, participants of a conference call have a privacy interest in ensuring that no uninvited person is listening in on their calls. The release of passcodes could undermine the privacy of those calls. Since there is a viable privacy interest that would be threatened by disclosure, Exemption 6 authorizes this office to withhold the information. Accordingly, the DFO has determined that the public interest in the information's release does not outweigh the overriding privacy interests in keeping it confidential.

The DFO is awaiting the CEC search results to the supplemental search initiated following AO's December 23, 2019 request modification. Due to the possibility of an additional release of records, your appeal rights for all records released in response to this request will be provided to you in the DFO's final response letter.

Secretary Perdue Announces Middle List For ERS and NIFA Relocation

(Washington, D.C., March 12, 2019) – U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue today announced the initial down-select list of 136 Expressions of Interest received from parties in 35 states vying to become the new homes of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Economic Research Service (ERS) and National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA). USDA is following a <u>rigorous site selection process</u> to identify the new locations with involvement from USDA, ERS, and NIFA leadership.

"The announcement of this middle list shows that we are committed to the important missions of these agencies and transparency in our selection process. USDA will make the best choice for our employees and customers," Perdue said. "Relocation will help ensure that USDA is the most effective, most efficient, and most customer-focused agency in the federal government, allowing us to be closer to our stakeholders and move our resources closer to our customers."

For this initial down-select, USDA applied a set of guiding principles against the Expressions of Interest locations including USDA travel requirements, labor force statistics, work hours most compatible with all USDA office schedules. Sixty-seven Expressions of Interest remain under consideration.



(Washington, D.C., May 3, 2019) – U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue today announced the finalists of <u>136 Expressions of Interest received from parties in 35 states</u> vying to become the new homes of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Economic Research Service (ERS) and National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA).

"This short list of locations took into consideration critical factors required to uphold the important missions of ERS and NIFA. We also considered factors important to our employees, such as quality of life," Secretary Perdue said. "Relocation will help ensure USDA is the most effective, most efficient, and most customer-focused agency in the federal government, allowing us to be closer to our stakeholders and move our resources closer to our customers. Our commitment to the public and our employees is to continue to be transparent as we proceed with our analysis."

Background:

As part of the <u>rigorous site selection process</u>, USDA narrowed the Expressions of Interest list using a set of established criteria defined by USDA, NIFA, and ERS leadership. The criteria included:

- Quality of Life: Subcategory examples include Diversity Index, Residential Housing Costs, Access to Healthcare, and Home and Community Safety Ranking.
- Costs (Capital and Operating): Subcategory examples include Commercial Real Estate Costs, CPI Index, and Wage Costs.
- Workforce: Subcategory examples include Labor Force Growth Rate, Unemployment Rate, and the Labor Force Population.
- Logistics / IT Infrastructure: Subcategory examples include Lodging Availability, Proximity to Customers, and Airport Accessibility.

The top Expressions of Interest were reviewed in detail, and USDA selected a short list of locations offering existing buildings with sufficient space to meet ERS and NIFA requirements. In alphabetical order, these are the top three Expressions of Interest under consideration:

Secretary Perdue Announces Kansas City Region as Location for ERS and NIFA Move puts ERS, NIFA closer to customers, expected to save nearly \$300 million nominally

(Washington, D.C., June 13, 2019) – U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue today announced the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will relocate the Economic Research Service (ERS) and National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) to the Kansas City Region.

"Following a rigorous site selection process, the Kansas City Region provides a win win – maximizing our mission function by putting taxpayer savings into programmatic outputs and providing affordability, easy commutes, and extraordinary living for our employees," said Secretary Perdue. "The Kansas City Region has proven itself to be hub for all things agriculture and is a booming city in America's heartland. There is already a significant presence of USDA and federal government employees in the region, including the Kansas City 'Ag Bank' Federal Reserve. This agriculture talent pool, in addition to multiple land-grant and research universities within driving distance, provides access to a stable labor force for the future. The Kansas City Region

USDA-19-1369-A-000037 000037 will allow ERS and NIFA to increase efficiencies and effectiveness and bring important resources and manpower closer to all of our customers."

USDA conducted a Cost Benefit Analysis and conservative estimates show a savings of nearly \$300 million nominally over a 15-year lease term on employment costs and rent or about \$20 million per year, which will allow more funding for research of critical needs like rural prosperity and agricultural competitiveness, and for programs and employees to be retained in the long run, even in the face of tightening budgets. On top of that, state and local governments offered generous relocation incentives packages totaling more than \$26 million. Finally, this relocation will give USDA the opportunity to attract a diverse staff with training and interest in agriculture. You may click <u>HERE</u> to view USDA's Cost Benefit Analysis.

"We did not undertake these relocations lightly, and we are doing it to enhance longterm sustainability and success of these agencies. The considerable taxpayer savings will allow us to be more efficient and improve our ability to retain more employees in the long run. We will be placing important USDA resources closer to many stakeholders, most of whom live and work far from Washington, D.C. In addition, we are increasing the probability of attracting highly-qualified staff with training and interests in agriculture, many of whom come from land-grant universities. We look forward to this new chapter as we seek to fulfill our motto at USDA, which is to 'do right and feed everyone,'" added Secretary Perdue.

Secretary Perdue sent <u>this letter</u> to all USDA employees this morning and will be holding an all hands meeting with ERS and NIFA employees today to discuss the decision, the process, and next steps.

In addition, USDA announced in August the realignment of ERS under the Office of the Chief Economist. While we believe there is considerable synergies and benefits to a realignment, after hearing feedback from stakeholders and Members of Congress, USDA will not move forward with the realignment plans. The agency of ERS will remain under the Research, Education, and Economics mission area.

Background:

USDA announced in August it would undertake the relocations for three main reasons:

1.To improve USDA's ability to attract and retain highly qualified staff with training and interests in agriculture, many of whom come from land-grant universities. USDA has experienced significant turnover in these positions, and it has been difficult to recruit employees to the Washington, D.C. area, particularly given the high cost of living and long commutes.

2. To place these important USDA resources closer to many of our stakeholders, most of whom live and work far from the Washington, D.C. area.

3. To benefit the American taxpayers. There will be significant savings on employment costs and rent, which will allow more employees to be retained in the long run, even in the face of tightening budgets.

As part of the <u>rigorous site selection process</u>, USDA narrowed the <u>136 Expressions of</u> <u>Interest</u> received using a set of established criteria defined by USDA, NIFA, and ERS leadership. The criteria included:

- Quality of Life: Subcategory examples include Diversity Index, Residential Housing Costs, Access to Healthcare, and Home and Community Safety Ranking.
- Costs (Capital and Operating): Subcategory examples include Commercial Real Estate Costs, CPI Index, and Wage Costs.
- Workforce: Subcategory examples include Labor Force Growth Rate, Unemployment Rate, and the Labor Force Population.
- Logistics / IT Infrastructure: Subcategory examples include Lodging Availability, Proximity to Customers, and Airport Accessibility.

The top Expressions of Interest were reviewed in detail, and USDA selected a <u>short list</u> of locations offering existing buildings with sufficient space to meet ERS and NIFA requirements.

While 90% of USDA employees are located outside of the D.C. area, ERS and NIFA are the only USDA agencies that don't have representation outside of the national Capital Region (NCR). Upon the relocation announcement, USDA proposed that sufficient staff levels would remain in the NCR to complete mission critical activities that require physical presence in or near Washington, D.C. at the recommendation of customers and stakeholders. In both the cases of ERS and NIFA, leadership reviewed the critical functions and staffing needs within and outside the NCR. Senior ERS and NIFA staff, with input from partner agencies and stakeholders, recommended to Secretary Perdue the critical functions to be retained within the NCR.

Out of NIFA's 315 positions, 294 will relocate while 21 will stay in the NCR. Of the 329 ERS positions, 253 will relocate while 76 will stay in the Washington, D.C. area.

As a result of this move, no ERS or NIFA employees will be involuntarily separated. Every employee who wants to continue working will have an opportunity to do so, although that will mean moving to a new location for most. Employees will be offered relocation assistance and will receive the same base pay as before, and the locality pay for the new location.

USDA will be working with the General Services Administration to secure a permanent lease space through a competitive process in the Kansas City Region. USDA will continue to keep ERS and NIFA employees apprised as updates occur.

Secretary Perdue Announces Lease for ERS and NIFA in Kansas City, MO

(Washington, D.C. – October 31, 2019) – U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue today announced the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) signed a lease for permanent office space at 805 Pennsylvania Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri to serve as the new home for USDA's Economic Research Service (ERS) and National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA).

"We're excited to announce ERS and NIFA's new, permanent home in downtown Kansas City, Missouri and provide clarity on commute times and work-life balance for our employees," said Secretary Perdue. "Both agencies have been hard at work in the Beacon Center after relocating to the region over a month ago, and signing this lease is an important next step to facilitate their long-term efficiency, effectiveness, and service to our customers. The region is not only a hub for agriculture in America's heartland, but is also already proving to be a diverse talent pool in proximity to many land-grant and research universities. I'm confident Kansas City will continue to be a great home for the future of ERS and NIFA."

Background:

90 percent of USDA employees are located outside of the D.C. area, and prior to their relocation, ERS and NIFA were the only USDA agencies that did not have representation outside of the National Capital Region (NCR). While headquarters for both agencies remain in the NCR, portions of ERS and NIFA relocated to the Kansas City region on September 30, 2019. Since that time, both agencies have been housed in space currently utilized by USDA and will remain in that space until the build-out of the permanent office is completed. There is already a significant presence of USDA and federal government employees in the region, including the Kansas City 'Ag Bank' Federal Reserve.

USDA worked with GSA to secure a permanent lease space through a competitive process in the Kansas City region. With this new lease in Kansas City, the federal government will realize significant savings which can be attributed to lower lease costs in the Kansas City region and to improved efficiencies resulting in a smaller physical footprint realized through the co-location of the two agencies. Additional savings were realized due to the commitments of local and state stakeholders, including the State of Missouri; the Missouri Partnership; the Port Authority of Kansas City, Missouri ("PortKC"); the City of Kansas City, Missouri; the Kansas City Area Development Council; the Economic Development Corporation of Kansas City; Kansas City Power and Light/Energy Company; and the University of Missouri.

In August 2018, USDA announced it would undertake the relocation of ERS and NIFA for three main reasons:

1. To improve USDA's ability to attract and retain highly qualified staff with training and interests in agriculture, many of whom come from land-grant universities. USDA has experienced significant turnover in these positions, and

it has been difficult to recruit employees to the Washington, D.C. area, particularly given the high cost of living and long commutes.

- 2. To place these important USDA resources closer to many of our stakeholders, most of whom live and work far from the Washington, D.C. area.
- 3. To benefit the American taxpayers. There will be significant savings on employment costs and rent, which will allow more employees to be retained in the long run, even in the face of tightening budgets.

On June 13, 2019, Secretary Perdue announced the Kansas City region as the selected location. As part of the rigorous site selection process, USDA narrowed the 136 Expressions of Interest received using a set of established criteria defined by USDA, ERS, and NIFA leadership. The criteria included assessments of quality of life, capital and operating costs, workforce, and logistics and IT infrastructure. Out of 329 total ERS positions, 76 positions remain in D.C. while 253 positions are in Kansas City. Out of 344 total NIFA positions, 21 positions remain in D.C. while 323 are in Kansas City.
