This is the final response from the Civil Division, Department of Justice to your Freedom of Information Act request for records pertaining to denaturalization. This Office received your request December 21, 2018.

On March 1, 2019, the Civil Division provided you with an interim response and released four documents responsive to your request in full.

The Civil Division continued our search and review of records responsive to your request. As a result of our search, the Civil Division located an additional 328 records responsive to your request, which are being withheld in full.

The Civil Division withheld this information in full because it is protected from disclosure under the FOIA pursuant to:

- 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5), which concerns certain inter- and intra-agency communications protected by the deliberative process privilege, the attorney work-product privilege and the attorney-client privilege; and
- 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6), which concerns material the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. 552(c). This response is limited to those records that are subject to the requirements of the FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all our requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist. - 2 -
