Important Password Update - Users and Interfacing Systems must reset their passwords as required every 90 days or the account will be disabled IAW GSA IT Security Policy, (CIO P 2100.1). Registered users will receive an email notification to remind them of this requirement. If your account has been disabled, contact the Federal Service Desk at 866-606-8220 (Monday - Friday 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. ET).

NOTE: If your account was re-enabled after contacting the FSD, you must reset your FSRS? View the password before midnight on the day of the call to prevent it from being disabled once again.

Important Threshold Update - Effective October 1, 2015, the Department of Defense (DOD), General Services Administration (GSA), and National Aeronautics Administration (NASA) are issuing FAR Case 2014-022 as a final rule amending the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) to implement the inflation adjustment of acquisition-related dollar thresholds.

About FSRS

The Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) was signed on September 26, 2006. The intent is to empower every American with the ability to hold the government accountable for each spending decision. The end result is to reduce wasteful spending in the government. The FFATA legislation requires information on federal awards (federal financial assistance and expenditures) be made available to the public via a single, searchable website, which is www.USASpending.gov.

The FFATA Subaward Reporting System (FSRS) is the reporting tool Federal prime awardees (i.e. prime contractors and prime grants recipients) use to capture and report subaward and executive compensation data regarding their first-tier subawards to meet the FSRS, contact:

REPORTING TIMELINE FOR PRIME CONTRACTORS

Prime Contractors awarded a Federal contract or order that is subject to Federal Acquisition Regulation clause 52.204-10 (Reporting Executive Compensation and First-Tier Subcontract Awards) are required to file a FFATA subaward report by the end of the month following the month in which the prime contractor awards any subcontract greater than \$30,000. This reporting requirement will be phased-in (see below):

- Phase 1: Reporting subcontracts under federally-awarded contracts and orders valued greater than or equal to \$20,000,000, reporting starts now.
- Phase 2: Reporting subcontracts under federally-awarded contracts and orders valued greater than or equal to \$550,000, reporting starts October 1, 2010.
- Phase 3: Reporting subcontracts under federally-awarded contracts and orders valued greater than or equal to \$25,000, reporting starts March 1, 2011.
- Phase 4: Reporting subcontracts under federally-awarded contracts and orders valued greater than or equal to \$30,000, reporting starts October 1, 2015.

Although the requirement to report subawards is being phased-in at certain dollar levels, if you would like to start reporting prior to the start date for your subcontracts, the system is available to you for reporting.

REPORTING TIMELINE FOR PRIME GRANT RECIPIENTS

Prime Grant Recipients awarded a new Federal grant greater than or equal to \$25,000 as of October 1, 2010 are subject to FFATA sub-award reporting requirements as outlined in the Office of Management and Budgets guidance issued August 27, 2010. The prime awardee is required to file a FFATA sub-award report by the end of the month following the month in which the prime recipient awards any sub-grant greater than or equal to \$25,000.
