THE COURT: Well -- sorry. If would like to do that, I'll have you step out into the hallway because I don't want to hear anything, in the event that you're going to elect an evidentiary hearing. So if you want to step out in the hallway and talk with him, I'm happy to do that.

THE COURT: Happy to do that. So, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Ramsey would like to talk with you about what you heard and saw, and that's fine to do. So if you would just be patient, we'll get to you as soon as we can. If you'll just step out in the hall.

MR. BENNETT: I was the victim in the crash.

THE COURT: Okay. Hold on one second. I don't want you to talk with me about it, because if Mr. Ramsey elects an evidentiary hearing, I want to make sure I hear all of that in the context of an evidentiary hearing.

THE COURT: Okay. But thank you for sharing that.

MR. RAMSEY: And when the officer and I spoke, we didn't think there were any witnesses here, so that's -- okay.

THE COURT: Yeah. So Mr. Bennett is here, and we'll just ask you to be patient, and he'll be out in hallway in just a moment. And the technician will stand with you as well. Is that right? Very good. Thank you.

THE COURT: Okay. Now, Mr. Ramsey's entered a plea of no contest, meaning they're not admitting, they're not denying, but he is asking for a withhold of adjudication. Do you have any objection to that? And if you want to talk with me, you can.

THE COURT: Okay. Are you sure?

MR. BENNETT: Yeah.

THE COURT: Okay. All right. So now I'm taking a look at the citation. And -- the ticket and the driving record. I'm not seeing a figure for property damage.

MR. TEJADA: No, ma'am.

THE COURT: There was no -- okay. So Mr. Mandel has some driving history, and he is 19. Not quite 19 yet, he's 18.

MR. RAMSEY: Has he been to a school, Your Honor?
THE COURT: No.

All right. Four-hour driving school, \$50 added to the fine, given the age and the driving history. I'm also going to add two roadside memorials. So what that is -- I reserve that in very special cases, and given your client's age and the driving history, I think it's appropriate. Only two, usually I'm up at five.

Roadside memorial are the circular things on the side of the roadway where somebody has been killed because of a car incident. And so what I ask the folks to do is to go there, take a picture and then they write me a letter and they tell me what they think and feel and how they're going to avoid speeding or crashes in the future.

It's helpful with young drivers. I read them all,

and I write them a letter back. It's very interesting the responses I get, so I'm eager to hear what Mr. Mandel has to say. Doesn't have to be long, but it's got to be meaningful. 4 Okay? 5 MR. RAMSEY: I understand. 6 THE COURT: Four-hour driving school, \$50 added to 7 the fine, and two roadside memorials. I'll give 90 days to do all of that. 9 MR. RAMSEY: Okay. Thank you, Judge. 10 THE COURT: Okay. Anything further? All right. 11 Thank you both for being here. Thank you, Mr. Bennett.
