Dear DOJ FOIA Service Center,

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552).

- I, Michael Gottlieb, request a copy of the following records, files, reports, products, or other documents be provided to me pertaining to the improvised explosive device attack which occurred on October 4, 2006 (the "Attack") in the Adhamiyah District in Baghdad, Iraq in which the below listed civilian contractor was killed in action. Please search the Department of Justice records for the below listed information in response to the request:
  - a. Any documents, materials, memoranda, or reports produced in conjunction with any investigation or review of the Attack (including any attachments or underlying evidence related to such documents), as well as any report in the agency's possession from another entity such as the FBI, Department of the Army, or U.S. Central Command.
  - b. Any cables, wires, messages, or internal or external communications related to the death of the civilian contractor described below, including any conclusion, recommendation, or opinion as to who carried out the Attack and any State or other actor who was in some way connected to or responsible for the Attack.
  - c. Explosive Ordinance Disposal (EOD)/Combined Explosives Exploitation Cell (CEXC) investigations and generated reports (storyboards).
  - d. Inventory of all items collected and received by EOD.
  - e. Copies of CEXC database entries and bar codes of items entered into CEXC investigation database.
  - f. All photographs of the IED components collected at the IED attack site and subsequently entered into the CEXC database and used in EOD/CEXC reports.
  - g. Any latent fingerprints lifted from IED components and associated actor(s) they belonged to (include nation of origin).
  - h. EOD/CEXC "quick snapshot" reports that were shared for intelligence purposes prior to the publishing of the final CEXC report.
  - i. All Level I TEDAC lab data or reports.
  - j. All Level II TEDAC lab data or reports.
  - k. All Level III TEDAC lab data or reports.
  - l. Results of digital forensic examinations of IED components associated with this IED attack.

- m. Device and electronic characterizations associated with this IED attack identical or similar to known Iranian characterizations at the time of this IED attack.
- n. Device associations (comparative analysis) of this IED attack with known Iranian IED components (e.g. Switch, Initiator, Main Charge, Power Source, Container, and any Enhancements).
- o. Results of any technical exploitation requests for information associated with this IED attack.
- p. All records of repository or archive database(s) of the C-IED Collaboration Center.
- q. All records related to this IED attack that have been associated with or correlated against IED components collected through the International Collection and Engagement Program (ICEP).
- r. Data from this IED attack that was previously used as evidence in legal cases (in Iraq or in the U.S.) for prosecution purposes.
- s. All related casualty reports and investigation reports stemming from this Attack, including but not limited to the AR 15-6 Investigation Report and Casualty Report.
- t. All related autopsy reports stemming from this Attack.
- u. All related Task Force Troy Reports
- v. All related Significant Activity ("SIGACT") reports
- w. All related Iraq Threat Finance Cell ("ITFC") reports
