Re: Freedom of Information Act Appeal; FOIA Request, 2019-HQFO-00679

To Whom It May Concern:

We represent Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd. and Huawei Device USA Inc. (collectively, "Huawei"). This is an appeal from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's ("DHS") failure to respond in a timely manner to our Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") Request (2019-HQFO-00679) originally filed on Huawei's behalf on May 1, 2019. A copy of our original FOIA Request is attached hereto as Exhibit A. In response to concerns expressed by DHS that the requests were overly broad, we submitted proposed search terms to help DHS prioritize the production of high-priority documents (Exhibit B). In spite of this, DHS has not provided an adequate response to our FOIA Request within the 20 business days required under FOIA, or at all. This appeal is filed pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6) and 6 C.F.R. § 5.8 to redress that failure.

The FOIA Request pertains to a matter of significant public interest. The indictment issued in *United States v. Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd., et al.*, 18-CR-457 (S-2) (AMD) (the "EDNY Indictment"), the arrest of Meng Wanzhou, and 5G technology and related competition have been the subjects of widespread and exceptional media interest. Further, the information sought by the FOIA Request involves questions about the government's integrity that affect public confidence, as well as matters of general public and economic interest.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On May 1, 2019, Huawei submitted the FOIA Request to DHS. *See* Exhibit A. During a telephone conversation on May 7, 2019, the assigned DHS FOIA officer, who said he could not give his name, requested a list of custodians, terms, and date ranges in order to help locate records responsive to Huawei's request. On June 6, 2019, in response to that request, we provided search terms, custodians, and date ranges to DHS. *See* Exhibit B.

We subsequently followed up with DHS about our FOIA Request four times between June 20, 2019 and September 6, 2019, with no response whatsoever from the agency. *See* Exhibits C, D, E, F.

DHS finally responded on September 11, 2019 via email, writing, "records have been found and will be reviewed for responsiveness to your FOIA request. In terms of completion, we can only provide estimates. At this time, the completion of your request can take anywhere from 3-6 months." *See* Exhibit G.

On October 17, 2019, we contacted DHS, noting that it had been nearly six months since we submitted our FOIA Request, and requesting an update regarding the timeline for DHS's already-overdue production. *See* Exhibit H. On November 1, 2019, DHS responded, "[p]lease know that we tried to provide you with our best estimate based on our current resources and the expected volume and complexity of the work needed to respond to the requests in our processing queue. At this time, we hope to be able to complete work on your request and send you a response before the end of this calendar year (December 2019)." *See* Exhibit I.

To date, we have not received any further updates from DHS, nor have we received any substantive response to our FOIA Request.

BASIS OF APPEAL

Under 5 U.S.C. § 552, an agency must make a determination within 20 business days of receiving the FOIA request, or 30 business days in the case of "unusual circumstances." To make a determination, an agency must at least: (i) gather and review documents; (ii) determine and communicate the scope of the documents it intends to produce and withhold and the reasons for withholding any documents; and (iii) inform the requester that it can appeal whatever portion of the determination is adverse. *Citizens for Responsibility & Ethics in Washington v. Fed. Election Comm'n*, 711 F.3d 180, 189 (D.C. Cir. 2013). No such determination has been made with respect to our FOIA Request—even though it has been 11 months since it was submitted. Where, as here, an agency fails to make a timely determination in response to a FOIA request, the requesting party may file an administrative appeal.

Given the lapse of time, we ask that DHS be directed to fulfill the FOIA Request forthwith.
